RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

COMMENTS REQUESTED ON PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO INDUSTRY GUIDE 3

The Commission authorized publication, for comment, of proposed amendments to Industry Guide 3, "Statistical Disclosure by Bank Holding Companies". The proposed amendments would call for certain disclosures regarding outstandings to borrowers in foreign countries experiencing liquidity problems that are expected to have a material impact on timely repayment of principal or interest, and certain restructurings of those outstandings.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CHAROLETTE AND EDWARD GARRITY HELD IN CIVIL CONTEMPT

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on July 3 Judge Robert A. Grant, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Indiana, South Bend Division, entered an Order of Civil Contempt against Charolette and Edward Garrity. The Order directs the Garritys to disgorge to the Court, by September 16, 1986, \$295,049 collected from investors in violation of the August 9, 1984 Temporary Restraining Order (TRO) and the October 5, 1984 Order of Preliminary Injunction previously entered against them. The Order of Civil Contempt also provides for the Garritys' imprisonment should they fail to make the required disgorgement, and cannot show compliance is impossible. In addition, the Order of Civil Contempt orders the imprisonment of Charolette Garrity for her failure to comply with the Court's April 15, 1985 Order to disgorge to the Court \$581,810 collected from investors in connection with a program she operated known as Collectibles.

The Commission's March 14, 1986 Notice and Motion for an Order to Show Cause alleged that the Garritys violated the TRO and Preliminary Injunction as well as the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws by selling in a fraudulent manner over \$100,000 in unregistered securities in a program they operated known as International Diversified Corporation. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JACK RINGER, OTHERS INDICTED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on July 22 a federal grand jury in Chicago returned a 15-count indictment against Jack Ringer of Brooklyn, New York, Sam Sarcinelli (presently incarcerated), Herbert Stone of Beechhurst, New York, Raphael Bloom of New York City, New York, Alan Scop of Brooklyn, and Gary Brustein of Floral Park, New York, charging them with violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws, the mail fraud statute and conspiracy in connection with transactions involving the securities of European Auto Classics, Ltd. from 1979 to May 1982. The indictment identifies Stone, Bloom and Scop as stockbrokers who were associated with the firms Norbay Securities, Jay W. Kauffmann & Co. and AMFCO Securities, Inc., respectively, during the time period in question. Additionally, both Stone and Bloom are charged with having made false statements to the grand jury. European Auto, a defunct Great Neck, New York car dealer, went public in 1980 and was liquidated in 1984 by the State of New York for its failure to pay state sales tax. (U.S. v. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

COWEN INCOME & GROWTH FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 15 to request a hearing on an application filed by Cowen Income & Growth Fund, Inc., for an order exempting it from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rules 22c-1 and 22d-1. The exemption will permit Cowen to impose a contingent deferred sales charge on certain redemptions of its shares and waive or credit such charge in certain instances. (Rel. IC-15227 - July 25)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Chicago Board Options Exchange filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-CBOE-86-22) to describe the eligibility criteria for CBOE members to participate in a pilot in equity options using the CBOE's Retail Automatic Execution System. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 28. (Rel. 34-23474)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval of a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-CBOE-86-23) to amend its arbitration rules to allow (1) the appointment of panels of three arbitrators in cases in excess of \$500,000 in controversy upon consent of the parties, (2) arbitrators to sanction a party for failure to file a timely answer to a claim, cross-claim or counter claim, and (3) for assessment of a \$100 fee against a party seeking to adjourn a hearing. Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent.
