Planning Assumptions

- Event may spread rapidly once reaching U.S.
- Initial wave may last 3 4 months
- 40% of INL work force may be absent for some time
- Certain departments may experience a higher percentage of absenteeism
- Community health care resources will be overloaded
- Broad range of INL Stakeholders will be impacted
- Supplies and services may be unavailable
- Area community services will be impacted



Objectives:

- Reduce transmission of pandemic virus strain among personnel
- Minimize illness among personnel
- Maintain essential operations and services
- Specific responsibilities to some key organizations
- General responsibilities identified to department manager level

- Plan uses COOP approach
- Pandemic Plan is currently draft "stand alone" – eventually tied to COOP or BCP
- Plan is arranged to provide a series of tasks that are tied to WHO phases and national stages
- Employee involvement is critical
