TRADING SUSPENSIONS

HEARTLAND FINANCIAL, INC. SECURITIES SUSPENDED

The Commission announced the single ten-day suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of Heartland Financial, Inc., for the period beginning at 9:30 a.m. (EST) on March 9, 1990, and terminating at 11:59 p.m. (EST) on March 18, 1990. The Commission temporarily suspended trading in the securities of Heartland Financial, Inc., in view of questions that have been raised concerning the adequacy and accuracy of publicly disseminated information concerning, among other things, the company's financial condition and the current claim to exemption from the registration provisions of the Securities Act made by Heartland Financial, Inc., and pursuant to which its securities are trading. Specifically, substantial questions have been raised regarding the participation of Heartland Financial, Inc., in a distribution of its securities in violation of the registration provisions of the Securities Act and the possibility that the assets of the company may be substantially overstated. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

JOSEPH V. OLIVEIRA, JR. PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Boston Regional Office announced that on February 27 Judge Rya W. Zobel, U.S. District Court for the District of Massachusetts, entered a Final Order of Permanent Injunction and Disgorgement against Joseph V. Oliveira, Jr. (Oliveira). The complaint alleged that Oliveira misappropriated client funds and violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act, the Securities Exchange Act and the Investment Advisers Act in connection with the operation of an investment advisory business. Oliveira consented to the entry of the Order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint.

The Order enjoins Oliveira from violating the antifraud provisions and requires Oliveira and requires Oliveira to disgorge \$43,000. The payment of disgorgement in excess of \$25,000 is waived by the Order based on Oliveira's inability to pay. If Oliveira's financial condition changes materially so as to enable him to pay the amount of disgorgement waived, the Commission may petition the Court for a hearing to consider Oliveira's ability to pay. Oliveira has agreed to submit his tax returns to the Commission staff for a period of five years. [SEC v. Joseph V. Oliveira, Jr., USDC, Mass. 89-2154-Z] (LR-12403)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

KELLER AND GREENBERG PLEAD GUILTY TO CRIMINAL CONTEMPT

The Chicago Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney's Office announced that in February 1990 William Keller and Christopher Greenberg pled guilty to criminal contempt of the Court's previously issued Temporary Restraining Order and Order of Permanent Injunction. The criminal contempt Application against Keller and Greenberg was filed on November 3, 1989 in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois.

The Application alleged that from on or about May to August 1989 Keller and Greenberg offered and sold the unregistered securities of Global Fax, Limited in violation of the federal securities laws and the Court's previously issued orders. The Application further alleged that the Defendants made material misrepresentations to investors concerning the nature of Global Fax's business, returns, risks, and use of the proceeds. Keller and Greenberg will be sentenced on April 19, 1990. (See Releases LR-12052, LR-12164, and LR-12294) [U.S., ex rel., SEC v. William H. Keller and Christopher B. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CHARTER NATIONAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CENTRAL POWER AND LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Central Power and Light Company (CP&L), subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, to finance the acquisition of certain pollution control facilities, on or before March 16, 1990, in the aggregate principal amount of \$50 million. CP&L proposes to issue up to \$50 million of its

first mortgage bonds (Bonds) to evidence its borrowing from the Matagorda County Navigation District Number One. Such Bonds may be issued pursuant to deviations from the Commission's "Statement of Policy Regarding First Mortgage Bonds Subject to the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935." (Rel. 35-25050)

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

An order has been issued authorizing New England Electric System (NEES) to issue and sell, through May 1, 1995, an aggregate of up to 500,000 shares of its common stock (\$1 par) to the NEES Incentive Share Plan (Plan), or in the alternative to purchase such shares for the Plan on the open market, and to solicit proxies from shareholders for approval of the Plan.
