COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

COMMISSIONER EVANS SPEAKS BEFORE SOUTHERN METHODIST UNIVERSITY

Commissioner Evans spoke before the Southwest Assembly, at Southern Methodist University in Tanglewood, Texas, on Friday, June 9, 1978. The title of his address was "SEC Influence on Corporate Ethics and Governance."

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

I*SECURITIES, INC., OTHERS SANCTIONED

Findings and an order imposing remedial sanctions pursuant to offers of settlement by respondents in a public administrative proceeding have been entered by the Commission against I*Securities, Inc., Investment Resources of Texas, Inc., and William R. Barrow, all of Houston, Texas.

The findings entered found that orders of permanent injunction were entered against I*Securities, Inc. and William R. Barrow enjoining them from further violations of the registration provisions of the securities laws; that I*Securities, Inc. failed to maintain the minimum required net capital, failed to keep current and accurate books and records, failed to file its required report of revenues and expenses, and failed to give timely notice under Rule 17a-11 of its non-compliance, and that Investment Resources of Texas, Inc. engaged in violations of the registration provisions of the securities laws.

The sanctions imposed by the order are the revocation of the registration of I*Securities, Inc., the withdrawal of the registration of Investment Resources of Texas, Inc., the barring of William R. Barrow from association with any broker-dealer, provided that after six months he may apply to the Commission to become re-associated as a supervised employee in a non-supervisory capacity upon a showing that he will be properly supervised. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

FEDERATED EXCHANGE FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 3 to request a hearing on an application of Federated Exchange Fund, Ltd. (Applicant), an open-end, diversified management investment company, for an order exempting Applicant's proposed quarterly distributions of long-term capital gains from the provisions of Section 19(b) of the Act and Rule 19b-1 thereunder. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALABAMA POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Alabama Power Company, subsidiary of The Southern Company, to amend its installment sales agreement with an agency of the Town of West Jefferson under which the company will construct pollution control facilities for Alabama to be financed by the agency's issuance and sale of pollution control revenue bonds. The amount of bonds to be issued by the agency will be increased by \$60 million. Alabama will acquire the facilities upon completion. (Rel. 35-20586 - June 9)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The following stock exchanges have filed proposed rule changes pursuant to Rule 19b-4: The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (SR-MSRB-78-8) which sets forth a comprehensive arbitration code for the municipal securities industry, including a simplified procedure for arbitration of small claims against municipal securities professionals.
