A strong cold front moved across the great lakes region early on November 30th and became stationary across the Ohio River Valley. This cold front produced a few thunderstorms with some small hail. A winter storm developed over the southern plains and lifted northeast along this stationary front late on November 30th into the morning of December 1st.
