RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

EXTENSION OF COMMENT PERIOD ON THE STATUS OF SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATIONS

The Commission is extending, until March 13, the date by which comments must be submitted on whether the Commission should propose rules or legislation which would have the effect of affording certain savings and loan associations the same treatment given banks under certain exemptive provisions of the securities laws.

Comments should be submitted in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, NW, Washington, DC 20549. Comments must be received on or before March 13 and should refer to File No. S7-1005. All submissions will be available for public inspection at the Commission's Public Reference Room. (Rel. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST BASIC EARTH SCIENCE SYSTEMS, INC.

The Commission announced that on February 14 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Basic Earth Science Systems, Inc. The complaint alleges that Basic, a Denver, Colorado oil and gas exploration company, violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and that G.W. Breuer, chief executive officer and controlling shareholder of Basic, violated an antifraud provision of the Securities Act.

The complaint stated that on December 18, 1980 Basic offered for sale 1.1 million units through an underwriting syndicate managed by John Muir & Co. The alleged violations occurred in statements made by Basic after the offering in public releases and filings with the Commission. Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, Basic, without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, consented to a Judgment of Permanent Injunction restraining and enjoining it from further violations of the antifraud provisions. Also, Breuer submitted an undertaking to the Court in which he agreed, as an officer and director of Basic, to be bound by the injunction entered against Basic and not to become an officer, director, or otherwise engage in the management of any other publicly-held company for two years. The Court ordered Breuer, who was not separately enjoined, to comply with his undertaking. (SEC v. Basic Earth Science Systems, Inc. and G. W. Breuer, USDC DC, Civil Action No. 84-460). (LR-10285)

ORDER EXTENDING PARTIAL APPROVAL

The Commission has extended until March 12 its summary and temporary approval of portions of a rule change proposed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-80-16). The provisions of the rule being approved relate to appointment and oversight of market makers while the remainder requires that a minimum portion of a market maker's options transactions be executed in person. NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following have filed proposed rule changes under Rule 19b-4: The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated, The Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. and The Pacific Stock Exchange, Inc.
