8 threat and in the negative with respect to Germany.

9 MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Williamson.

10 COMMISSIONER WILLIAMSON: I reach an
11 affirmative determination on the basis of threat with
12 respect to both countries.

13 MS. ABBOTT: Madam Chairman, the Commission
14 has reached affirmative determinations in these
