U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

DENNIS SHEA NAMED ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

The Division of Market Regulation announces the appointment of Dennis G. Shea as Assistant Director for Market Operations and Surveillance. In his new position, Mr. Shea will supervise the Division's SRO inspection programs relating to market surveillance, operations and clearing. Mr. Shea is a graduate of the College of William and Mary, and received his MBA in Finance from American University. After serving as financial analyst in the Division of Enforcement and Senior Financial Analyst in the Special Study of the Options Markets, Mr. Shea was appointed Branch Chief in the Division's Office of Inspections in 1980.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST EDWARD J. FALVEY, OTHERS

The Boston Regional Office announced the filing of a complaint on January 27 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Massachusetts seeking to enjoin Edward J. Falvey, Charles O. Daly (C. Daly), John J. Flynn, Paul F. O'Neil, John S. Daly, Jr. (J. Daly) and Donald H. Hosking, all of Massachusetts, from further violations of various provisions of the securities laws. Each defendant was accused of aiding and abetting violations of Section 31(a) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Rule 31a-1 thereunder. O'Neil, J. Daly and Hosking were charged with violations of Section 34(a) and 34(b) of the Investment Company Act and Falvey, C. Daly and Flynn were charged with aiding and abetting these violations. J. Daly was also charged with violations of Section 37 of the Investment Company Act.

The complaint alleges that the defendants, while employed by the New England Merchants Bank, which provided custodial and shareholder recordkeeping services for a number of investment companies registered with the Commission, engaged in or aided and abetted activities over a period of some ten years which resulted in the failure of the investment companies to maintain proper books and records in that O'Neil, J. Daly and Hosking aided and abetted by Falvey, C. Daly and Flynn altered certain books and other documents of the funds and made untrue statements of material facts and omitted to state material facts in certain records required to be kept by investment companies.

J. Daly was also charged with unlawfully abstracting, converting, embezzling and stealing money, funds, securities, credits, property, and assets of certain investment companies. (SEC v. Edward J. Falvey, et al.). (LR-9575)

MICHAEL SAVAGE AND RICHARD WERDESHEIM CONSENT TO JUDGMENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION

The Commission announced that on February 5 the Honorable Judge Terry J. Hatter in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Michael Savage and Richard Werdesheim. Savage and Werdesheim, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint, each consented to the entry of a Permanent Injunction enjoining and restraining them from violating and aiding and abetting violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5 and, in the case of Werdesheim, 10b-6 thereunder. (SEC v. Donald E. Liederman, et al., C.D. Cal., CA No. 81-2315 TJH). (LR-9579)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SHEARSON FMA MUNICIPAL FUND

An order has been issued on an application filed by Shearson FMA Municipal Fund (Applicant), registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 as an open-end, diversified, management investment company, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act, exempting Applicant, subject to conditions, from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit Applicant to utilize amortized cost valuation for the purpose of pricing its shares for sale, redemption and repurchase. CENTENNIAL GOVERNMENT TRUST

APPROVAL OF AMENDED PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change and an amendment thereto filed under Rule 19b-4 by the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (SR-MSRB-81-18) to amend MSRB Rule G-12 on uniform practice to require that for "good delivery" securities must be identical to their inter-dealer confirmation with respect to certain specific descriptive details and with respect to any applicable call features. (Rel. 34-18474)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change filed under Rule 19b-4 by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (SR-NASD-81-23) to amend a Resolution of the Board of Governors to increase the honorarium paid to arbitrators for each hearing session in which they participate from \$50 to \$100. (Rel. 34-18475)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

UNION PACIFIC CORPORATION
