### OPEN MEETING ON TAX REFORM ACT

The Commission may discuss the disclosure by registrants of the effects of the Tax Reform Act. It may also discuss whether it should object to the presentation of disclosures that quantify the effects of the Tax Reform Act by the pro forma application of the Financial Accounting Standards Board's Exposure Draft, "Proposed Statement of Financial Accounting Standards - Accounting for Income Taxes." The Commission adopted amendments to Form D which revise the information requirements of the Form. In addition, the six-month updating requirement and the final filing of Form D, which was part of the notice requirement contained in Rule 503 of Regulation D, have been eliminated. 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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### THOMAS COLTHURST NAMED ASSISTANT REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR IN LOS ANGELES

Los Angeles Regional Administrator Irving M. Einhorn announced the appointment of Thomas A. Colthurst as Assistant Regional Administrator for Enforcement. Mr. Colthurst joined the Commission's staff in 1981 as an enforcement attorney in the San Francisco Branch Office and in 1985 became an Enforcement Branch Chief in the Los Angeles Regional Office. He received his A.B. in 1977 from the University of California at Berkeley and his J.D., cum laude, in 1981 from the University of Santa Clara School of Law, where he was Research Editor of the Law Review.

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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### THOMAS F. QUINN ENJOINED IN REGULATION A OFFERING CASE

The New York Regional Office announced that on September 18 Judge Thomas P. Griesa, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, enjoined Thomas F. Quinn from violations of the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Quinn consented to the permanent injunction without admitting or denying the substantive allegations in the Commission's April 12, 1983 complaint.

The complaint, naming ten defendants, alleged that in early 1980 Quinn, a prior securities violator who had been barred from association with any broker-dealer and barred from practice before the Commission, was an undisclosed promoter, control person, and underwriter for public offerings of securities by Sundance Gold Mining & Exploration Inc. and Aquarius Gold Exploration Inc. who made unlawful reliance on the Regulation A exemption from registration. The complaint also alleges that Quinn and other defendants used false and misleading offering circulars for the Sundance and Aquarius offerings and manipulated the Sundance aftermarket.

The action is pending against A. Frank Sidoti, Amfco Securities Inc., Alan Scop, Murray Rothfleisch, Robert Redmer, Gary Wolff, and Irving Orenstein. (SEC v. Thomas F. Quinn, et al., 83 Civ. 2794, SDNY, TPG). (LR-11230)

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## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

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### WARREN H. CHANEY AND DWIGHT E. CHANEY INDICTED

The U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky and the Houston Branch Office announced that on September 15 a federal grand jury in Louisville, Kentucky returned a 26-count indictment charging Warren H. Chaney, of Houston, Texas, and Dwight E. Chaney, of Hopkinsville, Kentucky, with securities fraud and interstate transportation of stolen property. The indictment charges that from February 1981 to February 1982, the defendants engaged in a scheme to defraud investors through the offer and sale of promissory notes, raising at least \$1 million.

The indictment further charges that, among other things, the defendants misrepresented to investors that their funds would be invested in the stock market by a purported stock market genius, and that investors would receive a five percent return on their investment every 15 working days. It is further alleged that the defendants omitted to state material facts to investors including, among other things, that the purported stock market genius had been convicted of fraud and barred by the NASD, and that the defendants would receive a ten percent return on the amounts invested.

If convicted, each could be sentenced up to 230 years in prison and fined \$250,000. (U.S. v. Warren H. Chaney, et al., Crim. No. 86-00025, USDC WDKY). (LR-11231)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### OXFORD ACCEPTANCE CORPORATION; OXFORD ACCEPTANCE CORPORATION III

Orders have been issued on an application filed by Oxford Acceptance Corporation, a Delaware corporation issuing mortgage backed securities, and Oxford Acceptance Corporation III, a Maryland limited purpose corporation issuing mortgage-backed securities, exempting them from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-15332; IC-15333 - Sept. 26)

### HOME MAC MORTGAGE SECURITIES CORPORATION

An order has been issued amending a prior order exempting HOME MAC Mortgage Securities Corporation from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-15335 - Sept. 30)

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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-CBOE-87-29) which provides that market or marketable limit orders of up to 99 options contracts in the Standard & Poor's 500 Index are eligible for automatic execution in the SPX Retail Automatic Execution System six-month pilot program. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
