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DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

DOMINIC BASSANI BARRED; ARNOLD KAPLAN SUSPENDED

The Commission has barred Dominic Bassani, of Ramsey, New Jersey, who was a salesman for Kordich, Victor & Neufeld, formerly a registered broker-dealer, from association with any broker-dealer, and suspended Arnold Kaplan, of Valley Stream, New York, who was the cashier and bookkeeper for the firm, from association with any broker-dealer for a period of 6 months, and from any supervisory position in the securities industry for a period of 12 months -- with the two suspensions to run concurrently. After four years, Bassani may apply to the Commission for re-entry into the securities business in a non-supervisory position.

The sanctions were based on findings that, during the period from about January 1969 in Bassani's case, and January 1970 in Kaplan's, through January 1973, Bassani and Kaplan violated antifraud and antimanipulative provisions of the securities laws in seven underwritings. Bassani and Kaplan withheld substantial portions of the offerings from public sale by purchasing them through nominee accounts, subsequently sold the withheld securities for excessive profits, and failed to disclose such activities to purchasers.

The Commission's action was based on offers of settlement in which Bassani and Kaplan, without admitting or denying any violations of the securities laws, consented to the above findings and the indicated sanctions. (Rel. 34-11302)

DISQUALIFICATION OF GERALD H. CAHILL FROM COMMISSION PRACTICE FINAL

The suspension of Gerald H. Cahill, a New York City attorney, from appearance or practice before the Commission has become permanent.

In December 1974, the Commission temporarily suspended Cahill from practice before it on the basis of an injunction entered against him by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York. That injunction, which was entered with Cahill's consent and without his admitting or denying the Commission's charges against him, permanently enjoined Cahill from aiding and abetting violations of net capital and record-keeping provisions of the securities laws (SEC v. Scherl, Egener & Bassuk, Inc., et al). Cahill did not petition to lift the suspension within the required time, and it therefore became permanent. (Rel. 34-11304)

PROCEEDINGS AGAINST PAUL G. KAUS DISMISSED

Proceedings under the Securities Exchange and Securities Investor Protection Acts against Paul G. Kaus of Bloomington, Minnesota, have been dismissed. Kaus was formerly a vice-president of a brokerage firm that became insolvent and for which a trustee was appointed under the Securities Investor Protection Act. However, it now appears that Kaus had no responsibility for either the firm's finances or its records. (Rel. 34-11305)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

COMPLAINT NAMES LIFE SCIENCES, INC.

The SEC announced the filing of a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia on March 25 seeking a court order directing Life Sciences, Inc. (Life Sciences), New York, New York, to comply with the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeking a permanent injunction against further such violations.

According to the Commission's complaint against Life Sciences, the company failed to file with the Commission in proper form its annual report on Form 10-K for its fiscal

year ended May 31, 1974, and its quarterly reports on Form 10-Q for the quarters ended February 28, 1974, August 31, 1974 and November 30, 1974. (SEC v. Life Sciences, Inc., U.S.D.C. D.C.). (LR-6801)
