COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

LINDA D. FIENBERG APPOINTED ASSOCIATE GENERAL COUNSEL FOR COUNSELING

Chairman Shad has selected Linda D. Fienberg to fill the position of Associate General Counsel in charge of counseling. Ms. Fienberg's responsibilities will include rendering advisory services and making recommendations in the areas of legislation, policy, and rulemaking. Ms. Fienberg has been in the Commission's Office of General Counsel since January 1979. For the last four years, she has been Associate General Counsel in charge of litigation. Prior to that time, she served as a Special Counsel and then as an Assistant General Counsel with primary responsibilities for litigation. Before coming to the Commission, Ms. Fienberg was associated with the Washington, D.C. law firm of Arnold and Porter. Ms. Fienberg is a 1973 graduate of the Georgetown University Law Center where she was an editor of the Georgetown Law Journal. She received a B.A. with distinction from Cornell University in 1964, where she was elected to Phi Beta Kappa, and an M.A.T. with honors from Wesleyan University in 1966. Before entering law school, she taught college and worked as a research analyst.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

TWELVE UTAH ISSUERS SUBJECT OF STOP ORDER PROCEEDINGS

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Section 8(d) of the Securities Act of 1933 to determine whether Stop Orders should be issued suspending the effectiveness of the S-18 registration statements filed by 12 different issuers, all headquartered in the Salt Lake City, Utah area. They are: D. Swanson Barrell Enterprises, Inc.; L. H. Beaslin Enterprises, Inc.; Pompeii, Inc.; New Order Technology, Inc.; Peter Gun, Inc.; 101, Inc.; 102, Inc.; 103, Inc.; 104, Inc.; 105, Inc.; 106 Technology, Inc.; and 107, Inc. The registration statements, filed in the Denver Regional Office, involved a blank check offering seeking to raise approximately \$76,000.

The 12 orders instituting the proceedings allege false and misleading statements, or omissions of material statements, in the registration statements regarding, among other things: (1) the failure to identify a certain individual as a promoter, affiliate and control person of the issuers; (2) the audited financials; and (3) failure by the issuers, except Swanson Barrell and Beaslin Enterprises, to cooperate in the examination authorized by the Commission under Section 8(e) of the Securities Act.

The order instituting proceedings also ordered that hearings be conducted to determine whether the allegations are true and, if so, whether a stop order is appropriate. (Rel. 33-6657)

REGULATION A CONDITIONAL EXEMPTIONS OF TWO UTAH ISSUERS TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED

The Commission ordered that the conditional exemptions from registration provided by Regulation A claimed by Kevin D. Oakes Enterprises, Inc. of Sandy, Utah, and Abbate, Inc. of Salt Lake City, Utah, be temporarily suspended under Rule 261(a) of Regulation A. Each claimed the exemption for sale of common stock in a blank check offering under Section 3(b) of the Securities Act of 1933.

The orders temporarily suspending the exemption alleged failure to disclose within the Form 1-A, Part I-Notification and Part II-Offering Circular, the identity of a certain person as an additional promoter and affiliate of the issuer; and misrepresentations of material facts regarding the audit.

The orders further provide that interested persons may file with the Commission Secretary a written request for a hearing within 30 days after entry of the order. If such request is received, the Commission will set a hearing to determine whether the suspension should be made permanent. If no hearing is requested, the order will become permanent 30 days after entry. (Rel. 33-6659-Oakes; Rel. 33-6658-Abbate)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE ZWEIG FUND, INC.

An order has been issued exempting The Zweig Fund, Inc. from Section 17(f) of the Investment Company Act to permit it to maintain excess variation margin with futures commission merchants for transactions in futures contracts and options on futures contracts. (Rel. IC-15321 - Sept. 22)

SWISS BANK CORPORATION

An order has been issued exempting the Swiss Bank Corporation, a Swiss commercial bank, and SBC Finance (Delaware) Inc., its subsidiary, from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-15323 - Sept. 23)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, to further amend a \$300 million Credit Agreement, previously authorized by the Commission, as amended, to provide for a three-eighths of one percent increase to the existing borrowing margins for certificate of deposit and LIBOR options and for certain additional protective covenants. (Rel. 35-24196 - Sept. 23)

KENTUCKY POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Kentucky Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, to enter into a further amendment of its revolving credit agreement evidencing borrowings in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$75 million, under which the banks involved in the transaction would extend their commitments from December 31, 1987 to December 31, 1990. All other terms and conditions of borrowing under the Revolving Credit Agreement shall remain unchanged. (Rel. 35-24197 - Sept. 23)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Securities Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-86-11) which became effective upon filing under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act. The proposed rule change enables participants in the Automated Customer Account Transfer Service to submit transfer initiation requests in automated format. (Rel. 34-23629)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

OGLETHORPE POWER CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Oglethorpe Power Corporation that the trusteeship of Trust Company Bank (under nine separate Trust indentures under which pollution control bonds were issued and a new indenture dated September 1986 under which it is proposed to issue serial facility bonds of Oglethorpe) is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify the Trust Company from acting as trustee.
