High temperatures at Northerly Island in downtown Chicago reached 92 on July 15th, 94 on July 16th and 95 on July 17th. The peak heat index reached 99 on July 15th, 104 on July 16th and 113 on July 17th. The heat index was 100 degrees or higher for 11 hours from Noon to 11 pm at Northerly Island on July 17th. The low temperatures remained in the middle to upper 70s downtown during this period. At Ohare Airport, the high temperature reached 97 on July 15th, 94 on July 16th and 95 on July 17th. The peak heat index reached 95 on July 15th, 98 on July 19th and 108 on July 17th. Nine people died due to heat related problems.

Storm total rainfall of 6.13 inches was reported on the west side of Joliet. Approximately 30 homes and businesses suffered basement flooding. Center Street Ramps to Interstate 80 were closed with four feet of standing water. Cars were stranded in 4 to 5 feet of water under the viaduct on Route 30 east of Briggs Street. Pavement buckled under the force of the flood waters at Western and Cass Avenues. Raynor and Ingallis were closed with 12 to 16 inches of water. The intersection of Larkin and Jefferson closed with 2 to 3 feet of water. Springfield and Glenwood Streets had 10 to 12 inches of water. The second heat wave of the summer developed during the end of July and continued into early August. High temperatures at Northerly Island in downtown Chicago reached 88 on July 28th, 93 on July 29th, 90 on July 30th and 98 on July 31st. The peak heat index at Northerly Island reached 100 on July 28th, 105 on July 29th, 106 on July 30th, and 116 on July 31st. The low temperature on the morning of July 21st was only 81. At Ohare Airport, the high temperature reached 93 on July 28th, 94 on July 29th, 90 on July 30th and 99 on July 31st. The peak heat index reached 94 on July 28th, 100 on July 29th, 98 on July 30th and 107 on July 31st. A cold front moved south across Lake Michigan during the late morning and early afternoon of July 30th. This front brought a period of cooler temperatures to northeast Illinois during the afternoon hours. Two people died due to heat related problems through July 31st but additional deaths were reported in early August. See Stormdata, August 2006, Illinois, Northeast.

Strong to severe thunderstorms moved southeast across southern Lake Michigan during the late morning of July 30th. Seven sailboats participating in a race capsized in the high winds and high waves. Fourteen people were pulled from the lake but no injuries were reported. All the boats were eventually towed to shore with no damage reported. Four kayaks were also overturned near Oak Street Beach.
