RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

ADOPTION OF TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS TO FORM N-1 AND CERTAIN RELATED RULES

The Commission adopted technical amendments to Form N-1 and certain related rules under the Securities Act of 1933 and the Investment Company Act of 1940. The amendments formally bring to an end on September 20, 1984 the previously announced transition period during which open-end management investment companies are permitted to file registration statements on either Form N-1 or N-1A. (Rel. 33-6544)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

DENNIS HOWARD HARRIS, OTHERS SANCTIONED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings under Sections 203(e) and (f) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and Section 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Dennis Howard Harris, Philip K. Stoufer and Money Tree Financial Services, Inc. (Registrant), a registered investment adviser, all of Phoenix, Arizona. Stoufer and Harris were president and vice-president, respectively, of Registrant and were registered representatives with a registered broker-dealer.

Simultaneous with the institution of these proceedings, Harris, Stoufer and Registrant submitted Offers of Settlement. Under the terms of their Offers of Settlement, Harris, Stoufer and Registrant, without admitting or denying any of the facts or findings, consented to the Commission's findings and an order. The Commission ordered that: Harris and Stoufer to be barred from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company; after 14 months, they may make application to become associated in a nonsupervisory capacity; and, after two years, they may make application to be associated in any capacity; and Registrant's registration as an investment adviser be revoked. ORDERS MAKING FINDINGS AND IMPOSING REMEDIAL SANCTIONS ON RICHARD NAGER AND JAMES E. COHEN

The Commission entered an Order Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Richard Nager, a registered representative and vice president of Rooney Pace, Inc. (Registrant), and James E. Cohen, also a registered representative at Registrant. The Commission had accepted Offers of Settlement from Nager and Cohen providing for findings, without admitting or denying, that Nager and Cohen each violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in their participation in the best efforts all or none offering of Sequential Information Systems, Inc. units in October 1981. The Order requires Nager and Cohen to each: be suspended from association with any broker or dealer for 30 calendar days; enroll in and attend a course in the legal, regulatory and operational requirements of public underwritings; and file affidavit(s) stating their compliance with these sanctions. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF MONTANA

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 30 to request a hearing on an application filed by Development Corporation of Montana for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14081 - Aug. 6)

NUVEEN CASH RESERVES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 31 to request a hearing on an application for an order declaring that Nuveen Cash Reserves, Inc. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-14082 - Aug. 6)

EQUUS INVESTMENTS I, L.P.

An order has been issued declaring that the Independent General Partners of Equus Investments I, L.P. are not "interested persons" of Equus as defined in Section 2(a)(19) of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14083 - Aug. 6)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until October 1 to request a hearing on a proposal by Central and South West Corporation (CSW), a registered holding company, to form a new subsidiary, CSW Credit, Inc. (Credit), which will have the initial purpose of purchasing the accounts receivable of CSW's operating companies. It is also proposed that Credit be permitted to have an average capital structure approximating a debt-equity ratio of 80% and 20%, respectively, and that CSW be permitted to borrow, under lines of credit or loan agreements, an aggregate amount of up to \$320 million and provide additional capital through equity contributions up to \$80 million through December 31, 1985. CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Central Power & Light Company, subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, to issue and sell at competitive bidding up to \$200 million of first mortgage bonds through December 31, 1985. (Rel. 35-23386 - Aug. 3)

SOUTHWESTERN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Southwestern Electric Power Company, subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, to finance up to \$81,700,000 of pollution control facilities for a generating plant near Hallsville, Texas. (Rel. 35-23387 - Aug. 6)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. filed the following proposed rule changes which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act: (SR-NYSE-84-29) to create the NYSE position of executive vice chairman of the Board of Directors. (Rel. 34-21204); and (SR-NYSE-84-25) to adopt on a temporary pilot basis, for five participating firms, new members' badges using new identification codes known as "Alpha Symbols." (Rel. 34-21205)

ORDER GRANTING ACCELERATED PARTIAL APPROVAL

The Pacific Stock Exchange, Inc. filed a proposed rule change (SR-PSE-84-14) to amend two of its stated policies and practices pertaining to its securities communication order routing and execution system (SCOREX). The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, the PSE's proposal to increase the size of market orders which may be automatically executed from 599 to 1,099. In addition, the PSE is proposing to decrease the time during which the specialist may remove the order from the SCOREX system for manual execution from 30 to 15 seconds. (Rel. 34-21206)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Pacific Stock Exchange Inc. (SR-PSE-84-11) to revise the Exchange's system of regulating the obligations of market-makers. In part, these amendments provide that the market-maker's principal assignment will extend to a primary zone consisting of several posts, rather than a single post. (Rel. 34-21207)
