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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST METROPOLITAN STOCK TRANSFER COMPANY AND MAUREEN A. ABATO

The Commission ordered public administrative proceedings under Section 17A(c) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Metropolitan Stock Transfer Company and Maureen A. Abato, president and sole owner and employee of Metropolitan.

The Order Instituting Proceedings alleges that from about May 1987 to about December 31, 1988, Metropolitan, aided and abetted by Abato, wilfully violated Sections 17(a), 17(f), 17A(c), and 17A(d) of the Exchange Act and rules thereunder, in that Metropolitan failed to (1) adhere to the turnaround requirements; (2) respond timely to written inquiries and requests; (3) comply with various recordkeeping and record retention requirements; (4) maintain current and accurate master securityholder files and control books; (5) file an annual study and evaluation of internal accounting control; (6) register in the Lost and Stolen Securities Program; (7) fingerprint various employees; (8) timely file an amended Registration Form TA-1; and (9) timely file its annual report on Form TA-2.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Metropolitan and Abato are true, and if so, to decide what, if any, remedial action is appropriate. (Rel. 34-27318)

### PAUL SCHOENGOLD BARRED

The Commission entered an Order Instituting Public Proceedings, Making Findings, and Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Paul Schoengold, formerly a registered representative with two registered broker-dealers.

The Order contains findings that, on July 20, 1987, Schoengold pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit securities fraud [U.S. v. Marshall A. Zolp, et al., No. 86-CR-0299, DNJ, July 20, 1987] and was sentenced to three years imprisonment (all but six months of the sentence was suspended by the Court), fined \$2,000, ordered to make restitution of \$10,000, and placed on probation for five years from the date of his release from incarceration.

Schoengold consented to the Order which bars him from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company, or municipal securities dealer with the proviso that he may apply to become associated with any such entity after three years from the date of the Order or upon completion of his probation, whichever occurs later. 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## TRADING SUSPENSIONS

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### TRADING SUSPENDED IN THE SECURITIES OF U.S. ASSURANCE CORPORATION

The Commission announced the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of U.S. Assurance Corporation for the ten-day period beginning at 9:30 a.m. (EDT) on October 11 and terminating at 11:59 p.m. (EDT) on October 20.

The Commission temporarily suspended trading in the company's securities in view of questions raised regarding the adequacy and accuracy of publicly disseminated information concerning, among other things, compliance with the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the financial condition of the company. Specifically, among other things, substantial questions have been raised about whether the issuer has distributed and is distributing securities in violation of the Securities Act, the value

of a significant amount of securities it holds as assets, the existence of certain assets including but not limited to debentures, certificates of deposit, and securities it holds as assets, and the completion of a merger with another company. The Commission is of the opinion that the public interest and the protection of investors require a suspension of trading in the company's securities.

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## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

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### **FINAL JUDGMENTS OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION ISSUED AGAINST JERRY LAMPLEY, OTHERS**

On October 2, the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Texas issued Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against Jerry Lampley, Tom Ellzey, Steven Abdo, Ronald Burks, John McCurdy, Sr., Dennis Piller, Donald Rose, William Sanford, Jr., Elmer Mueller, Raymond Proia, Petro-Serve, Ltd., Lampley Oil Co., Inc., and Magnolia Development Corp. Each were enjoined from violating Sections 10(b) and 15(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, Rule 10b-5, and Sections 5 and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933. In addition, Lampley, Ellzey, Abdo, Mueller, Proia, Petro-Serve, Lampley Oil, and Magnolia were ordered to pay disgorgement of various amounts.

The Commission alleged, in its Complaint filed on July 23, 1987, that defendants made material misrepresentations and omissions in connection with the sale of interests in oil and gas ventures, sold the securities in violation of the registration requirements of the Securities Act, and acted as brokers without being registered under the Exchange Act. (SEC v. Petro-Serve, Ltd., et al., Civil Action No. H-87-2350, SDTX, Houston Division). (LR-12269)

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## **CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS**

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### **LEO P. MARIANI INDICTED**

The Boston Regional Office and the U.S. Attorney for the District of Massachusetts announced that on September 28 the grand jury returned a two-count felony indictment charging Leo P. Mariani with conspiracy and obstruction of justice in connection with a 1987 Commission investigation into trading in the Coastal Savings Bank securities prior to the announcement of merger discussions between Coastal and Suffield Bank.

The indictment charges that Mariani, a Suffield, Connecticut physicist, met with Robert C. DiGennaro, former chairman and chief executive officer of Suffield Bank, discussed the Commission's investigation, agreed to provide false testimony before the Commission, and gave false, misleading, and evasive testimony under oath before the Commission. (U.S. v. Leo P. Mariani, USDC MA, Cr. No. 89-252-Mc). (LR-12270)

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## **HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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### **SAVANNAH ELECTRIC AND POWER COMPANY**

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Savannah Electric and Power Company, subsidiary of The Southern Company, to issue and sell at any time through December 31, 1990, up to \$30 million aggregate principal amount of its first mortgage bonds, in one or more series. (Rel. 35-24964 - Oct. 5)

### **COLUMBIA FUELS, INC.**

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 30 to request a hearing on a proposal by Columbia Fuels, Inc., and its parent company, Alabama Power Company, to finance the purchase of Alabama's nuclear fuel in the approximate amount of up to \$150 million. 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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange (SR-Amex-89-20) to extend and expand an index hedge exemption pilot program. (Rel. 34-27326)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-Phlx-89-44) to revise the Philadelphia Stock Exchange Automated Communication and Execution System limit order execution criteria. (Rel. 34-27333)

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

A proposed rule change has been filed under Rule 19b-4 by: The Government Securities Clearing Corporation (SR-GSCC-89-10) to make various changes to its rules concerning the availability of lists of eligible securities, time frames for settlement of payment obligations, facsimile transmission of notices, and deletion of rules that are redundant. (Rel. 34-27334); and The National Association of Securities Dealers (SR-NASD-89-44) that would extend for one year its quotation linkage with the International Stock Exchange of the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland, Ltd. (Rel. 34-27335)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 2.

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## TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

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### AMERICAN AIRLINES, INC.

Two orders have been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on applications by American Airlines, Inc. that the trusteeship of Connecticut National Bank under two or more indentures to be qualified under the Act, and under one or more of such qualified indentures and under certain other indentures, previously qualified or not subject to qualification under the Act, is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify the Bank from acting as trustee under any of such indentures.
