## NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

---

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted pursuant to provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration. The Commission will not normally meet on Mondays or Fridays.

The subject matter of the November 14 closed meeting will be: Formal orders of investigation; Institution of administrative proceeding of an enforcement nature; Institution of injunctive actions.

### OPEN MEETING - FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 16, 1984 - 10:00 a.m.

The subject matter of the November 16 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of whether to issue a release announcing a proposal to adopt Rule 3a12-9 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 which would deem interests in certain direct participation programs to be exempted securities for purposes of the arranging provisions of Sections 7(c) and 11(d)(1) of that Act. (2) Consideration of whether to adopt amendments to Rule 11Aa2-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, which governs the designation of securities qualified for trading in a national market system. ## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

---

### WESTATES-ITALO COMPANY ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on October 26 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Westates-Italo Company (WIC), a Cayman Island corporation with principal offices in Milan, Italy and an administrative office in Houston, Texas, restraining and enjoining it from failing to file timely periodic reports.

The May 21 complaint alleged that WIC, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct, failed to file its 1983 Annual Report and failed to file timely certain other annual and quarterly reports (WIC has subsequently filed its 1983 Annual Report). WIC, consenting to the Judgment, admitted the allegations in the complaint that it filed reports in an untimely manner on 14 separate occasions and failed to file Notifications of Late Filing on 10 separate occasions. ## CHARLES BAUER, JR. ENJOINED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on October 12 U.S. District Court Chief Judge Alfred L. Luongo entered a Preliminary Injunction and Order enjoining Charles Bauer, Jr., doing business as Fraternal Society of Annuity and Golden Eagle Annuities, from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Additionally, the Order continued a freeze of Bauer's assets which had been previously entered on September 24. Bauer consented to the preliminary injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint and Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order, Preliminary Injunction, Freeze of Assets and Accounting. The hearing on the Commission's application for a permanent injunction is scheduled to be heard on December 3. (SEC v. Charles Bauer, Jr., d/b/a Fraternal Society of Annuity and d/b/a Golden Eagle Annuities, ED PA, Civil Action No. 84-4574). (LR-10491)

## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

---

### AARON L. LERMAN SENTENCED

The New York Regional Office announced that on November 2 Aaron L. Lerman, a former registered representative for two broker-dealers registered with the Commission, was sentenced by Judge Charles L. Brieant, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, to six months imprisonment and 200 hours of community service for his central role in a conspiracy to steal, trade upon, and convey information from the New York City law firm of Skadden Arps Slate Meagher & Flom.

Lerman also consented to a permanent injunction and an order of disgorgement totalling \$866,534 in a related civil injunctive action [SEC v. Stephen G. Karanzalis, et al., 84 Civil 2070 (CLB) (SDNY)]. (U.S. v. Aaron L. Lerman, 84 Cr. 283, SDNY). (LR-10590)

### CITIZENS GROWTH PROPERTIES

# SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following have filed proposed rule changes under Rule 19b-4: The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (SR-MSRB-84-18) to amend MSRB Rule G-32 to improve the dissemination of official statements to purchasers of new issue municipal securities. (Rel. 34-21457); The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-84-28) to adopt rules and fees applicable to the Small Order Execution System for transactions in over-the-counter securities. (Rel. 34-21458); (SR-NASD-84-10) to amend Section 5 of Appendix F of the NASD Rules of Fair Practice. The proposed amendment would permit NASD members or persons associated with members that participate in public distributions of direct participation programs to receive a limited amount of indeterminate compensation provided certain conditions are satisfied. (Rel. 34-21468); and The American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-84-30) to increase the position and exercise limits applicable to individual stock options. (Rel. 34-21467)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of November 5.

## APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed under Rule 19b-4 by the Midwest Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-MSE-84-5) to modify Article IV, Rule 9 (Committee Quorum) of the MSE rules to provide that one-half of the members of the Committee on Specialist Assignment and Evaluation, not counting ex-officio members, shall constitute the number of committee members required for a quorum. Ex-officio members may be included for the purposes of determining a quorum, provided that at least one-half of those members present are not ex-officio ones. (Rel. 34-21459)

## ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-Phlx-84-23) to extend from October 1, 1984 to April 1, 1985 the applicability of Phlx Rules 501 through 506 governing the Exchange's pilot program providing for applications and evaluations of and stock allocations to Phlx specialists, alternate specialists, and registered options traders. Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
