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## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

### WITHDRAWAL OF COMMISSION'S PROPOSAL TO AMEND RULE 2(e)(7) OF ITS RULES OF PRACTICE

### LIBRARY

On April 5, 1974, the Commission published for comment by interested persons a proposed change in Rule 2(e)(7) of its Rules of Practice (Rel. 33-5477). The amended rule proposed at that time would have provided that proceedings brought under Rule 2(e) against professionals appearing and practicing before the Commission be public unless the Commission, on its own motion or at the request of a respondent, directed otherwise.

The Commission, after consideration of all comments received in response to its proposal, has determined not to adopt the amendment to the proposed Rule.

Although the Commission is withdrawing its prior proposal, it nevertheless wishes to apprise members of the professions who practice before it that the Commission is not suggesting that all disciplinary proceedings under Rule 2(e) will be conducted on a private basis in the future. The Commission believes that there are circumstances which warrant the institution of public proceedings in the interest of investors, and it believes that the provisions of existing Rule 2(e)(7) provide it with ample discretion to institute public disciplinary proceedings under Rule 2(e) when the Commission deems it to be in the public interest to do so.

In addition, hereafter in any disciplinary proceeding under Rule 2(e) the Commission will publish any order of its administrative law judge finding a basis for the imposition of a sanction against a professional.

The Commission has instructed its staff that all disciplinary proceedings should be expeditiously conducted so that the issues of professional conduct involved can be resolved as promptly as possible under all the circumstances. If the Commission perceives that private proceedings are being delayed unreasonably, the Commission may determine that the public interest will be better served by public proceedings. (Rel. 33-5572)

## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

### NOTICE OF CORRESPONDENCE REGARDING A DELAY IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PHASE II OF THE CONSOLIDATED TAPE

The SEC announced that, in response to a letter from the Consolidated Tape Association (CTA), dated February 19, 1975, it has determined, based upon the representations contained in that letter, not to raise any objection to the delay in full implementation of Phase II of the consolidated transaction reporting system contemplated by the joint industry plan declared effective under Securities Exchange Act Rule 17a-15 by February 21, 1975. ## DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

### ELLIOT, SAM AND LEONARD FRANK BARRED

The Commission has barred Elliot Frank, of Merrick, New York, Sam Frank, of Woodmere, and Leonard Frank, of Far Rockaway, who were officers of a broker-dealer for which a trustee was appointed under the Securities Investor Protection Act, from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser or investment company. Elliot and Sam Frank, after five years, and Leonard Frank, after two years, may apply for permission to become so associated in a non-supervisory and non-proprietary capacity.

The sanctions were based on findings that respondents delivered the common stock of Kolpak Industries, Inc. without the stock being accompanied or preceded by a prospectus meeting specified requirements; purchased Kolpak stock while participating in the distribution of the stock; and manipulated the market for Kolpak stock, effecting transactions designed to influence artificially the market and create a false and misleading appearance of an active market. It was further found that they made material misstatements concerning the manner and method of distribution of Kolpak stock, the existence of a bona fide independent market for it, guarantees against losses on purchases of the stock, the amount of such stock available for sale, and prospective increases in its price. It was also found that respondents aided and abetted violations of the net capital, recordkeeping and credit extension provisions of the securities laws, and were enjoined, with their consent, from further violations of the net capital provisions.

The order was based on offers of settlement in which the respondents, without admitting or denying any violations, consented to the findings and sanctions imposed. (Rel. 34-11254)

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## COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

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### ROBERT DANIEL HILL, OTHERS SENTENCED

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on February 10 U.S. District Court Judge Manuel L. Real sentenced Robert Daniel Hill, Richard Loy Gray, and Charles Ray Gish to three years in prison. The sentences imposed on Gish and Gray were suspended and these defendants were ordered to serve 90 days in a jail type institution on consecutive weekends. Subsequent to serving the 90 days, Gish and Gray were ordered to donate four hours per week to a legal aid society for the remainder of the three-year sentence. All three defendants will be on five-year probation following their prison terms. Hill, Gish, and Gray had been convicted on January 22, 1975, by a Federal jury in Los Angeles of conspiracy, mail fraud, and securities fraud. Count one of the indictment charged that Hill, Gray, and Gish conspired to operate International Commodities Exchange, Inc., (ICE) in violation of the mail, wire, and securities fraud statutes. Under the fraudulent scheme investors were sold options on non-regulated commodities, Live Beef Forward Purchase Contracts and unregistered shares of stock in The First Trading Company. The fraudulent misrepresentations made include: (1) that each option sold by ICE was backed by a futures contract which ICE purchased through brokerage firms; (2) The First Trading Company would become a conglomerate of other companies; (3) that the stock was free trading; (4) that the stock would be publicly traded; and (5) that the issuance of shares had been approved by the Securities and Exchange Commission. All three defendants were found guilty of the conspiracy. Hill was convicted on all nine substantive violations which charged mail, wire, and securities fraud in the sale of options on non-regulated commodities, Live Beef Forward Purchase Contracts and unregistered securities. Gish was convicted on five substantive violations of the mail fraud statute in the sale of Live Beef Forward Purchase Contracts and on two substantive violations of securities fraud in the sale of unregistered stock in The First Trading Company. Gray was convicted of a substantive violation of the mail fraud statute in the sale of non-regulated commodity options. (U.S. v. Robert Daniel Hill, Richard L. Gray, and Charles Gish, Central Dist. of Cal., CR-74-1737-R). (LR-6766)

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### UTAH POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 24 to request a hearing on a proposal by Utah Power & Light Company, a registered holding company and an electric utility company, that it issue and sell 200,000 shares of its common stock under a dividend reinvestment plan. ## NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 31 to request a hearing on a proposal of New England Electric System, a registered holding company, to issue and sell up to 2,500,000 shares of common stock in a negotiated public underwriting. (Rel. 35-18834 - March 3)

## CONNECTICUT YANKEE ATOMIC POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Connecticut Yankee Atomic Power Company, subsidiary of Northeast Utilities and of New England Electric System, to issue and sell short-term notes to banks and/or commercial paper to a dealer in commercial paper in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$30 million outstanding at any one time. ## THE SOUTHERN COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing The Southern Company, a registered holding company to amend its certificate of incorporation to increase the authorized number of shares of common stock from 110 million to 150 million, par value \$5 per share.
