COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

BENJAMIN GREENSPOON NAMED ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

Stanley Sporkin announced that Chairman Harold M. Williams has appointed Benjamin Greenspoon, age 52, as an Associate Director in the Division of Enforcement. Mr. Greenspoon will have the responsibility for the supervision of the Division of Enforcement's Trial Unit which has the responsibility for the conduct of litigation of cases involving administrative and civil proceedings under the Federal securities laws. Mr. Greenspoon, a graduate of Georgetown University Law School, joined the Commission's staff as a trial attorney in the Trial Unit in 1974 following 18 years in private practice. He was thereafter named Chief Trial Attorney, the position he has held until this appointment.

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

NINTH CIRCUIT DENIES J. LYELL GINTER'S APPEAL

The Seattle Regional Office announced that on May 27, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals affirmed the conviction of J. Lyell Ginter of Bridal Veil, Oregon, based on Ginter's plea of *nolo contendere* to a charge of unlawfully selling unregistered securities. Ginter's appeal of his two year prison sentence was based on the contention that the sentencing court considered unreliable information contained in the presentence report. The original charges against Ginter stemmed from an investigation into his sales of personal promissory notes to persons in Oregon and California. (U.S. v. J. Lyell Ginter, D. Ore. No. CR 79-57). HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MASSACHUSETTS ELECTRIC COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 21 to request a hearing on a proposal by Massachusetts Electric Company, subsidiary of New England Electric System, to increase its short-term borrowing authorization. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Midwest Stock Exchange, Inc. (MSE) has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-MSE-80-11) to delete from its rules all references to MSE's organization, operation and regulation of an options market, while retaining its rules applicable to the handling of orders and the conduct of accounts relating to options trading.

WITHDRAWAL AND APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has withdrawn proposed rule changes filed by the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (MSRB) to MSRB rules D-8 and D-11 (SR-MSRB-77-12 and SR-MSRB-79-4). The proposed rule changes amend, respectively, the definitions of the term "bank dealer" in rule D-8 and the term "associated persons" in rule D-11. The Commission has approved proposed rule changes (SR-MSRB-79-4) to MSRB rules G-13 and G-19. The amendment to MSRB rule G-13 reorders subsections of the rule without textual change. The amendment to MSRB rule G-19 modifies the requirements in the rule with respect to suitability of recommendations concerning municipal securities. (Rel. 34-16917)
