CORPORATE INFORMATION SHOULD BE MADE MORE WIDELY AVAILABLE, CASEY SAYS

In his speech at the annual meeting of the American Society of Corporate Secretaries in Vancouver, British Columbia, Chairman Casey said the Commission has been discussing ways to bring to the attention of shareholders items which appear in Form 10K (a report companies are required to file with the SEC), but which may not appear in a company's annual report. He pointed out the possibility of identifying items not covered in the annual report by an asterisk in the 10K report, and mentioned also that the Commission has toyed with the idea of requiring that the annual report indicate what items are available in Form 10K. He stressed the obligation of corporations to deal evenly with large and small shareholders if they disclose new developments that have material significance on decisions to buy or sell stock. "The task before us now is to see that as information on corporate performance is analyzed and evaluated, the conclusions are made more widely and evenly available to all investors."

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTION

JOSEPH E. FORAKER PLEADS GUILTY. The SEC Seattle Regional Office announced June 1 that Joseph E. Foraker, of Reseda, Calif. (former Las Vegas, Nev. stockbroker) pleaded guilty to one count of an indictment charging the sale of unregistered securities. Foraker is continued on a \$5,000 bond pending completion of the pre-sentence report by the Federal Probation Office, of Spokane, Wash. (LR-5415)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASE

PITTSBURGH COKE & CHEMICAL COMPANY. The SEC has issued a notice giving interested persons until June 28 to request a hearing upon an application of The Hillman Company, a Pennsylvania corporation, for an order exempting from certain provisions of the Act a proposed merger of Pittsburgh Coke & Chemical Company, a Wilmington, Delaware, closed-end non-diversified investment company, into Pittsburgh-Wilmington, Inc., a Delaware corporation. The amended application sets forth certain changes in the formula for computing the net asset value of the common stock of Pittsburgh Coke. The revised formula arose out of an agreement between certain interested persons who requested a hearing on the original application (Rel. IC-6907) and The Hillman Company. The amended application states that as a result of the revised formula the value per share of Pittsburgh Coke common stock was \$150.20 as of the close of business on May 22, 1972. The agreement also provides for a payment by the Hillman Company of \$75,000 to the law firm which represented the interested persons. The amended application states that such payment will not reduce the amount payable to Pittsburgh Coke stockholders as determined by the formula. (Rel. IC-7216)
