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Introduction

Shipper,

Accurately routing freight is important not only to ensure the safety of US highways, railways, waterways, and airways, but also to ensure taxpayer dollars are being used wisely. Various classes of freight require different levels of Transportation Protective Services (TPS). If the level of TPS applied to a class of freight is insufficient, then the freight is moving unsafely. If the level of TPS applied to a class of freight is excessive, then the freight is moving at an unnecessarily high cost. This document includes several tools to assist in the proper routing of Arms, Ammunition, and Explosives (AA&E) freight, and other Sensitive and Classified shipments.

The following items are included in this document:

Contact Information (Pg 5): SDDC G9, Business Services—the section that reviews and verifies AA&E freight routings (SDG3 in GFM). When calling with general freight routing **questions, please call the Freight Routing Assistance Line (618-220-6359 or DSN 770-6359)**. If you need further or specific subject matter assistance, please contact the transportation technicians or the appropriate policy or contract subject matter experts.

Security Risk Codes Table (Pg 30): (Table 205-7 in the DTR). A list of Controlled Inventory Item Codes/Security Risk Codes (CIIC/SRC) and their corresponding TPS. Use this table to determine your TPS using the CIIC codes associated with your freight.
Equipment Codes (Pg 9): A list of codes corresponding to different freight-hauling equipment types (Conveyances). Use this list to select the piece of equipment best suited for hauling your freight.

Commodity Code Table (Pg 13): A list of National Motor Freight Classification Codes (NMFC) and the classes of freight that fall under these codes. NMFCs are used in the Transportation Service Providers' (TSP) tenders to advertise the classes of freight they can haul. Using the correct NMFC ensures you get the correct list of TSPs.

Accessorial Services Chart (Pg 20): A list of Accessorial Services and TPS offered by the TSPs. Use this list to select the correct Accessorial Services and level of TPS for your routing.

SDDC Customer Advisories (Pg 23): These advisories list various updates to transportation regulations. The rules of transportation are always changing—what is true today may not be true tomorrow—and these advisories are the best way to stay abreast of those changes. Customer Advisories link:

Federal Logistics Data (FEDLOG): Based on certain search criteria, such as an item's National Stock Number (NSN), FEDLOG can return an item's CIIC and NMFC, along with other item specific information. Domestic Transportation Rules Publications: The two most useful publications for routing AA&E freight are the <u>Military Freight Traffic Unified Rules Publication (MFTURP-1)</u>, the regulation that governs motor carriers and their responsibilities as they move DoD cargo, and the <u>Defense</u> <u>Transportation Regulation (DTR) 4500.9-R, Part II, Chapter 205</u>, the regulation that governs shipper movements of sensitive cargo and AA&E. Bottom Line up Front

Whether you use CMOS or FAST (GFM) to create your AA&E and Classified shipments, the basic process is the same.

- 1. Determine what you are shipping and the proper commodity code
- 2. Determine the most efficient conveyance (type of truck) for your shipment
- 3. Obtain National Stock Numbers (NSN) if possible
- 4. Check the NSN in FEDLOG or WEBFLIS for the proper Controlled Inventory Item Code (CIIC)
- 5. Using the CIIC, check the DTR table 205-7 to determine the proper level of Transportation Protective Service (TPS) required (Be sure to check the footnotes). It is also recommended to review the applicable paragraph to ensure shipments processed conform to the detail within the DTR, CH 205.
- 6. Enter the shipment in your automated shipping system (FAST/CMOS)
- 7. If the shipment is hazardous or requires TPS, it will be routed to SDDC for verification and approval
- 8. Receive your verified carrier list from SDDC
- 9. Call the carriers and ship your cargo

Top Error Quick Fixes:

- 1. **TPS Errors -** Use the Table 205-7, Transportation Protective Services Chart. The current version of the Ch. 205, can be found at: <u>http://www.transcom.mil/j5/pt/dtr_part_ii.cfm</u>
 - (a) Under Cargo Movement, scroll down to and select "Chapters 201-213"
 - (b) Scroll down to Chapter 205 TPS SHIPMENTS
- 2. **SRC/CIIC Errors -** Plug the item's NSN/NIIN into FEDLOG or WEBFLIS to get the items' SRC/CIIC.

- 3. **NMFC Errors -** Plug the item's NSN/NIIN into FEDLOG or WEBFLIS to get the item's NMFC

Common Errors and Fixes

- 1. If you are using CIS and your shipment is traveling **over 150 miles**, you need to have an extra driver (EXD) on the request. *DTR, Ch 205, table 205-7*
- 2. If there is something you need to explain in your shipment (inability to enter the correct CIIC code, fact that an air shipment was processed via override, etc...) please put a note for us in the **"SDG3 Remarks"** section of your request. This will keep us from calling you to find out the required information.
- 3. **Trailer Tracking Service (DCS)** is only required for AA&E shipments with a SRC of I-IV that are shipping in closed box vans. *DTR, Ch 205, page 31: DTR reads as follows:*

"Trailer Tracking Service (DCS). DCS augments the SNS used with the DTTS, designed to track the actual trailers carrying the material being shipped, and receive immediate alerts if the trailer is untethered (unhooked) from the power unit or if the box van trailer door is opened while in-transit. It is used for all SRC I-IV, closed box van shipments requiring SNS. DCS may also be applied to other sensitive, classified and TPS shipments as requested by the shipper. The purpose of DCS is to provide DTTS with periodic trailer position location reports. DCS is a value-added service that compliments SNS and is managed by the DTTS. Installations/activities may establish DTTS accounts to monitor inbound and outbound shipments by contacting the DTTS Program Management Office, 800-826-0794. DCS is not applicable to air, barge, pipeline, USPS and BPA shipments.

- a. Shippers are required to request DCS service when all three of the following conditions are met:
 - (1) Shipment is SRC I, II, III or IV.
 - (2) Shipment requires SNS.
 - (3) Shipment requires closed box van."

- 4. Ensure your commodity codes for explosives are correct. 064300 is the main code, along with 01, 02, or 03 as the last two digits. See the chart on page 13 of this document.
- 5. If you are having issues with your shipping system (GFM/CMOS) you need to contact the help desk for your particular system. We do not use CMOS or FAST here in the routing section. The contact information is:

- 6. Please attempt to utilize your shipping system (CMOS/FAST) for all shipments. If you are having system issues, please contact the appropriate help desk. As a last resort, you can submit a manual 1085 to SDDC. These take time to process, so ensure you have exhausted all options at getting your system fixed prior to submitting a 1085. If you need to submit, ensure it is filled out completely, inaccurate or insufficient data only prolongs the process. The email address is on the contacts page of this document.
- 7. If you process an air shipment requiring a TPS via Over-ride, put a remark in the "SDG3 Remarks" block letting us know you did this. This saves us from calling you and asking if you did an Over-ride.

Transportation Protective Services (TPS) Definitions:

The following are basic descriptions of the most commonly used Transportation Protective and Accessorial Services. For the full description, see the DTR Part II, Chapter 205, Section O, "TPS/ACCESSORIAL DESCRIPTIONS AND STANDARDS."

Less Secure 675		<i>Signature and Tally Record Service</i> : Requires the use of a DD1907 or TSP's electronic signature service/tracing of a shipment. Commonly used for high vale or pilferable items.
	CIS	<i>Constant Surveillance and Custody Service:</i> Requires constant surveillance and custody of a shipment by a qualified TSP. Shipper must request extra driver (EXD) for shipments exceeding 150 miles.
	Dual Driver Protective Service: Requires continuous attendance and surveillance of a shipment by a qualified driver. Four hour stop maxin before investigation.	
		<i>Protective Security Service:</i> Requires continuous attendance and surveillance of a shipment by two qualified drivers. Two hour stops maximum before investigation.
More Secure	SEV	<i>Security Escort Vehicle</i> : Escort vehicles provide enhanced in-transit highway safety and security surveillance for shipments of AA&E and Sensitive items with CIIC codes 1, 5, & 6 <i>ONLY</i> . (SRC I)

SNS	<i>Satellite Motor Surveillance:</i> SNS is used for PSS and DDP shipments. Provides SDDC DTTS periodic location reports, in transit status reports, and electronic notification of emergency situations.
EXP	<i>Expedited Service:</i> Shippers can request this service to guarantee delivery before the Standard Transit Time (DTR Ch 202)
EXC	<i>Exclusive Use:</i> EXC requires the TSP to provide the entire motor vehicle or separate cargo carrying vehicle (trailer, dromedary, etc) exclusively to the transportation of the shipment without breaking seals or trans-loading of cargo.
EXD	<i>Extra Driver:</i> EXD is used in conjunction with CIS for shipments over 150 miles.
DCS	<i>Trailer Tracking Service:</i> DCS augments SNS. It is used exclusively with closed box vans (AV1, AV2, AV3, etc). Monitors the tethering of the trailer and door open status. For more info, see the Customer Advisory in this document

Subject: Use of the GSA BPA to execute DOD small arms shipments.

Purpose: <u>To inform all Department of Defense (DOD) shippers of the</u> <u>expanded use of General Services Administration (GSA) Blanket</u> <u>Purchase Agreement (BPA) Domestic Express Small Package Service</u> (DESPS) Contract Carriers to execute DOD small arms shipments.

Guidance: This Customer Advisory (CA) will act as interim guidance to the Defense Transportation Regulation (DTR) Part II, Cargo Movement, and waiver to the requirements in the DOD 5100.76M, Physical Security of Conventional Arms, Ammunition and Explosives, until the DTR and 5100.76M can be updated with this policy and procedural guidance.

Use of the BPA program will provide enhanced protection, real time tracking, intransit visibility, and increased velocity to support mission requirements capabilities.

The following instructions will be strictly adhered to and act as an addendum to DTR Part II, Chapter 205, Paragraph G.8.d, until the DTR is revised.

1. The following shipping requirements and restrictions shall be strictly adhered to:

a. <u>Under no circumstances will the DOD approved BPA Transportation</u> <u>Service Providers (TSP) be used to ship weapons, major subassemblies,</u> <u>or major parts (silencers, mufflers, scopes, and noise suppression</u> <u>devices) to Air Mobility Command (AMC) aerial ports for onward</u>

movement to OCONUS locations. Please see Table 205-7 in the DTR, CH. 205, for Transportation Protective Service (TPS) requirements when shipping those items to an AMC aerial port.

b. <u>Next Day Delivery is mandatory and will be ordered and utilized for all shipments.</u>

c. Shipments will be shipped and received from any consignee within CONUS (including Alaska, Hawaii and Puerto Rico).

d. <u>Small quantities of 15 or fewer Security Risk Category (SRC) II and</u> <u>SRC IV (excludes SRC III) small arms weapons, weapons parts (CIIC 7</u> <u>& N), barrels and major subassemblies (including silencers, mufflers, scopes and noise suppression devices) are authorized. Component items of .50 cal weapons are authorized to be shipped In Accordance With (IAW) this program. Small arms weapons include both SRC II and SRC IV small arms.</u> NOTE: .50 cal machine guns will NOT be shipped as a part of this program, unless Military Operational Necessity is authorized, as a minimum, at the Field Commander, Squadron Commander, or Designated Authority level.

e. Shipments of more than 15 small arms will be shipped in accordance with DTR, Part II, Chapter 205.

f. Shipments will be accepted under FPCON ALPHA and FPCON BRAVO

only. Any shipments already in transit during an elevation to FPCON CHARLIE or higher will be delivered to destination and secured.

g. Any shipment not delivered by the Required Delivery Date (RDD), or reported lost or misdirected, will be reported by the origin and/or destination TOs as prescribed in DOD 5100.76M and DTR. "For Air Force shipments also reference AFI 24-203, Chapter 5 for specific transportation reporting requirements".

2. The origin Transportation Officer (TO) will:

a. Contact destination activity prior to releasing the package to the DOD BPA carrier and verify the ability of the destination activity to receive next day delivery of the shipment.

b. Conduct positive advance shipment planning IAW DTR, Part II, Chapter 205, paragraph C.2, to ensure secure delivery to destination.

c. Consign OCONUS originating transshipments through the AMC aerial ports to the destination installation's central receiving facility, as identified in the Transportation Facilities Guide (TFG).

d. Verify serial numbers to maintain accountability, IAW DOD 5100.76M.

e. Ensure each small arms requisition is double wrapped, prepared for shipment, packaged and sealed in ways that minimize risk of accidental exposure or undetected deliberate compromise in accordance with MIL STD 129 and MIL STD 2073-1. Shipments will be packaged in accordance with applicable Special Packaging Instructions.

f. Shipping documents (DD Form 1348-1 DOD Single Line Item Release/Receipt Document or the DD Form 1149, Requisition and Invoice/Shipping Document) will be placed in inner receptacle and all markings not applicable to the shipment on outside shipping container will be obliterated. The container shall not bear classification markings or other unusual marks that invite special attention that the contents are weapons.

g. Requisitions must be shipped to a single consignee. Breaking a requisition of 16 or more arms into multiple packages/shipments in order to utilize this shipping methodology is prohibited.

h. No more than one shipment requisition will be sent per conveyance/carrier to destination consignee, per day.

i. Arms and compatible ammunition will be shipped on a separate conveyance.

j. Complete and forward an electronically transmitted Report of Shipment (REPSHIP) to destination IAW DTR Part II Chapter 205.

k. Verify shipment has electronic signature from receiving activity and proof of delivery/receipt within the receiving activity's normal operating hours.

3. The Destination TO will:

a. Upon receipt of verbal advance shipment notification and REPSHIP on inbound weapons via the selected DOD BPA carrier, immediately coordinate with the ultimate consignee (i.e. Security Forces), Receiving Unit or Installation

Supply to arrange immediate pickup and signature of the weapons to facilitate storage in locked and secure holding area or base armory.

b. Based on advance shipment notification, ensure receipt inspection is expedited. If a discrepancy is noted, the destination TO will immediately initiate a Transportation Discrepancy Report (TDR).

4. It is imperative that shipments from OCONUS activities transiting AMC aerial ports must include, at a minimum, National Stock Number and destination POC information level detail on the Transportation Control Movement Document (TCMD) to facilitate onward CONUS movement. Absence of this level of detail will delay onward movement to final destination. AMC aerial ports will not transship weapons from OCONUS installations until confirmation is made with destination that they can be receipted for.

Freight Routing Exceptions

The information below is a summary of the exceptions we encounter most. For more in- depth information, reference paragraph G in the DTR, Chapter 205.

Ammunition and Explosives (A&E)

1. 1.4 FAK 675 Exception (MFTRP1C-R, Item115.6) (applies to 1.4 ammo or explosives):

a. Shipments of CIIC 4, 7, U, or P, 1.4 up to 1,001 lbs can go FAK w/675 service

b. To submit an FAK/675 shipment:

- (1) Use NMFC 999913 (06430003 only applies when 1.4 is over 1001 Lbs, DDP/SNS)
- (2) Use CIIC "U" (in order to circumvent GFM's checks)
- (3) Only need to select "675" for services
- c. 1.4 must still be compatible with other HAZMAT
- d. Shipper needs to let carrier know when booking 1.4 is eligible to go FAK

2. 1.4 BPA Exception:

- a. 150 lbs or less of UNCLASSIFIED HC/Div 1.4, 1.5, 1.6 ammo up to and including .50 caliber ammo (with no explosive filled projectiles) (CIIC 4,7,P, U) can go BPA Limitations:
 - (1) HC/Div 1.1, 1.2, and 1.3 A&E prohibited.
 - (2) US Army is prohibited from shipping .50 caliber ammo.
 - (3) Ammo must be packed in unit packages of 4,000 rounds or fewer and each package must not exceed 150 lbs.
 - (4) HC/Div 1.4 ammo classified (SECRET/CONFIDENTIAL) is prohibited.
- b. HC/Div 1.4 explosives not considered small arms ammo (e.g., detonators/blasting caps, fuzes, signaling devices, smoke grenades) are prohibited.
- c. List of BPA carriers: <u>https://private.amc.af.mil/A4/express/domexpress/</u>.

Small Arms

3. BPA - Shipment of 15 or fewer Small Arms:

- a. Small arms are weapons that do not fire a round greater than .50 caliber and/or does not fire fully automatic.
- b. SRC II and SRC IV small arms weapons, weapons parts (CIIC 7 and N), barrels and major subassemblies (including silencers, mufflers, scopes, and noise suppression devices) are authorized.

NOTE: .50 cal machine guns will not be shipped as a part of this program unless Military Operational Necessity is authorized.

c. Shipments of 150 lbs or less will be shipped and received from any consignee within CONUS (including Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico).
 NOTE: For Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico, aggregate weight of 300 lbs is authorized.

4. USPS – Shipment of 15 or fewer Small Arms:

- a. Small arms are weapons that do not fire a round greater than .50 caliber and/or does not fire fully automatic.
- b. For CONUS to CONUS shipments, CIS alternative is USPS Registered Mail[™] (Designated Person/Return Receipt Requested) overnight service when the size and weight of the shipment meets USPS restrictions (70 lbs, girth does not exceed 108"). Shipments must be sent via USPS Registered Mail, Return Receipt Requested, if initiated by a FEDSTRIP/MILSTRIP document, or on a DD Form 250 or DD Form 1149.

Classified (SECRET/CONFIDENTIAL/NWRM) Shipments

5. BPA:

- a. 150 Lbs or less can go BPA (300 lbs for Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico)
- b. Classified Communication Security Information, NATO, and foreign government information is not eligible.
- c. Shipments which are both Classified and Hazardous are prohibited.
- d. The shipment must be given to the TSP for next-day delivery. Classified shipments cannot be tendered unless next day service can be provided by the TSP.
- e. The delivery address must be a CONUS DOD activity or a CONUS DODapproved contractor location, to include Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico. Private residences, hotels/motels, Post Office boxes are not authorized delivery addresses.
- f. Do not use this method to move classified shipments to an AMC APOE for onward channel airlift.

6. USPS:

a. Can go USPS Registered Mail based upon size and weight restrictions (70 lbs, girth does not exceed 108"). Shipments must be sent via USPS Registered Mail, Return Receipt Requested, if initiated by a FEDSTRIP/MILSTRIP document, or on a DD Form 250 or DD Form 1149.

Protected and Sensitive Shipments

7. Night Vision Devices:

a. 15 or fewer Night Vision Devices can go BPA.

8. Armored Vehicles:

a. (LAV-AD) Avengers & M2 Bradley (IFV):

 Avengers and Bradleys shipped with mountable weapons or SECRET/classified components require a TPS dependent upon the SRC of the shipments. For Avengers and Bradleys shipped with SRC I weapons or components PSS, SEV, SNS, and EXC are required. For SRC II, PSS, SNS and EXC are required; for shipments of SECRET material (CIIC S)

shipments, PSS, SNS and EXC are required. RIS is required for rail movement. All armored vehicles with battle damage must be shipped tarped.

EXCEPTION: Avengers and Bradleys completely stripped of all weapon components (e.g., crew-served weapons, turrets, or classified, sensitive items contained on the Avenger and Bradley at the time of movement) and the TO can verify and certify in writing that no weapons or classified, sensitive items are contained with the shipment, then these vehicles are subject to negotiation or spot bid. CIS is required for the motor movement. Shippers must request an extra driver (EXD) when distance exceeds 150 miles and GSS for rail movement.

b. Stryker Armored Fighting Vehicle

(1) Strykers: The Project Manager of the Brigade Combat Team, US Army Tank-automotive and Armaments Command (TACOM) assigned Strykers SRC III. Strykers with weapon components, classified CONFIDENTIAL or sensitive classified items requires DDP and SNS services for motor movement and RIS for rail movement. All armored vehicles with battle damage must be shipped tarped.

EXCEPTION: Strykers completely stripped of all weapon components (e.g., crew-served weapons, or sensitive items contained on the Stryker at the time of movement) and the TO can confirm and certify in writing that no weapons or sensitive items are contained with the shipment, then 675 is required for the motor movement. GSS is required for the rail movements. Certification must be attached to the BL.

c. M1 Abrams Tank

M1-series Abrams Tanks: The TACOM Special Program Office requires PSS, SNS, and EXC for shipments of M1-series Abrams tanks with turrets attached. Turrets by themselves are SECRET and must be shipped with PSS, SNS, and EXC for motor movement and RIS for rail movement. All armored vehicles with battle damage must be shipped tarped.
 EXCEPTION: M1-series Abrams tanks completely stripped of all weapon components (e.g., crew-served weapons, sensitive equipment Items such as fire control equipment or materials and without turrets); the TO must verify and certify in writing that no turrets are contained with the shipment; and the TO must attach the signed certification to the BL; then, the M1-series Abrams tanks are subject to negotiation or spot bid, CIS is required for the motor movement. Shippers must request an extra driver

(EXD) when distance exceeds 150 miles. GSS is required for the rail movements.

NOTE: The TACOM item manager has declassified the ABRAMS tank reactive tiles (skirts). Skirts may be shipped by any mode of transportation.

d. Mine Resistant Ambush Protected (MRAP) Vehicle:

(1) MRAP Armored Vehicles. MRAP vehicles moving via commercial motor carriers are required to be shipped with TPS DDP and SNS when shipped in the CONUS. When shipping via commercial rail TSPs, RIS is required. MRAPs shipped with Government Furnished Equipment or Electronic Countermeasures that are classified SECRET, motor TPS will be increased to PSS, EXC, and SNS. For large volume shipments of more than 25 truck/car loads, waivers for these TPS requirements must have prior approval through SDDC, Deputy, Global Distribution Domestic (AMSSD-SBD). This TPS requirement is subject to change if additional sensitive equipment is installed in/on MRAP vehicles. EXCEPTION: If the vehicles are completely stripped of all sensitive

EXCEPTION: If the vehicles are completely stripped of all sensitive and/or classified items and is certified in writing by the TO. CIS is required for the motor movement. Shippers must request an extra driver (EXD) when distance exceeds 150 miles and GSS for rail movement.

- 38. For PSS shipments, when motor transport service or intermodal movements is also provided in connection with air, rail, or water shipments, CIS procedures will apply for the motor segment of the move.
- 39. For DDP/SNS shipments, when motor transport service or intermodal movements is also provided in connection with air, rail, or water shipments, CIS procedures will apply for the motor segment of the move.
- 40. Navy Unclassified Naval Nuclear Propulsion Information (U-NNPI) material -- Navy material identified with Special Material Identification Code X1, X2, X3, X4, X5 or X6 may contain unclassified Naval Nuclear Propulsion Information (U-NNPI). UNCLASSIFIED Navy material containing U-NNPI, as defined in OPNAVINST N9210.3, is not subject to CIS or SNS requirements. Below is specific shipping guidance for Navy shipments consisting of UNCLASSIFIED NNPI material:
 - a. For CONUS shipments of Navy material containing U-NNPI, DOD BPA, or commercial carrier transport is authorized.
 - b. For OCONUS shipments of Navy material containing U-NNPI use AMC airlift, or WWX, and if the foregoing cannot satisfy the RDD, commercial air counter-to-counter is authorized for shipments of 300 lbs or less. For OCONUS shipments of UNCLASSIFIED Navy material containing U-NNPI in excess of 300 lbs, use AMC for channel airlift transport. If AMC-TACC is unable to provide transport or meet RDD, contact the Naval Operational Logistics Support Center at nolsc_air_clearance@navy.mil which will assist in providing air clearance and coordination with AMC to obtain an approved commercial tender of service contact number (757 443-5434 or DSN 646-5434).
- 41. Trailer Tracking Service (DCS). DCS is required for all SRC I-IV closed box van shipments requiring SNS. DCS may also be applied to other sensitive, classified, and TPS shipments as requested by the shipper. See Para 0.15 for further guidance.
- 42. Reserved for future use.
