Offense Analysis, Number and Percent Change, 2007-2008

- In 2008, the average dollar value per motor vehicle stolen in the United States was \$6,751. The average dollar value of property taken during burglaries was \$2,079; during robberies, \$1,315; and during larceny-thefts, \$925.
- By location, most robberies (43.1 percent) happened on streets or highways and the majority of burglaries (70.3 percent) occurred at residences.
- Among the larceny-theft categories, larceny-thefts from buildings had the highest average dollar value of property taken, \$1,540.
- Forty-five percent of all larceny-thefts involved property valued at more than \$200.
