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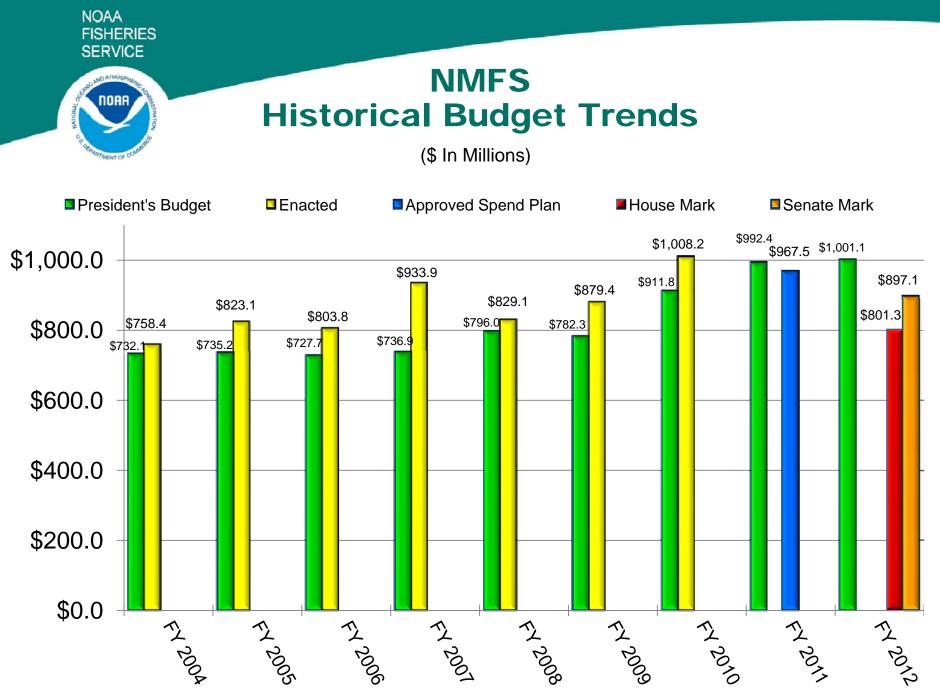

- > Implemented Catch Share Programs
- Created First Integrated Ecosystem Assessment for the California Current
- > Took Action to Combat Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated Fishing and Bycatch of Protected Living Marine Resources
- Reported Lower Levels of Bycatch
- Weak Hooks Technology Used to Protect Non-Target Tuna and Whales
- > Implemented Improved Recreational Catch Estimates
- Completed roll-out of final NOAA National Aquaculture Policy (AQ)





FY 2012 Budget Status



- FY 2012 *President's Budget* provides \$1001.1 M for NMFS + \$33.6 M (3%) increase from the FY 2011 spend plan
- NOAA is operating under a CR through November 18 Continuation of FY 2011 levels minus 1.503%
- The FY 2012 *House Mark* provides \$801.3 M for NMFS - \$166.2 M (17%) decrease from the FY 2011 spend plan
- The FY 2012 Senate Mark provides \$897.1 M for NMFS - \$70.4 M (7%) decrease from the FY 2011 spend plan
