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U.S. SECURITIES AND
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RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

RULES REGARDING ASSISTANCE TO FOREIGN GOVERNMENTS AMENDED

The Commission amended certain rules regarding assistance to foreign governments, reflecting terminology in the Insider Trading and Securities Fraud Enforcement Act of 1988, which added a definition of "foreign securities authority" to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Commission also delegated authority to the Director of the Division of Enforcement to grant access requests made by trustees in bankruptcy, and removed provisions regarding concurrence by the General Counsel in determinations to grant access requests in matters where the Commission has entered a formal order of investigation.

In connection with the Commission's consolidation of enforcement systems of records, see Release PA-11, the Chairman of the Commission exempted the consolidated system from certain provisions of the Privacy Act, to the extent that the system contains investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes. The Chairman exempted the consolidated system of records from Sections 552a(c)(3), (d), (e)(1), (e)(4)(G), (H), and (I), and (f) of the Privacy Act. The consolidated system includes investigatory records for which exemption was previously provided; the specific exemptions previously claimed are preserved by the Chairman's action. The exemption does not extend to public material, including public litigation files, that have been made part of the consolidated system of records. (Rel. 34-26875)

MODIFICATION OF SYSTEMS OF RECORDS

The Commission, under the Privacy Act of 1974, 5 USC 552a, has consolidated preexisting descriptions of its enforcement-related systems of records. The Commission also clarified its routine uses with respect to the consolidated system of records by adding language that explicitly covers disclosure of records to trustees in bankruptcy; in litigation in which the Commission is not a party; and to foreign governmental authorities, including foreign securities authorities. The consolidated description does not expand the categories of investigatory or litigation records maintained, the categories of individuals on whom such records are maintained, or the potential recipients of such information. The Chairman of the Commission has exempted the consolidated system of records from certain provisions of the Privacy Act. See Release 34-26875. (Rel. PA-11)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

FIRST DOMESTIC, INTERNATIONAL LAW ENFORCEMENT SEMINAR ON PENNY STOCK FRAUD HELD

Officials of the Securities and Exchange Commission, the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, and the Department of Justice yesterday keynoted the first two day seminar of domestic and international civil and criminal law enforcement authorities who are coordinating efforts aimed at wiping out penny stock fraud in the U.S. and abroad.

In welcoming the 156 participants to the conference yesterday in Leesburg, Virginia, David S. Ruder, Chairman of the Securities and Exchange Commission, said, "The training program you are about to begin will focus on one of the most menacing problems facing investors, regulators, and the legitimate securities industry -- penny stock fraud. Illegal activity in the selling and trading of low-priced securities has

increased dramatically in the United States. The Commission has also become concerned about the expansion of penny stock fraud beyond the borders of the U.S. into Canada, Europe and South America. Working together, I am confident that we can stem the widespread fraud and abuse in the penny stock markets." (Press Release 89-42)

TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN THE SECURITIES OF EUROPEAN AMERICAN CORPORATION

The Commission announced the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of European American Corporation, a Utah corporation, for the ten-day period beginning at 9:00 a.m. (EDT) on June 1 and terminating at 11:59 p.m. (EDT) on June 9.

The Commission temporarily suspended trading in the securities of European American because questions have been raised about the adequacy and accuracy of publicly disseminated information concerning, among other things, European American's business activities, operations and acquisition and valuation of assets, and whether it has reporting obligations under Section 12 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES CONTINENTAL EXCALIBUR CORP. AND W. REEVES MOORE

The Houston Branch Office announced that on May 22 U.S. Chief District Judge Lucius Bunton, Western District of Texas, entered an order of permanent injunction against Continental Excalibur Corporation, formerly of Midland, Texas, in an action filed on that day against Continental and its former president, W. Reeves Moore. Continental consented to the order of permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations. The Complaint alleges that Continental violated and Moore aided and abetted violations of certain provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the Securities Act of 1933, and that Moore also violated the antifraud provisions of the Exchange Act. The action is pending as to Moore.

The Complaint alleges that Moore misappropriated funds from the bank accounts of Continental by transferring the funds without company authorization into his own personal accounts and the accounts of a privately-held corporation wholly-owned by Moore. According to the Complaint, the amount of funds misappropriated by Moore constituted approximately 65% of the assets of Continental. It further alleges that Moore caused Continental to file several periodic reports with the Commission which were materially false and misleading. It seeks an accounting and disgorgement from Moore. (SEC v. Continental Excalibur Corporation, et al., USDC WDTX, Civil Action No. MD 89 CA 118). (LR-12110)

CIVIL ACTION FILED AGAINST DAVID AND GERALD HELLBERG

The Commission filed a civil action on May 31 in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California seeking to enjoin David and Gerald Hellberg from violating antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Complaint alleges that in March 1988, G. Hellberg purchased 280 call option contracts for the common stock of Lucky Stores, Inc. while in possession of material nonpublic information concerning a proposed tender offer for Lucky by American Stores Company. It also alleges that G. Hellberg obtained the information from his son, D. Hellberg, who, at the time, was employed by a wholly-owned subsidiary of American and was involved in the tender offer preparations. The Commission's injunctive action also seeks disgorgement of approximately \$328,844 in profits, jointly and severally, from the defendants, and civil penalties under the Insider Trading Sanctions Act of 1984. (SEC v. David Hellberg and Gerald Hellberg, CDCA, Civil Action No. 89-3309, WMB). (LR-12113)

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 19 to request a hearing on a proposal that the Commission declare, on its own motion, that Altius Beta Fund, Inc., Cashman Farrell Fund, Inc., Citius Alpha Fund, Inc., Citius Beta Fund, Inc., Henderson International Equity Fund, Inc., Sisco Fund Inc., TrustFunds Cash Reserve Trust, and Zeta Mutual Trust have ceased to be investment companies.
