## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND  
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

JOHN B. LOWRANCE PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Houston Branch Office announced that on June 21 the Honorable William S. Sessions, U.S. District Judge for the Western District of Texas, San Antonio Division, entered an Order of Permanent Injunction against John B. Lowrance of Houston, Texas. Lowrance is the former president and chairman of the board of Five Star Energy Corporation, a publicly-held company based in California.

The Order permanently enjoins Lowrance from violations and aiding and abetting violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud, reporting and proxy solicitation provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Order also requires Lowrance to disgorge certain of his assets to Five Star. Lowrance, the sole remaining defendant to this action, consented to the entry of the Order, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, which was filed on September 7, 1982. ### IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF AMENDMENT

The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated has filed an amendment to a proposed rule change which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (SR-CBOE-83-19) to provide for larger fees for transactions in Standard and Poor's 500 stock index option contracts.
