Air Travel Arrangements

The Argonne Division of Educational Programs has made a reservation for you through Omega World Travel and an electronic airline ticket has been purchased in your name according to the attached itinerary. The itinerary also indicates your electronic ticket record locator number. For security purposes, please be advised that when you pick up your electronic airline ticket at the airport from which you are departing you will be required to show a U.S. federal or state-issued ID that contains the following: Name, date of birth, gender, expiration date, and a tamper-resistant feature. The airlines urge all domestic travelers to arrive at the airport 2 hours prior to flight departure. The airlines also recommend reconfirmation of flight status, seat assignments, and baggage fees prior to departure for the airport. If you make changes to your airline ticket, you are responsible for any costs incurred.

Limousine Services

Telephone numbers and one-way trip fares for United Limousine Service and A-1 Airport Limousine Service are listed in the booklet "A Visitor's Guide to Argonne National Laboratory." It is recommended that you make reservations in advance. Please be advised that the limousine rates may vary according to time and day of pick up. If you make a limousine reservation, please have them quote you a rate. **This expense will not be reimbursed.**

Access to the Argonne Site

When you arrive at Argonne, enter the Laboratory via Northgate Road through the main gate, Guard Post 291. For directions to Argonne National Laboratory and a map of the Argonne site, please visit website www.anl.gov and click on Visiting Argonne. Before entering the Argonne site, all School participants will require a gate pass. **A photo ID is required to obtain a gate pass. Foreign nationals are required to present their in-status US Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) documentation before being granted site access. Please have original paperwork of your documentation with you at all times. Foreign nationals are requested to bring a photocopy of your documentation (Visa, I-94, Passport, etc.) with you on June 12 to "speed up" the process of issuing your gate pass.** The Visitor Reception Center is open Monday through Friday from 6:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. All other times see the guard on duty at Guard Post 291 that is manned 24 hours. You should then report to the Argonne Guest House, Building 460, for check-in procedures. We strongly encourage you to bring a telephone calling card with you since the Argonne Guest House charges an additional amount on all outgoing calls.
