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## NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

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### CHANGES IN THE MEETING: ADDITIONAL ITEMS

The following additional items, replacing the Phlx proposal to trade options on the European Currency Unit, will be considered at the open meeting on December 19th at 10:00 a.m.:

(1) Consideration of whether to issue a release approving a proposed rule change by the Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Phlx-85-23) which, among other things, would create a classified Board of Governors. The amendments would provide that of the 21 previously unclassified broker governors on the Philadelphia Board, nine would be categorized as On-Floor Governors, nine as Off-Floor Governors and three as At-Large Governors. In addition, the Board would continue to include the Chairman, two Vice Chairmen (one from the floor and one from off the floor), the President of the Corporation and three public governors. (2) Consideration of whether to issue the following orders and opinions authorizing: (a) Middle South Utilities, Inc. (MSU), a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, Middle South Services, Inc. (Services), Middle South Energy, Inc. (MSE), Arkansas Power & Light Company (AP&L), Louisiana Power & Light Company (LP&L), Mississippi Power & Company (MP&L), New Orleans Public Service, Inc. (NOPSI) and System Fuels, Inc. (SFI), to continue a system money pool, including MSE therein, and to sell short-term notes to banks and commercial paper dealers from time to time through December 31, 1986; (b) SFI to finance its 1986 fuel supply programs for the benefit of AP&L, LP&L, MP&L and NOPSI (collectively, Operating Companies), by making additional borrowings from the Operating Companies during 1986 of up to \$56 million; (c) LP&L to issue and sell up to \$75 million of its first mortgage bonds by negotiated private placement; (d) MSU, MSE and the Operating Companies to make certain amendments to MSE's domestic bank loan agreement; and (e) MSU to amend its original Credit Agreement, and the period during which MSU may effect borrowings from the banks thereunder, to no later than December 31, 1986, and to reduce the maximum principal amount of borrowings permitted to be made by MSU thereunder to \$25 million at any time outstanding. 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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### SOLICITATION OF COMMENTS ON CERTAIN ISSUES RAISED AT THE NOVEMBER 25th STAFF MEETING ON EDGAR

The Commission requests comments on five issues pertaining to its anticipated Request for Proposals (REP) for an electronic filing, processing and information dissemination system. The five issues are: (1) 132 character workstations; (2) filer phase-in schedule; (3) dissemination to state securities regulators; (4) ownership of software and other intellectual property; and (5) proposed dissemination pricing and regulation approach.

Each of these issues has been raised in previous Commission announcements, and the public has commented. This is intended to provide interested persons an opportunity to offer further comment.

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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### NASD ACTIONS AGAINST LOWELL H. LISTROM & COMPANY, INC. AND LOWELL H. LISTROM AFFIRMED

The Commission affirmed sanctions imposed by the NASD in two disciplinary actions against Lowell H. Listrom & Company, Inc., a Kansas City brokerage firm, and Lowell H. Listrom, its president. The NASD censured the firm and Listrom, assessed fines totaling \$4,500 and issued a letter of caution respecting certain reporting violations.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that, while engaged in "best efforts" underwritings of "all or none" and part or none" offerings, respondents failed to transmit investors' funds promptly to the escrow agents; failed to record subscription sales to customers and to send those customers confirmations; and improperly extended credit to customers. The Commission also affirmed NASD findings that respondents committed additional violations of recordkeeping and reporting provisions.

In affirming the sanctions imposed by the NASD, the Commission observed that respondents had "demonstrated a continuing inability or unwillingness to comply with important regulatory requirements imposed for the protection of investors."

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### IDS FUND GROUP

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 7, 1986 to request a hearing on an application for an order exempting members of the IDS Fund Group (Funds), their advisers and certain affiliated underwriters from Section 10(f) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 10f-3 to permit the Funds, under certain conditions and limitations, to purchase securities through affiliated underwriting syndicates.

### FINANCIERE CREDIT SUISSE--FIRST BOSTON

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until January 6, 1986 to request a hearing on an application for an order exempting Financiere Credit Suisse--First Boston and Financiere, Inc. from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in their proposed issuance of debt securities in the United States. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### NEW ENGLAND POWER COMPANY

A clarifying order has been issued regarding a previously authorized proposal by New England Power Company, subsidiary of New England Electric System, to execute loan agreements in the issuance of short-term pollution control bonds, which corrects information regarding the use of proceeds of the issuance and sale, and the language describing our reservation of jurisdiction over the terms and conditions of loans under the loan agreement. ### ARKANSAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued relating to Arkansas Power & Light Company (AP&L), subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc. AP&L was authorized on December 4 to enter into one or more installment sale agreements (Agreement) with Pope County, Arkansas, which contemplates the issuance by the County of one or more series of its pollution control revenue bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$125 million. The Commission reserved jurisdiction over the terms and conditions and fees and expenses related to the transaction since the record was incomplete as to these items. By post-effective amendment, AP&L has completed the record as to the terms and conditions and fees and expenses, and this supplemental order releases jurisdiction over these items. AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing American Electric Power Service Corporation (AEPSC), service company of American Electric Power Company, Inc. (AEP), to issue letters of credit or surety bonds to certain insurance companies to maintain the currently existing worker's compensation program and general and automobile liability insurance program and to put into effect certain provisions of the group medical plan. AEP has been authorized to guarantee the obligations of AEPSC with respect to the letters of credit or surety bonds or, in the alternative, obtain such letters of credit or surety bonds itself on behalf of AEPSC.
