ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ANAMETRICS, INC. AND STEVEN A. GREENBERG CENSURED

The Commission announced that it has instituted public administrative proceedings under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 naming as respondents Anametrics, Inc., a registered investment adviser with its principal place of business in New York City, and Steven A. Greenberg, its president and principal shareholder. Simultaneously with the institution of proceedings, the Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement in which respondents, without admitting or denying the alleged violations, consented to the entry of findings, an order of censure and an undertaking. Specifically, the Commission found that Anametrics wilfully violated, and Greenberg wilfully aided and abetted violations of, (1) the recordkeeping provisions of the Advisers Act with respect to the investment advisory business of Anametrics, and (2) the provisions of the Advisers Act governing the assignment of investment advisory contracts.

Anametrics and Greenberg also agreed to an undertaking to comply with the record-keeping provisions of the Advisers Act and to retain an independent accounting firm and a legal firm to assist in the institution and maintenance of adequate internal controls and compliance procedures by Anametrics. The Commission issued an order censuring Anametrics and Greenberg and directing them to comply with their undertakings. (Rel. IA-804)

PUBLIC ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST DAVID SCHNEIDER

The Commission announced that public administrative proceedings have been instituted under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against David Schneider of Maplewood, New Jersey, employed by a broker-dealer registered with the Commission.

The Order for Proceedings alleges that between May 1978 and June 1979, Schneider failed reasonably to supervise persons subject to his supervision with a view to preventing violations of Sections 5(a), 5(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, in that a person under his supervision (a) sold the common stock of Sunny Land Tours, Inc. in non-exempt transactions when no registration statement was on file or in effect with the Commission; (b) participated in a scheme to manipulate the price of Sunny Land stock; and (c) made untrue statements of material fact and omitted to state material facts necessary in order to make the statements made, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading, in connection with the offer and sale of Sunny Land stock to his customers.

Simultaneously with the institution of proceedings, the Commission accepted an Offer of Settlement from Schneider, whereby he consented to the entry of an Order by the Commission providing for (1) findings, without admitting or denying, that he failed reasonably to supervise persons subject to his supervision with a view to preventing violations of Sections 5(a), 5(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, and (2) a suspension from association for a period of four months with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer in a proprietary or supervisory capacity, and a censure. (SR-NASD-82-6) to delete the charge for NASD members reporting transactions in listed securities and to establish a schedule of charges for members using the Computer Assisted Execution Service. (Rel. 34-18741); and The Midwest Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-MSE-82-5) to create an Automatic Execution System for orders under 400 shares. (Rel. 34-18742)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has approved the following proposed rule changes: National Securities Clearing Corporation (NSCC) - (SR-NSCC-82-5) which consolidates NSCC's present rules regarding admission of applicants and oversight of participants. The proposal incorporates into NSCC's rules and procedures minimum financial responsibility and operational standards for applicants to, and participants in, NSCC. In addition, the proposal sets forth guidelines requiring applicants and participants that fail to

satisfy those minimum standards to provide specified further assurances. Finally, the proposal contains guidelines for monitoring securities that NSCC believes present a greater than normal financial risk to NSCC and its participants (Rel. 34-18744); and Pacific Stock Exchange Inc. (PSE - (SR-PSE-82-3) to amend its rules relating to specialist responsibility (Rel. 34-18748).

NOTICE OF AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (MSRB) has filed a proposed amendment to MSRB Rule G-12 pursuant to Rule 19b-4 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (SR-MSRB-81-10) which would exempt from this rule all transactions cleared or settled through a registered clearing agency. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
