COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC'S EMERGING MARKETS ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

The Securities and Exchange Commission's Emerging Markets Advisory Committee will hold its first meeting on June 12, 1990 at 10:30 a.m. in Room 1C30, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. The purpose of the meeting will be to review objectives and responsibilities of the Committee and to establish plans for orderly progression of its work. It will consider areas in which the Commission's assistance has already been sought by officials in countries with emerging securities markets.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

OSGUTHORPE, MARKET TIMER, CONSENTS TO INJUNCTION AND DISGORGEMENT

Jack H. Bookey, Administrator of the Seattle Office of the Commission, announced that on May 14, 1990, Judge Carolyn Dimmick, United States District Court Judge for the Western District of Washington at Seattle, entered a judgment permanently enjoining Steven Garn Osguthorpe from future violations of Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 and ordering him to pay \$128,342 to eight investors. Osguthorpe consented to the final judgment, admitting the allegations of the Complaint, and he undertook to not seek a discharge of sums owed to investors in any bankruptcy proceeding, acknowledging that the judgment represented a debt induced by his fraud. Osguthorpe pretended to be a "market timer", accepting investor funds based on the false representation that he would invest and manage the funds for investors. Instead, he converted all investor funds to himself. Osguthorpe pleaded guilty to three counts of securities fraud during November 1989 and was sentenced during February 1990 to five years in prison followed by five years of probation with restitution to the victims. The Commission's civil judgment provides for disgorgement directly to the victims, enabling them to seek enforcement of the judgment as though they were parties to the action. ALAN C. GOULDING, ROBERT J. FOLEY, JOEL LOPATE,
MURRAY VERLIN, KURT GOLDMAN AND PETER GOLDMAN

On June 5, 1990, the Commission filed a Complaint in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York against Alan C. Goulding, Robert J. Foley, Joel Lopate, Murray Verlin, Kurt Goldman and Peter Goldman alleging violations of Sections 10(b) and 14(e) of the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5 and 14(e) thereunder in connection with trading in the securities of Shopwell, Inc., Delchamps, Inc., Waldbaum, Inc., and the Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea Company, Inc. The Commission alleged that Goulding, at the time a senior A&P officer, learned in

connection with his employment duties at A&P that the company was preparing to acquire Shopwell, Delchamps and Waldbaum and that A&P's 1986 fourth quarter and yearly earnings were materially higher than previous comparable periods. The Commission also alleged that Goulding improperly communicated such information concerning one or more of the issuers to Foley, Lopate and Verlin, and that Verlin thereafter improperly communicated information to Kurt Goldman and Peter Goldman.

Without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint, the defendants consented to permanent injunctions against future violations. Defendants also agreed to disgorge, in the aggregate, profits of \$513,881.23, plus \$189,879.97 in interest and to pay \$1,300,131.25 in civil penalties. [Securities and Exchange Commission v. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

WILLIAM EDWARD KINZEL CONVICTED AND SENTENCED

John E. Lampe, U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Washington, and the SEC announced that William Edward Kinzel of Spokane, Washington, was found guilty on October 25, 1989 by a jury of one count of wire fraud, and was sentenced on December 29, 1989. Judge Justin L. Quackenbush of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Washington sentenced Kinzel to 14 months imprisonment, followed by three years supervised release, and ordered Kinzel to repay \$100,000 to the victim of the wire fraud. Kinzel is appealing his conviction to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit.

As a result of a joint investigation by the Justice Department and the Commission, Kinzel was convicted of executing a scheme to defraud and obtain money by means of false and fraudulent pretenses, representations and promises in that on or about January 31, 1989 Kinzel took \$100,000, wired by an investor for purchase of a municipal bond, but never purchased the bond or returned the money. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

INDIANA ENERGY, INC., ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing Indiana Energy, Inc., an exempt public-utility holding company, to acquire all of the outstanding common stock of (i) Terre Haute Gas Corporation, a wholly-owned public-utility subsidiary of Indiana Gas & Chemical Corporation (IGCC), an exempt public-utility holding company, and (ii) Richmond Gas Corporation, a privately held Indiana gas utility company. IGCC and certain other parties join in the application. (Rel. 35-25099 - June 1)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by: National Association of Securities Dealers (SR-NASD-90-3) to amend Part III of the NASD's code of Arbitration to modify the procedures and schedules under which fees are assessed for the use of arbitration facilities. (Rel. 34-28086); (SR-NASD-90-21) to establish a new service, Digital Interface Service, which offers market makers an alternative method of receiving NASDAQ Workstation information. (Rel. 34-28071); and National Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-NSCC-89-18) to revise NSCC's general fee schedule. (Rel. 34-28085)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes were filed by: The Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-PHLX-90-09) to rescind the fee imposed by the PHLX on options transactions executed via the Exchange's AUTOM System. (Rel. 34-28079); The MBS Clearing Corporation (MBSCC-90-04) to require Broker Participants to submit broker/dealer trade input on trade date. (Rel. 34-28082); The National Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-NSCC-90-07) to clarify the meaning of "expiration date" in connection with balance order liability notices. (Rel. 34-28060); and The National Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-NSCC-90-09) to make a technical correction to NSCC procedures regarding the submission of over the counter lock-in Trade Data. (Rel. 34-28062) The proposed rule changes became effective immediately upon filing. Publication of the rule changes are expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 11, 1990.
