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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND  
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

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**NASD ACTION AGAINST FIRST ALABAMA SECURITIES, INC.  
AND JOHN A. BONHAM AFFIRMED**

The Commission has affirmed sanctions imposed by the NASD on First Alabama Securities, Inc., a Montgomery, Alabama brokerage firm, and John A. Bonham, its president. The NASD censured the firm and Bonham, fined them \$5,000, jointly and severally, and suspended Bonham for one year from acting as a financial principal, with the additional requirement that he requalify by examination before resuming that position.

The Commission found, as did the NASD, that, at various times during the period April 1980 through January 1981, the firm and Bonham failed to comply with record-keeping, customer protection and reporting requirements, failed to make complete quarterly securities counts, improperly extended credit to customers, and failed to document their supervision of salesmen.

In affirming the sanctions imposed by the NASD, the Commission noted that, in the last ten years, the firm and Bonham had previously been disciplined six times by the NASD for similar back-office violations and other infractions. The Commission observed that the respondents had "demonstrated a chronic inability or unwillingness to comply with applicable requirements." (Rel. 34-20017)

**UNITED OF OMAHA VARIABLE FUND B**

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 29 to request a hearing on an application of United of Omaha Variable Fund B, a registered open-end, diversified, management investment company, for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. 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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has approved proposed rule changes filed by the following: The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-83-21) that implements certain enhancements to the Exchange's Designated Order Turnaround and Limit Order Systems to ensure the timely reporting of executions in all stocks traded through those systems. (Rel. 34-20028); The Boston Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-BSE-83-7) to increase to 1,299 from 1,099 shares the size of orders to be executed under BSE's Guaranteed Execution System. (Rel. 34-20029); The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (SR-MSRB-83-6) to amend MSRB Rules G-12 and G-15 to require that the confirmation for a municipal securities transaction contain a statement of the basis on which interest is paid, if interest is paid on other than on a semi-annual basis. (Rel. 34-20031); (SR-MSRB-83-5) which amends MSRB Rule G-15 to require that when the yield on a municipal securities transaction effected on a dollar basis is calculated to premium call or par option, this fact must be stated on the customer confirmation along with the call or option date and price used in the yield calculation. (Rel. 34-20032); (SR-MSRB-83-4) to modify the standards constituting good delivery of registered municipal securities under MSRB Rule G-12. (Rel. 34-20039); and The American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-83-13) enlarging the discretion of the Amex Board of Governors to relax the terms on which permits are granted to trade or specialize in options on fixed income securities. (Rel. 34-20040).

### ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-83-16) to adapt NASD rules to the Commission's current options disclosure system and to regulate options-related communications with customers. (Rel. 34-20038)

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Phlx-83-10) to require members to have representatives available on the floor at specified times to make appropriate changes and corrections to trades. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of August 8. (Rel. 34-20041)

### NOTICE OF IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Exchange, Inc. filed a proposed rule change which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) (SR-Amex-83-17) to impose a regulatory charge on its members and member organizations to replace a regulatory fee which had previously been received from the National Securities Clearing Corporation. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of August 8. (Rel. 34-20042)
