Introduction and Target Audience

Welcome to the Emergency Management Issues Special Interest Group (EMI SIG) Exercise and Drill Subcommittee's web-based tutorials! Developing Exercise Objectives (DEO), Developing Exercise Scenarios (DES). and the Basic Exercise Controller and Evaluator (BECET) tutorials are available to transfer knowledge to Department of Energy (DOE)/National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA) and its contractor personnel involved in planning, developing, and implementing emergency drills and exercises. The tutorials provide learning for both new and experienced exercise developers, controllers, and evaluators through a step-by-step approach.



Design and Development

The tutorials are updated to comply with DOE Order 151.1C, *Comprehensive Emergency Management System*, and the DOE 151.1 guidance series. The tutorials have a new presentation format and navigation features that enhance the learning environment by engaging the learner to interact and work through the informational content in a self-paced and learner chosen manner. In addition, these Webbased tutorials are improved to align with Section 508 accessibility standards for Web-based intranet and internet information and applications for persons with physical and cognitive disabilities.

The tutorials focus on developing exercise objectives, scenario materials, and control and/or evaluation organizations for operations-based exercises. To simplify wording, the term *exercise* is used throughout the tutorials instead of the words *drill/exercise*. **Note:** Learning content is applicable to drills unless otherwise noted.

Instruction for includes:

- An introduction with learning objectives View tutorial objectives: DEO DES BECET
- Learning content divided into sections and subsections, as appropriate
- Linked examples, interactive activities, and practice areas to enhance learning
- Section quizzes to self-test knowledge and receive feedback
- Summary of key points
- A final quiz designed to randomly select questions from a test bank and provide remediation to topics missed
- A stationary bookmark to directly access Resources, Glossary, Examples, or to Exit the tutorial
- A comment form to provide feedback for future tutorial improvements
- A certificate of completion for learner's training records




Table 2 displays sample screen captures of the interactive and quiz areas found in both the DEO and DES tutorials. It also provides a brief description of each.
