COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

KENNETH A. FOGASH NAMED DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Chairman Shad announced the selection of Kenneth A. Fogash as Deputy Executive Director. Mr. Fogash brings to the Commission a wide range of private and public sector experience. He has worked in various capacities for E.I. DuPont Company, Bunker Ramo Data Systems, International Computing Company, and Group Hospitalization. His government experience includes service with the Office of Management and Budget and Department of Labor. At OMB he was instrumental in introducing computer technology to the Federal budget process and was later assigned as senior advisor on the evaluation of various agencies' informational programs. Since 1978, Mr. Fogash has served at the Labor Department as Director of the Office of Management Information Systems in the Employment and Training Administration. He holds an MBA from George Washington University and a BS in accounting from Pennsylvania State University. Since 1968, Mr. Fogash has also been a member of the Adjunct Faculty of American University, where he has taught advanced courses in management information systems. Mr. Fogash's extensive background in information processing and his firsthand experience in labor relations are expected to strengthen Commission management in these areas.

OFFERING ACTIVITY IN FIRST QUARTER OF 1982 FALLS BELOW 1981'S FIRST QUARTER

Total corporate offerings for the first three months of 1982 amounted to \$15.5 billion, a decline of \$1.2 billion (7 percent) from the \$16.7 billion of offerings in 1981's first quarter, according to figures released today by the Commission's Directorate of Economic and Policy Analysis. Primary securities offerings in March 1982 increased to \$6.6 billion from February's \$5.6 billion.

According to figures compiled by the Commission's Division of Corporation Finance on filings made in anticipation of offerings, total filings in 1982's first quarter are nearly equal to those of 1981's first quarter (969 in 1982's first quarter versus 979 in 1981's first quarter). In addition, filings for new issuers (those not previously filing with the Commission) are little changed from the earlier quarter's total (330 in 1982's first quarter versus 340 in 1981's first quarter). CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES MORE UP THAN DOWN, INC. AND CHARLES FRIEDMAN

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on April 22 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio in Cleveland, naming as defendants More Up Than Down, Inc. (MUTD) and Charles Friedman. The complaint seeks to permanently enjoin the defendants from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and the registration, recordkeeping, investment advisory contract and antifraud provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The complaint alleges that the violations occurred in connection with the solicitation of funds by MUTD and Friedman from 14 investors and the investment of those funds in stock options. The case was assigned to the Honorable Judge White, U.S. District Judge. (SEC v. More Up Than Down and Charles Friedman, N.D. Ohio, Civil Action No. C82-1098). (LR-9669)

JEFFREY JOHN SHAUGHNESSY ENJOINED AND TEMPORARY CONSERVATOR APPOINTED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on April 29 the Honorable W. Earl Britt, Judge, U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of North Carolina, issued an order of permanent injunction and other equitable relief against Jeffrey John Shaughnessy of Raleigh, North Carolina, a registered investment adviser, Capital City Investments (CCI), a North Carolina limited partnership, and Virginia Mutual Investments (VMI), a Virginia limited partnership. Shaughnessy acted as investment adviser and general partner to CCI and VMI.

The injunction, which was entered pursuant to the consent of the defendants, without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint, enjoins Shaughnessy from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933, the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, the antifraud and recordkeeping provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940; CCI and VMI were enjoined from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act and the antifraud provisions of the Exchange Act.

The complaint alleged that Shaughnessy offered and sold units of interest in CCI and VMI for which no registration statements were filed or in effect, and that false and misleading statements were made and statements of material facts were omitted from statements made to existing and potential investors concerning, among other things, the performance and financial condition of CCI, the total assets of CCI, and the dissipation of assets of CCI through speculative trading. It was also alleged that Shaughnessy failed to maintain accurate books and records as required of investment advisers.

Edwin C. Walker was appointed temporary conservator to protect the assets of CCI and VMI until such time as the limited partners can meet and select a new general partner. (SEC v. Jeffrey John Shaughnessy, et al., E.D. N.C., Civil Action No. 82-441-CIV-5). (LR-9670)
