Emergency Management Program NFPA 1600

- Order:
 - DOE O 151.1C, Comprehensive Emergency Management System

- Guidance:
 - DOE G 151.1-1A, Emergency Management Guide (EMG)

Emergency Management Program NFPA 1600

- Establishes a common set of criteria for disaster/emergency management programs
- Covers (entities):
 - Government at distinct levels (e.g., federal, state/provincial, territorial, tribal, indigenous, and local level);
 - Business and industry;
 - Nongovernmental organizations; and
 - Individual citizens

Emergency Management Program NFPA 1600

- Provides criteria to:
 - Assess current emergency management programs
 - Develop, implement, and maintain aspects for
 - Prevention
 - Mitigation
 - Preparation
 - Response
 - Recovery

Emergency Management Program DOE

- Framework for development, coordination, control, and direction of all emergency planning, preparedness, readiness assurance, response, and recovery actions.
- Effectively integrate planning, preparedness, response, and recovery activities for a comprehensive, allemergency management concept.
- Covers (entities):
 - Facilities/Sites
 - Activities (Transportation)

Emergency Management Program ACTIVITIES

NFPA

 Prevention - Avoids an incident or stops an emergency from occurring

DOE

(No formal activities/plan)

Emergency Management Program ACTIVITIES

NFPA

 Mitigation - Reduces the severity or consequences of an emergency.

DOE

 (No formal activities/plan – Limited use suggested for Hazard Assessment planning efforts)

Emergency Management Program General Assessment Observations

- The comparisons (in the handout version) between NFPA and DOE program criteria do not represent a detailed point-by-point assessment
- In making comparisons, no distinction was made between requirements and guidance
- The interpretations of NFPA criteria are limited by the general nature of the standard and annex information
- While DOE Hazards Survey addresses all hazards, the Hazards Assessment focuses detailed analysis primarily on airborne release of a hazardous material
- An NFPA criterion designated N/A in DOE indicates no explicit reference in DOE O 151.1C or its guidance

NFPA Risk Assessment versus DOE Technical Planning Basis

NFPA Risk Assessment –

- NFPA hazards to be evaluated: Natural Hazards, Human-caused events, and Technological-caused events; DOE focus on Human-caused events, specifically accidental and intentional release of hazardous material
- All identified hazards subject to quantifiable evaluation and impact analysis; DOE requires quantitative analysis focused primarily on <u>airborne release of hazardous material</u>.
- NFPA requires frequency estimates (probabilities), vulnerability estimates, and *RISK* assessments for each identified hazard; DOE does not.
- NFPA requires hazards categorized by relative frequency and severity; DOE Emergency Categorization & Classification categorizes/classifies by severity only.

NFPA Risk Assessment versus DOE Technical Planning Basis

NFPA

- All hazards to be evaluated including Natural Hazards (Geological, Meteorological, Biological), Human-caused events, and Technological-caused events (computer, telecommunications, energy)
- All identified hazards subject to quantifiable evaluation and impact analysis
- Frequency estimates (probabilities), vulnerability estimates, and RISK assessments for each identified hazard
- Hazards categorized by relative frequency and severity

DOE

 Focus on Human-caused events, specifically accidental and intentional release of hazardous material

- Quantitative analysis focused primarily on <u>airborne release of</u> hazardous <u>material</u>
- No similar requirement
- DOE Emergency Categorization & Classification categorizes/ classifies by severity

NFPA Finance & Administration

- Some aspects covered by DOE Program Administration
- Finance emphasis under NFPA because
 - Damage estimates a consideration for declaration of a major emergency or disaster
 - Federal grant funding

- NFPA Program Administration Generally covered by DOE Program Administration, Hazards Survey and Readiness Assurance
- NFPA Mutual Aid/Assistance DOE Offsite Response Interfaces and Program Administration (documentation)
- NFPA Incident Management DOE requirement to conform with NIMS and DOE Emergency Response Organization (ERO)
- NFPA Communications and Warning Essentially covered by DOE Notifications and Communications

- NFPA Operational Procedures Includes procedures associated with DOE Elements:
 - Program Administration (general requirements for procedures to implement the Emergency Plan)
 - Emergency Response Organization (ERO)
 - Consequence Assessment
 - Protective Actions and Reentry
 - Emergency Medical Support
 - Termination and Recovery

- NFPA Facilities DOE Emergency Facilities and Equipment (specifically, EOC and alternate)
- NFPA Training Generally satisfied by DOE Training and Drills
- NFPA Exercises, Evaluations, and Corrective Actions – Covered by DOE Exercises and Readiness Assurance
- NFPA Crisis Communication and Public Information – DOE Emergency Public Information

- NFPA Laws and Authorities DOE Hazards Survey (Identification, but not necessarily implementation)
- NFPA Resource Management and Logistics – Generally covered by DOE Emergency Facilities & Equipment and Program Administration)

- Little or no explicit treatment of these NFPA Elements in DOE emergency management programs:
 - Incident Prevention
 - Mitigation

 - Post-incident analyses, lessons learned, performance evaluations
 - Exercises to test individual elements, interrelated elements, entire plan(s)
 - Corrective Action Program

Emergency Management Program CRISIS COMMUNICATION AND PUBLIC INFORMATION

- Develop procedures to Emergency Public Information disseminate and respond to requests for information, before, during, and after an incident
- Public awareness program where hazard to public
- Procedure to advise public of threats

Emergency Management Program CRISIS COMMUNICATION AND PUBLIC INFORMATION

- Develop and maintain public Emergency Public Information information capability:
 - Central contact for media (JIC)
 - System for gathering, monitoring, and disseminating information
 - Pre-scripted information bulletins
 - Method to coordinate and clear information for release
 - Capability of communicating with special needs population
 - Protective action guidelines
