INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

U.S. SECURITIES
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

RENAISSANCE CAPITAL PARTNERS II

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 24 to request a hearing on an application filed by Renaissance Capital Partners II, Ltd. (Partnership), Renaissance Capital Group, Inc. (Managing General Partner), and Ernest C. Hill and Don M. Patterson (Independent General Partners) for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act making three determinations. First, the Independent General Partners are not "interested persons" of the Partnership or of the Managing General Partner within the meaning of Section 2(a)(19) of the Act solely by reason of being general partners of the Partnership. Second, the Independent General Partners are not "interested persons" of the Partnership solely by virtue of their service as independent general partners of Renaissance Capital Partners, L.P. Third, limited partners who own less than 5% of the Partnership units will not be "affiliated persons" of the Partnership or of other limited or general partners within the meaning of Section 2(a)(3)(D) of the Act solely by reason of their being limited partners of the Partnership. SCOTTISH WIDOWS INTERNATIONAL FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 27 to request a hearing on an application filed by Scottish Widows International Fund, et al. for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act. The order would exempt applicants from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c), and 22(d) of the Act and Rule 22c-1 thereunder, permitting applicants to assess a contingent deferred sales load on certain redemptions of shares. (Rel. IC-18176 - May 31)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GEORGIA POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 24 to request a hearing on a proposal by Georgia Power Company (Georgia Power), an electric public-utility subsidiary company of The Southern Company, a registered holding company. Georgia Power proposes to sell in yearly stages through June 1, 1995 to Florida Power & Light Company, a public-utility subsidiary company of FPL Group, Inc., an exempt holding company, and to Jacksonville Electric Authority, an independent agency of Jacksonville, Florida, all of Georgia Power's 100 percent undivided ownership interest

in Plant Robert W. Scherer (Plant Scherer) Unit No. 4, a coal-fired generating unit in Monroe County, Georgia and corresponding ownership interests in certain comm facilities related to Plant Scherer for a total purchase price of approximately \$8 million. (Rel. 35-25324)

SOUTHWESTERN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 24 to request a hearing on a proposal by Southwestern Electric Power Company (Southwestern), an electric public-utility subsidiary company of Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company. Southwestern proposes to incur obligations in connection with the proposed issuance of Pollution Control Revenue Refunding Bonds, 1991 Series B, through June 30, 1992 by Titus County Fresh Water Supply District No. 1 up to an aggregate principal amount of \$12.29 million. (Rel. 35-25324)

SOUTHWESTERN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 24 to request a hearing on a proposal by Southwestern Electric Power Company (Swepeco), an electric public-utility subsidiary company of Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company. Swepeco proposes to incur obligations in connection with the proposed issuance in 1992 of Pollution Control Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 1992, by the Parish of DeSoto, Louisiana up to an aggregate principal amount of \$53.5 million. (Rel. 35-25324)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PARTIAL ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has granted partial accelerated approval of a proposed rule change filed under Rule 19b-4 by the National Association of Securities Dealers (SR-NASD-91-21) that would extend the OTC Bulletin Board pilot period through November 30, 1991. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 3. (Rel. 34-29240)

AMENDMENTS TO PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The American Stock Exchange has filed a third amendment to a proposed rule change (SR-AMEX-90-28) under Rule 19b-4. The amendment concerns AMEX's proposed rules governing the trading of Equity Index Participations. Specifically, the amendment would codify modifications to the rules providing that an EIP holder exercising the cash-out privilege on any trading day would receive a dividend payment representing the accrued dividend equivalent from writers of the assigned short positions. Publication of the notice is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 3. (Rel. 34-29241)

The Chicago Board Options Exchange has filed an amendment to a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-88-24) under Rule 19b-4. The original CBOE proposal would establish the CBOE's authority to review significant business transactions of clearing firms which could increase market maker clearing concentration and to impose financial or operational requirements if warranted. The current amendment would limit the CBOE's ability to disapprove or condition transactions subject to the rule. Publication of the notice is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 3. (Rel. 34-29246)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-91-10) filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers under Rule 19b-4. The proposed rule change calls for several amendments to the NASD's Reporting Structure Plan. Publication of the order is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 3. (Rel. 34-29245)

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

A proposed rule change has been filed under Rule 19b-4 by the Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-PHLX-91-21) governing the procedures for notification and responsibility for any missed orders on the PHLX's equity and foreign currency options floors. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 3. (Rel. 34-29247)

The Philadelphia Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-PHLX-91-25) under Rule 19b-4 to amend its existing rules and to adopt a new "800 series" of rules to extend the PHLX's trading hours beyond the close of the 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. trading session. The proposal would establish an Off-Hours Trading facility consisting of "Crossing Session I," which would permit the execution of single-stock, single-sided closing-price orders and crosses of single-stock, closing-price buy and sell orders. It would also establish "Crossing Session II," which would allow the execution of aggregate-price orders for groups of 15 or more NYSE-listed stocks having an aggregate value in excess of \$1 million. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 3. (Rel. 34-29257)

Two proposed rule changes have been filed by the New York Stock Exchange under Rule 19b-4: SR-NYSE-91-15 to list and trade index warrants based on the Standard & Poor's 500 Composite Stock Price Index (Rel. 34-29249); and SR-NYSE-91-11 to amend Rule 319 (Fidelity Bonds) to maintain the current coverage requirements and basis for their computation while providing an alternative method of establishing the required basic minimum coverage (Rel. 34-29259). Publication of the proposals is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 3.

Proposed rule changes have been filed by the following under Rule 19b-4: Pacific Stock Exchange (SR-PSE-91-10) to require market makers, floor brokers, specialists or member organizations who enter into financial arrangements with any other member to disclose to the Exchange the terms of such arrangements (Rel. 34-29248); Government Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-GSCC-91-02) to extend GSCC's authority to render advanced billing to its members (Rel. 34-29250); and American Stock Exchange (SR-AMEX-91-11) to list and trade index warrants based on the FT-SE Eurotrack 100 Index, a broad-based stock market index based on 100 stocks from 11 European countries that does not include stocks from the United Kingdom (Rel. 34-29251). Publication of the proposals is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 3.

The Chicago Board Options Exchange has filed a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-91-19) under Rule 19b-4 to limit the CBOE's liability for losses resulting from a CB member's use of the Exchange's Order Routing System, Electronic Book or Retar Automatic Execution System. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 3. (Rel. 34-29258)
