## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO TENDER OFFER RULES

The Commission is publishing for comment a release regarding tender offers that sets forth its interpretations and proposes to codify its position respecting equal treatment of security holders in a tender offer, specifying that a tender offer must be extended to all holders of the class of securities subject to the offer and all security holders must be paid the highest consideration offered during the offer. The Commission also proposed revising existing Rule 14e-1(b) by adding an increase in the amount of securities sought as a trigger for the additional ten business day period under that rule.

Comments must be received on or before 60 days after publication in the Federal Register and should refer to File No. S7-34-85. ### COMMENTS REQUESTED ON PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RULES 13e-4 AND 14e-1

The Commission is soliciting comments on issues relating to proposed amendments to: (1) Rule 13e-4 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 governing tender offers by issuers, to codify that an issuer tender offer must be extended to all holders of the subject securities and that all security holders must be paid the highest consideration offered; to conform the minimum offering, withdrawal and proration periods required of issuer tender offers to those required of third-party offers; and to require the offer to remain open for ten business days from an increase in the number of shares sought; and (2) Rule 14e-1 under the Exchange Act concerning unlawful tender offer practices, to apply the rule's minimum time periods to all issuer tender offers. The proposed "all holders" and "best price" amendments are being issued for comment in conjunction with proposed Rule 14d-10 [Rel. 33-6595].

### RULE 3b-9 ADOPTED

The Commission adopted Rule 3b-9 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. This rule excludes from the definition of "bank" as found in Section 3(a)(6) of the Exchange Act banks which engage in certain securities activities. (Rel. 34-22205)

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## **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

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### **INITIAL DECISION ISSUES STOP ORDER SUSPENDING REGISTRATION STATEMENT OF MILITARY ROBOT CORPORATION**

Administrative Law Judge David J. Markun issued an initial decision containing a stop order suspending the amended registration statement of Military Robot Corporation under Section 8(d) of the Securities Act of 1933. The decision is based upon findings that the amended registration statement is incomplete and inaccurate in that, among other things, it fails to disclose contingent liabilities of some \$40,000 stemming from the prior sale of securities by two predecessor companies.

The decision is subject to review by the Commission on its own motion or on petition of a party.

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## **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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### **GREAT-WEST LIFE AND ANNUITY INSURANCE COMPANY**

An order has been issued on an application filed by Great-West Life and Annuity Insurance Company, et al., granting exemptions from certain provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a), 15(b), 26(a) and 27(c)(2) of the Investment Company Act in the offering of single premium variable life insurance policies. (Rel. IC-14614 - July 1)

### **PRUDENTIAL-BACHE GLOBAL FUND, INC.**

An order has been issued exempting Prudential-Bache Global Fund, Inc. and Prudential Government Plus Fund, Inc. from Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c) and 22(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22c-1 to permit the assessment (and waiver and reduction in certain cases) of a contingent deferred sales charge on redemptions of their shares. (Rel. IC-14615 - July 1)

### **GTE FINANCE CORPORATION**

An order has been issued exempting GTE Finance Corporation, subsidiary of GTE Corporation, from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14616 - July 2)

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## **HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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### **CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION**

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 15 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central and South West Corporation (CSW), a registered holding company, to form a new subsidiary, CSW Credit, Inc. (Credit), which will have the initial purpose of purchasing the accounts receivable of CSW's operating companies. It is proposed that Credit be permitted to have an average capital structure approximating a debt-equity ratio of 80% and 20%, respectively, and that CSW be permitted to borrow, under lines of credit or loan agreements, an aggregate amount of up to \$320 million and provide additional capital through equity contributions in an amount up to \$80 million through December 31, 1986. (Rel. 35-23749 - June 28)

A notice has also been issued giving interested persons until July 22 to request a proposal by CSW and its subsidiary, West Texas Utilities Company, for West Texas to repurchase for cash a substantial portion of first mortgage bonds, Series J, 15-1/4% due November 15, 2011, and 16-1/8% debentures, Series 1982, due June 1, 2012 (collectively, Securities) through a tender offer to the holders of the Securities. West Texas also proposes to issue up to \$55 million aggregate principal amount of first mortgage bonds in order to fund the purchase of the tendered Securities. The first mortgage bonds will have a 30-year maturity or may have a shorter maturity should market conditions so dictate. (Rel. 35-23750 - June 28)

## JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 24 to request a hearing on a proposal by Jersey Central Power & Light Company, subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, to acquire up to \$2 million of notes issued by customers for financing certain conservation measures during the period ending December 31, 1989. 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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by The Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Phlx-85-7) to extend the applicability of its allocation and evaluation rules, Rules 500 through 506, through September 30, 1985. (Rel. 34-22191)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed by: The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (SR-MSRB-85-13) reordering its rules on responsibility for maintaining and preserving records. (Rel. 34-22192); and The Pacific Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-PSE-85-11) to exempt options on Convergent Technologies, Inc., an over-the-counter stock, from PSE's listing standards based on price. (Rel. 34-22193)

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## MISCELLANEOUS

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### THE BAUPOST GROUP, INC.

An order has been issued exempting performance advisory fee arrangements by The Baupost Group, Inc. and Baupost Partners with certain limited partnerships from the provisions of Section 205(1) of the Investment Advisers Act. The order also exempts Applicants from the recordkeeping requirements of Section 204 of the Act and Rules 204-2(b) and (c) to the extent such provisions require separate records for each limited partner. Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
