Looking Towards the Future

- Fulfill the President's commitment to science
- Spur the creation of new jobs and industries
- Manage our fisheries and the communities they support for long-term sustainability
- Improve weather forecasting and disaster warnings
- Provide credible information about climate change and its impacts
- Revitalize coastal communities and manage on an ecosystem basis



Stimulus Update

NOAA received \$830 million in ARRA funds

Projects will spur creation of jobs and aid in recovery effort Projects include:

- \$230M: habitat restoration, navigation services, vessel maintenance, and environmental reviews/consultations
- \$430M: construction and repair of NOAA facilities, ships and equipment, improvements for weather forecasting and satellite development
- \$170M: climate modeling activities, including supercomputing procurement and research into climate change

Congress approved the spend plan on May 7, 2009.




2010 NOAA Budget Highlights

NOAA requests a total of \$4,484M, an increase of 2.5% or \$110M over the FY 2009 Omnibus Appropriation

- Reflects our efforts to reallocate resources, identify efficiencies, and ensure accountability
- Supports core mission functions for environmental prediction and stewardship
- Provides key investments to address top management challenges for satellite acquisition and fisheries management
- Provides funds to support climate research, observations, and services
- Includes funding to help improve coastal stewardship and services



FY2008 NOAA Fisheries Service Accomplishments

- Published regulations that would limit ship speed to protect Right whales along the East Coast.
- Issued final guidelines for National Standard 1 for the implementation of Annual Catch Limits (ACLs) and Accountability Measures (AMs) required by MSRA.
- Submitted Report to Congress on the Status of Fisheries in the United States.
- Support the National Fish Habitat Action Plan.
- Finalized the 10-Year Plan for Marine Aquaculture.
- Completed NOAA's largest barrier island project—800 acres of restored habitat at the Chaland Headland site in Louisiana.
- Successfully used cooperative approach to expand fish passage at hydropower dams on the Feather and Saco Rivers—enhancing access for migratory fish to over 100 river miles.
- Assessed the effects of pesticides on 28 listed Pacific salmonids, the first such comprehensive evaluation.



FY 2009 NOAA Fisheries Service Overview

NOAA's FY 2009 budget provides \$879.0 M for NOAA Fisheries Service, a net increase of \$50.0 M or 6 % over the FY 2008 Enacted Budget.

Recognizes fiscal constraints:

- Funds ATBs for labor costs
- Addresses facility issues.
- Corrects some operational deficiencies.
- Improves industry safety
- Supports regulatory/statutory requirements.
- Sustains Gulf of Mexico recovery efforts.

Supports goals of:

- Implementing MSRA provisions
- Limited Access Privilege Programs (LAPPs)
- Cooperative Conservation
- Aquaculture
- Recovering Protected Species
- Habitat restoration



FY 2010 NOAA Fisheries Service Overview

FY 2010 Request provides \$911.8 M for NOAA Fisheries Service:

- —Provides funding for inflation
- —Recognizes fiscal constraints
- —Funds the mandates of the Magnuson-Stevens Reauthorization Act to end overfishing by 2011
- —Provides funds for species recovery grants
- —Increases fisheries survey capabilities
- —Supports an ecosystem approach to management
- —Builds the nation's aquaculture capability

Protected Species Highlights

NOAA requests an increase of \$81.2M for Protected Species Research and Management.

- Endangered Species Act consultations +\$5.6M
- Species Recovery Grants +\$60.0M
- Marine Mammal conservation and recovery +\$5.3M
- Atlantic Salmon +\$3.0M
- Pacific Salmon +\$7.3M



Fisheries Research and Management Highlights

NOAA requests an increase of \$85.2M for Fisheries Research and Management.

- Magnuson-Stevens Act +\$56.5M
- Marine Monuments +\$3.0M
- Comparative Analysis of Marine Ecosystem Organization (CAMEO) +\$5.0M
- Pacific Salmon Treaty +\$16.8M
- Integrated Ecosystem Assessments +\$1.0M



Magnuson-Stevens Act Highlights

NOAA requests \$56.5M in new increases for a total of \$98.3M to support the requirements of the MSRA

- Annual Catch Limits (ACLs) +\$12.0M
- Expand Annual Stock Assessments +\$9.9M
- Support for Regional Fishery Management Councils +\$4.0M
- Recreational and Commercial Fisheries Information +\$4.8M
- International Provisions/ IUU Fishing +\$3.0M
- Economics and Social Science Research +\$3.3M



Enforcement and Observers Highlights

NOAA requests an increase of \$12.6M for the Enforcement and Observer line.

- MSRA Enforcement requirements +\$7.6M
- National Fisheries Observer Program +\$5.0M



Habitat Conservation and Restoration Highlights

NOAA requests an increase of \$1.0M for Habitat Conservation and Restoration.


Deep Sea Coral Research +\$1.0M



Other Activities Supporting Fisheries Highlights

NOAA requests an increase of \$13.5M in the Other Activities Supporting Fisheries line.

- Aquaculture +\$2.0M
- Climate Change Research and Management +\$1.2M
- Ocean Acidification +\$1.5M
- Cooperative Research +\$6.0M
