3. Objective/Purpose: [Informational/Action]:

Determine whether MAFAC wishes to submit comments or information on the Status Review and draft Management Report related to the management and protection of 82 species of coral.

4. Background/Synopsis

As part of our ongoing process to evaluate 82 species of coral from the Caribbean and Pacific for listing under the Endangered Species Act (ESA), NOAA invited public review of two reports, a scientific Status Review Report and a draft Management Report. Our review of these 82 species of corals has been the most complex ESA listing process NOAA Fisheries has undertaken. NOAA will use the additional input to ensure that the best scientific information available will be considered as we develop our 12-month finding in response to a listing petition.

The release of these documents is not a part of the normal rulemaking process – it is an engagement process that allows us to be transparent and open in our decision making. Should NOAA Fisheries determine that a listing is warranted, we will publish a proposed rule in December 2012 for additional public comment.

What Additional Information is NOAA Interested In?

We are particularly interested in receiving information on the following:

- Relevant scientific information collected or produced since the completion of the Status Review Report in 2011, or any relevant scientific information not included in the Report.
- Relevant management information not included in the draft Management Report. •
