What NIMS is about....

- Common incident management doctrine, practices and principles,
- Use of ICS
- Flexible response operations
- Common terminology for ordering, tracking resources
- Plans for staging and allocating equipment, supplies and assistance
- Effective communications among responders, EOC's and with the public





FEDERAL IMPLEMENTATION

- On September 9, 2004, the Secretary of Homeland Security issued a Memorandum to Federal Departments and Agencies outlining the first steps for successful implementation.
 - These steps included:
 - Identifying existing or anticipated FY2005 Federal preparedness assistance programs;
 - Submitting a plan for the adoption and implementation of NIMS;
 and
 - Incorporating NIMS into Emergency Operations Plans.

Metrics

- The FY 2007 NIMS Implementation Metrics provides a performance based system of measurement for tracking and reporting the status of NIMS implementation,
- Beginning in FY 2007, The IMSD will begin coordinating a peer review assistance program consisting of;
 - An online National Incident Management System Compliance Assistance Support Tool (NIMSCAST) for self reporting, and
 - Technical assistance and reporting quarterly during quarterly meetings.

Implementation Activities

FY07 - Federal Departments and Agencies

Formally adopt NIMS within Federal department/agency and encourage formal NIMS adoption as appropriate by external partners (trade associations, private sector partners, contractors, grantees, and vendors) with incident management responsibilities.



Implementation Activities

FY07 – Federal Departments and Agencies

Promote and encourage formal adoption of NIMS to other external partners and appropriate stakeholders other than those with formal or legal agreements with federal agencies to perform incident management roles or duties.







Implementation Activities

FY07 – Federal Departments and Agencies

- Develop a phased NIMS Implementation Plan for each specific department/agency that;
 - •Communicates NIMS implementation requirements to department/agency and appropriate stakeholders,
 - Measures and Monitors NIMS implementation by the department/agency,
 - •Reports department/agency NIMS implementation status on an annual basis to the IMS Division that identifies resources and updates NIMS implementation plans as needed



Implementation Activities

FY07 – Federal Departments and Agencies

- Verify department/agency progress on NIMS implementation activities on an annual basis, to include:
 - •Identifying existing Federal preparedness assistance programs,
 - •Submitting a plan for adopting and implementing the NIMS to the NIC,
 - Identifying and incorporating NIMS into Emergency Operations Plans (EOPs) and all incident management plans.



Implementation Activities

FY07 – Federal Departments and Agencies

Designate a single point of contact (POC) within the department/agency to serve as the principal coordinator for NIMS implementation





Implementation Activities

FY07 – Federal Departments and Agencies

Incorporate measurement of NIMS implementation into existing department/agency audits and reviews of incident management preparedness funding (e.g., grants, future year contracts).
