**CALIFORNIA (Inset C) - Core Based Statistical Areas, Counties, and Selected Places**



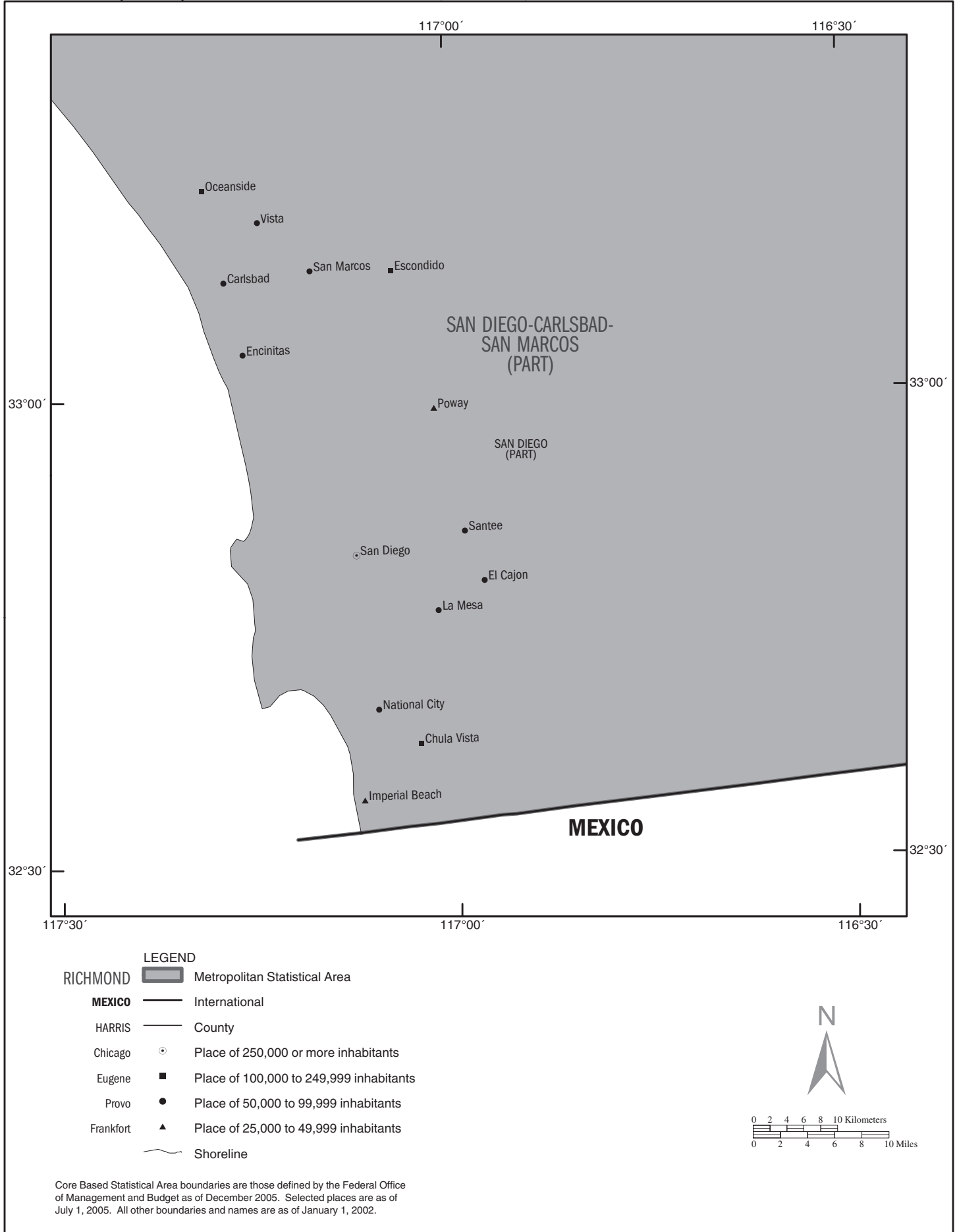

**DELAWARE - Core Based Statistical Areas, Counties, and Selected Places**



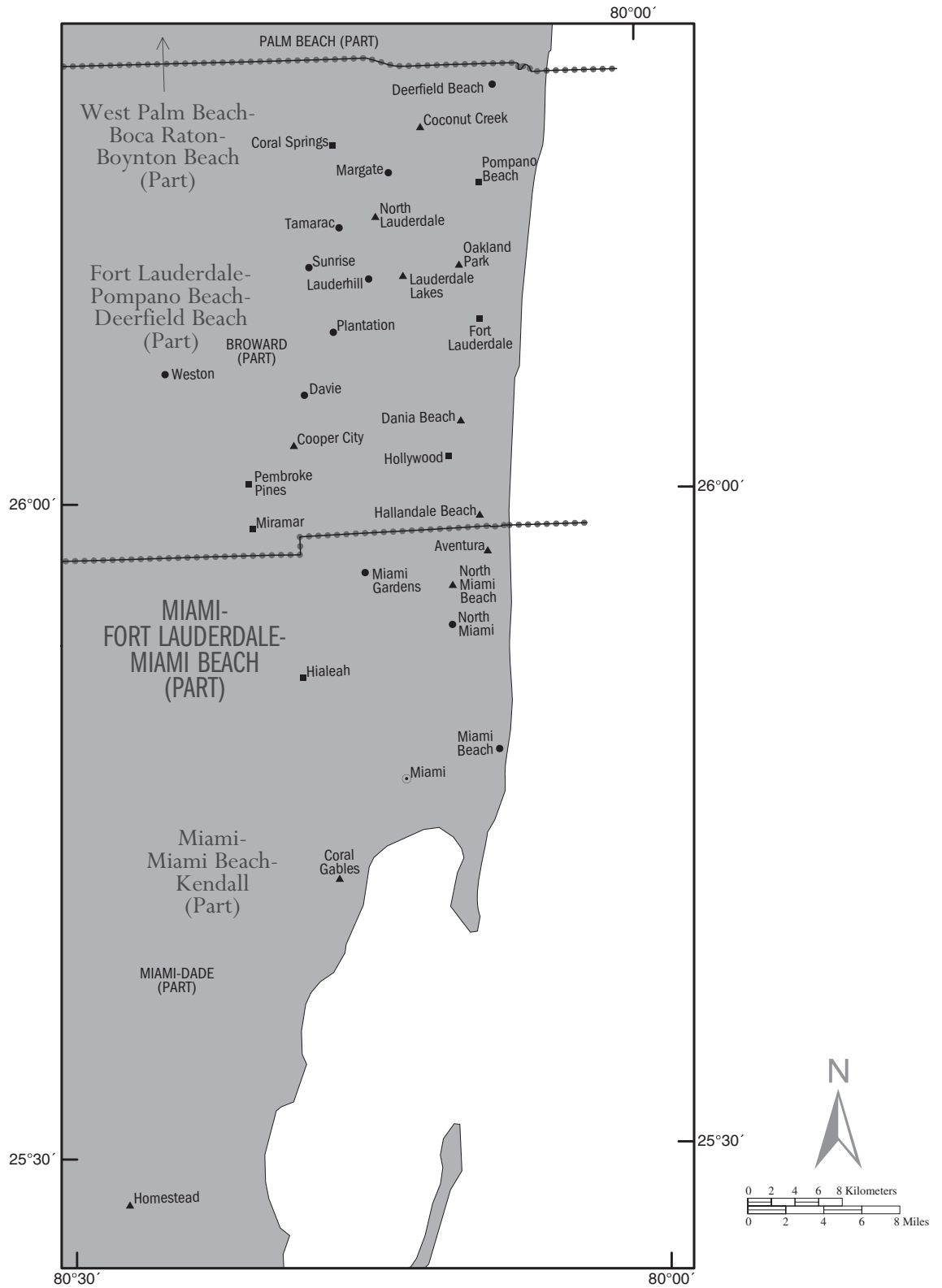

**INDIANA - Core Based Statistical Areas, Counties, and Selected Places**



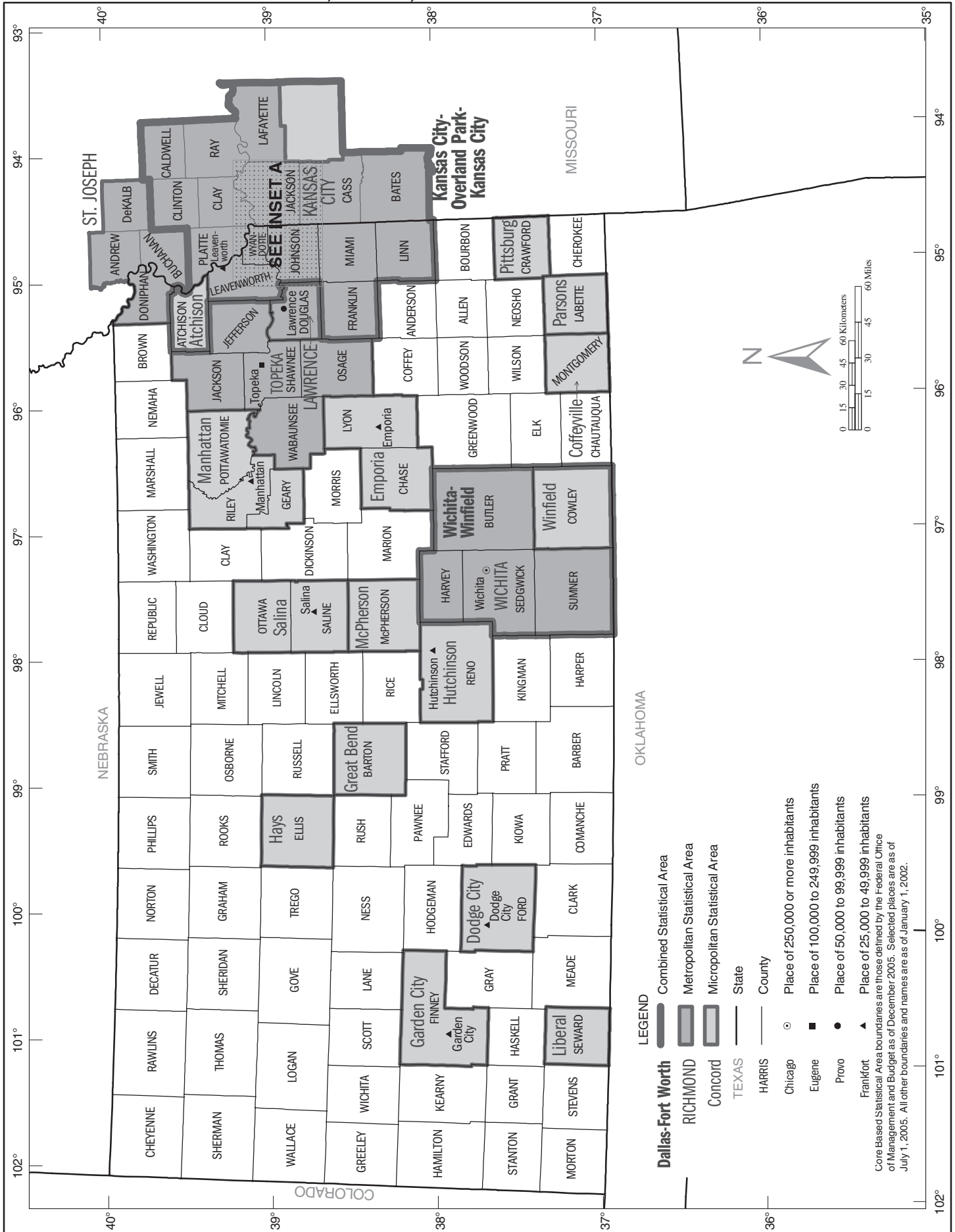

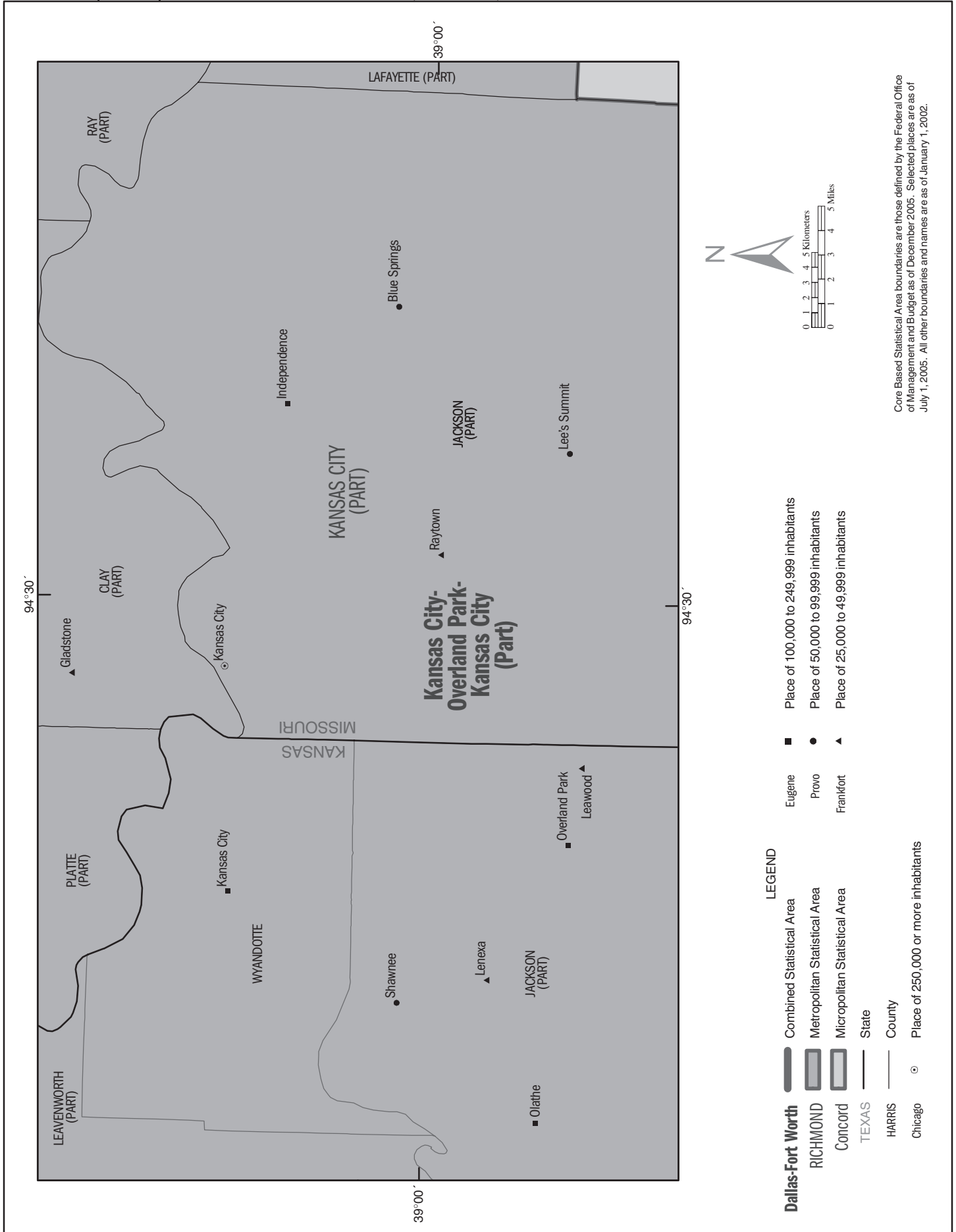


**MISSISSIPPI - Core Based Statistical Areas, Counties, and Selected Places**



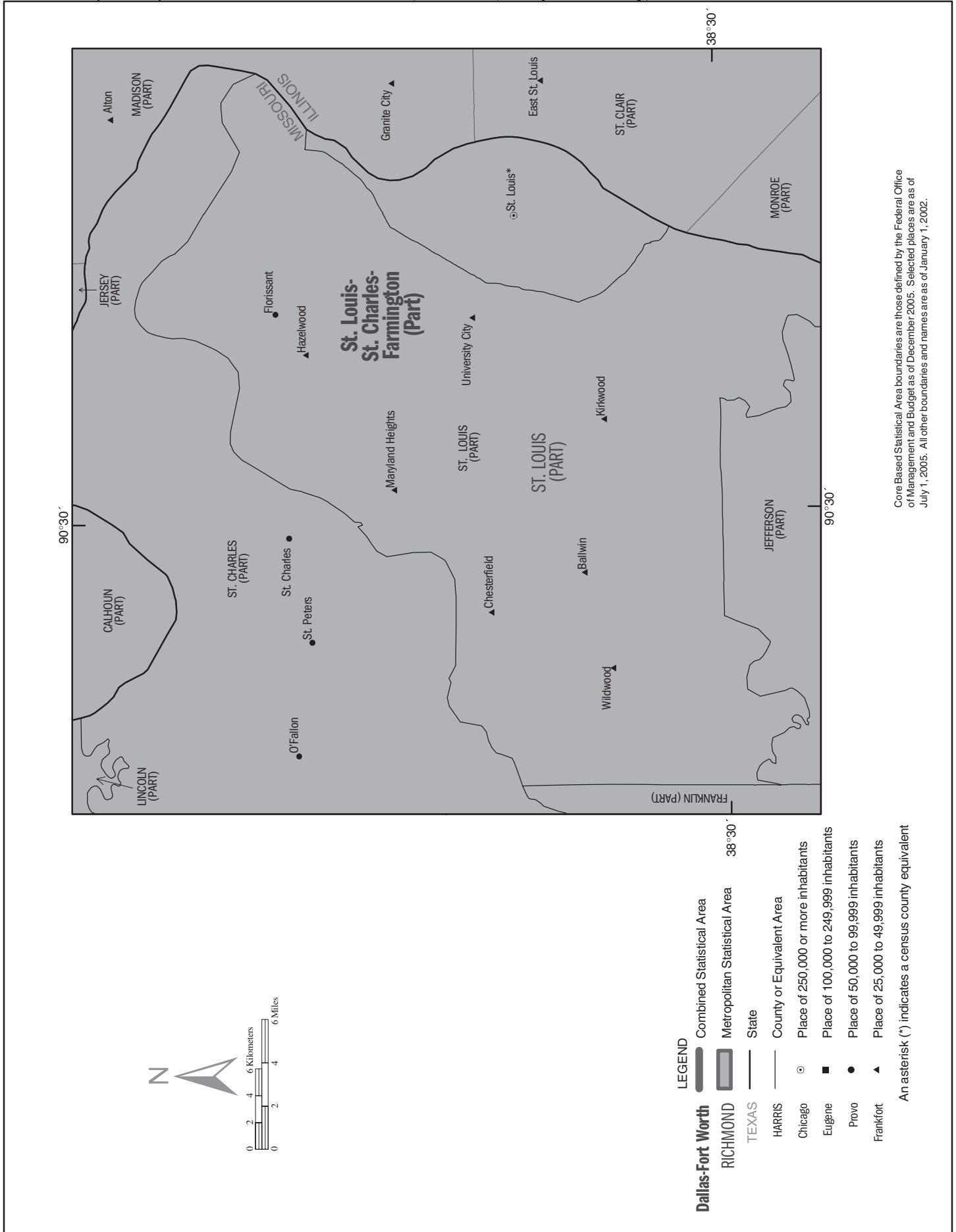

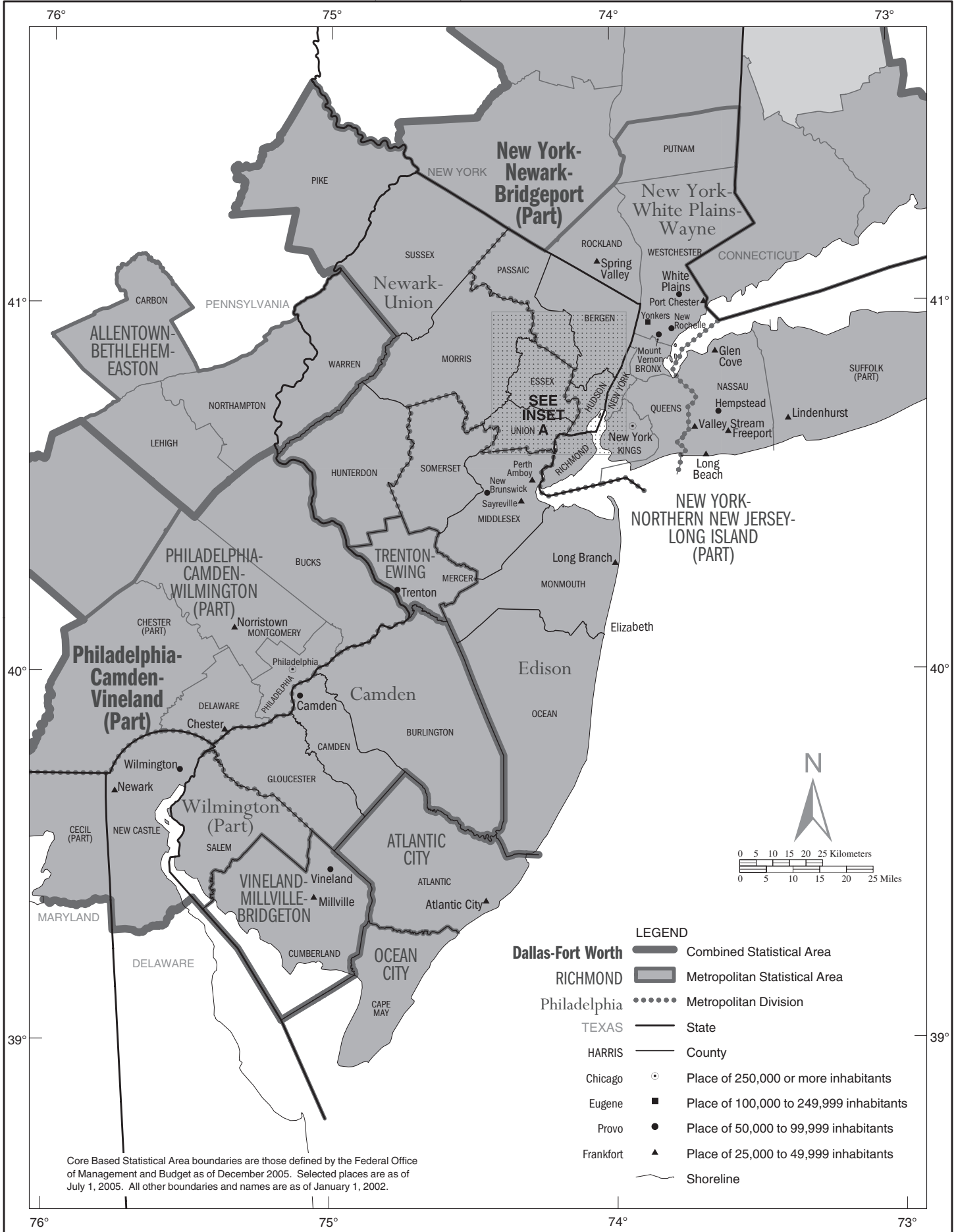


**NEW HAMPSHIRE - Core Based Statistical Areas, Counties, and Selected Places**



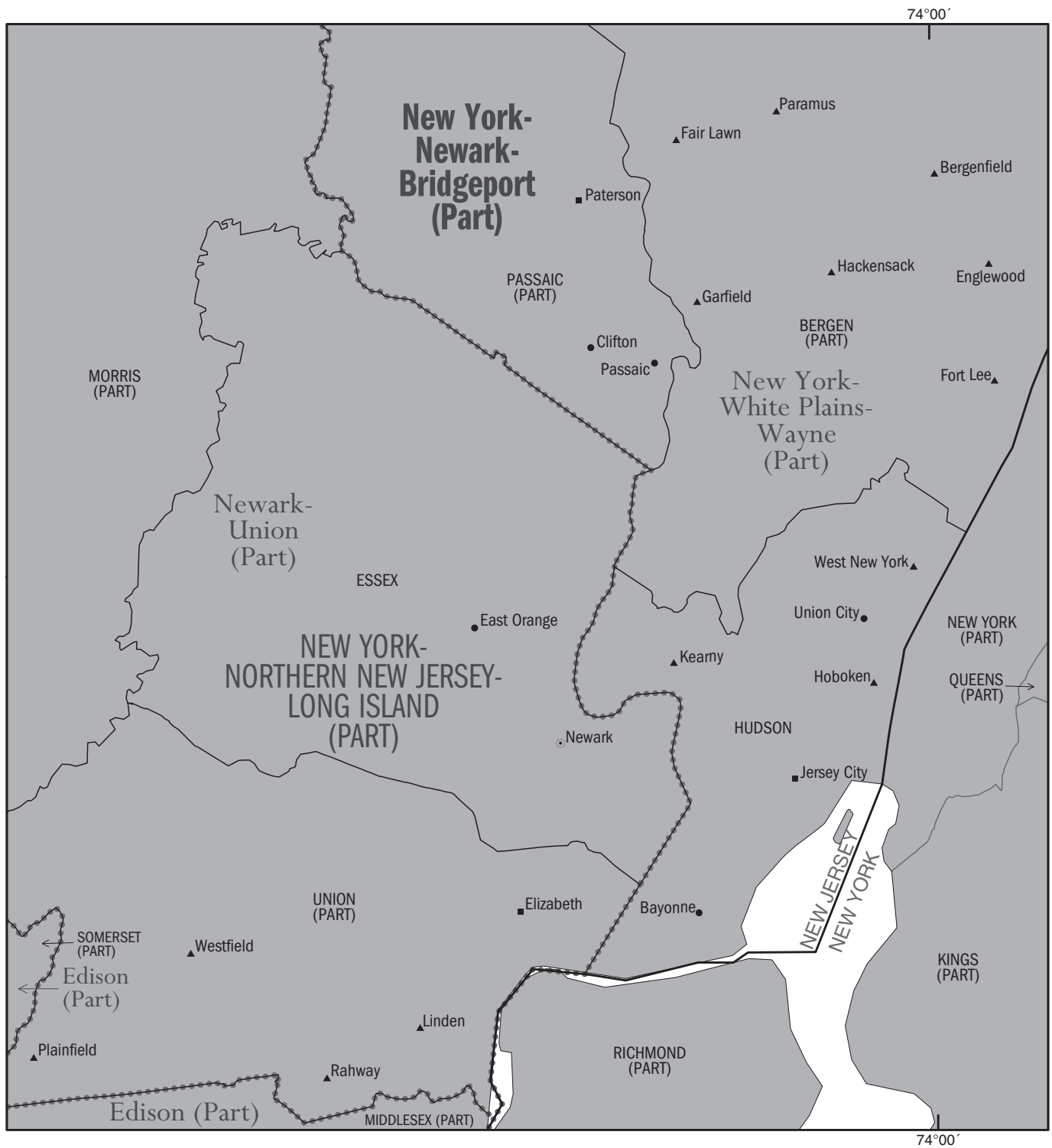

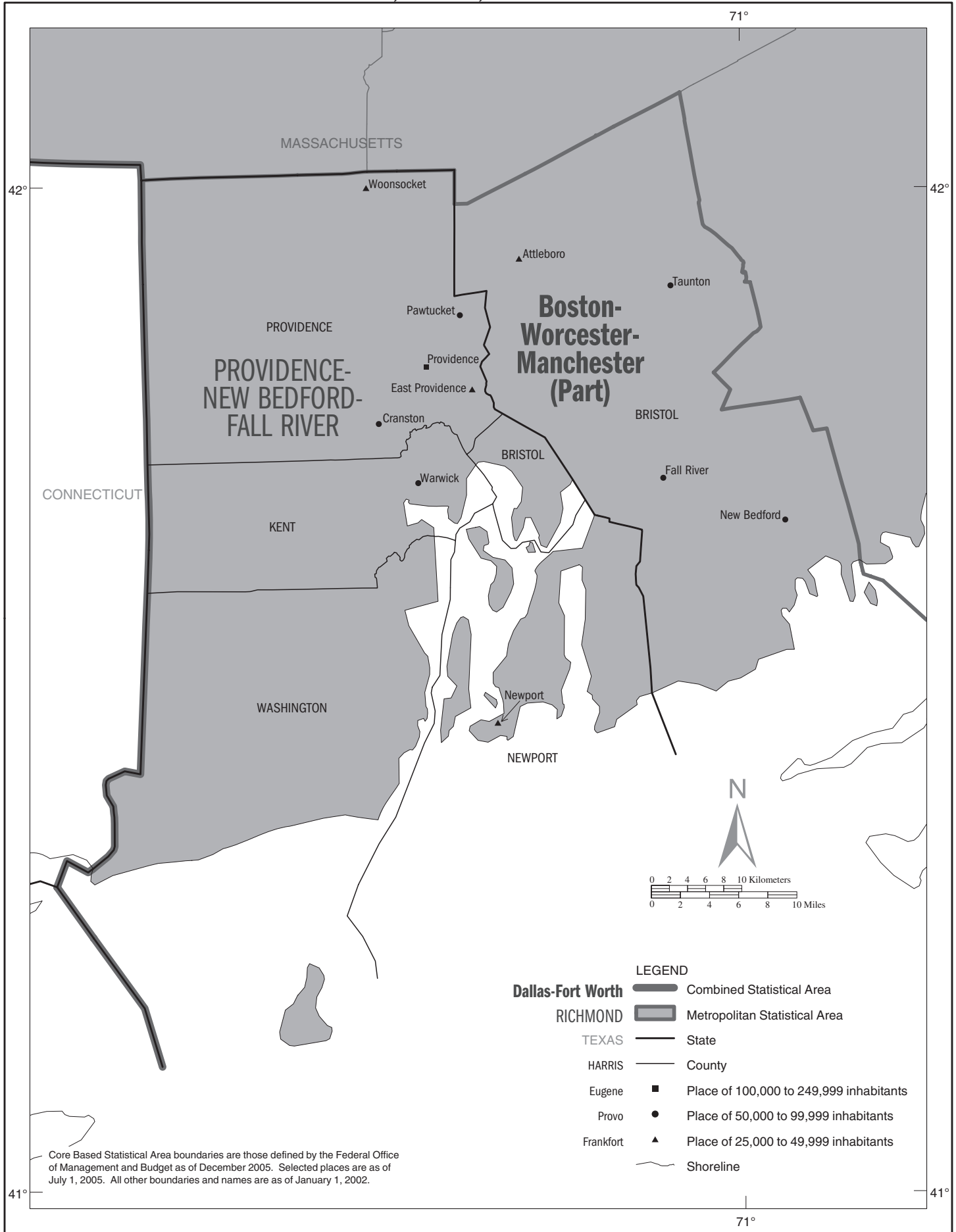

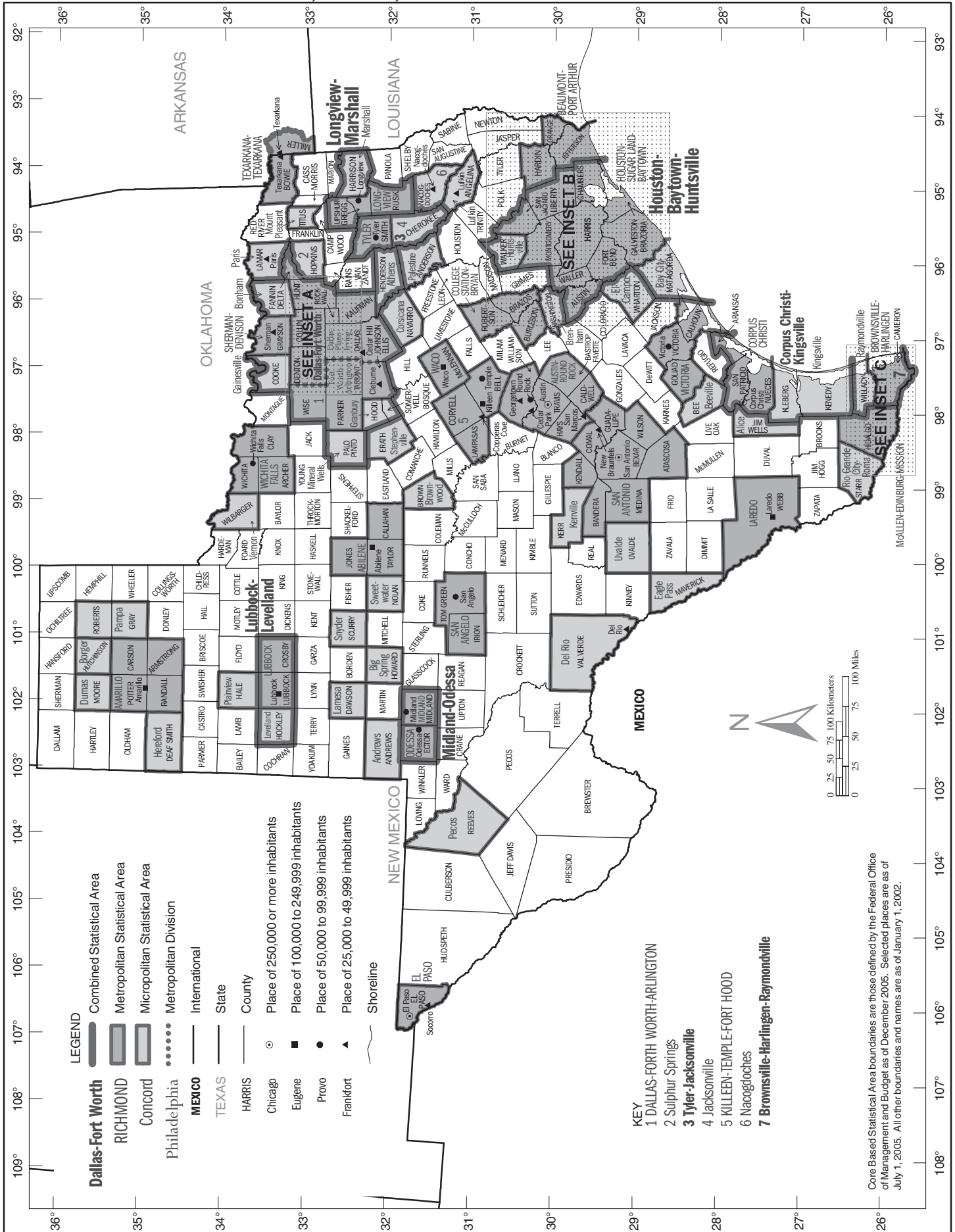


TENNESSEE - Core Based Statistical Areas, Counties, Independent City, and Selected Places



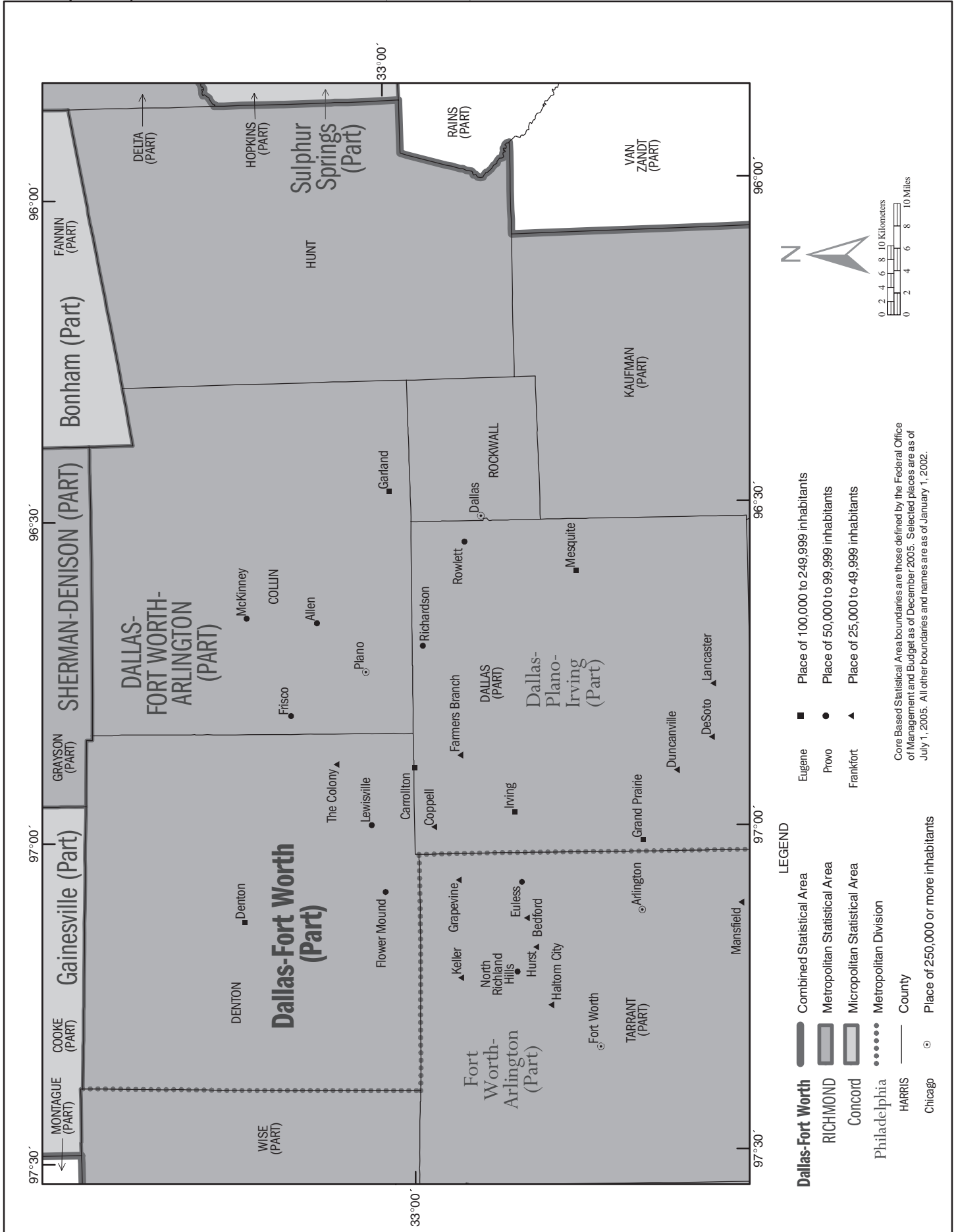

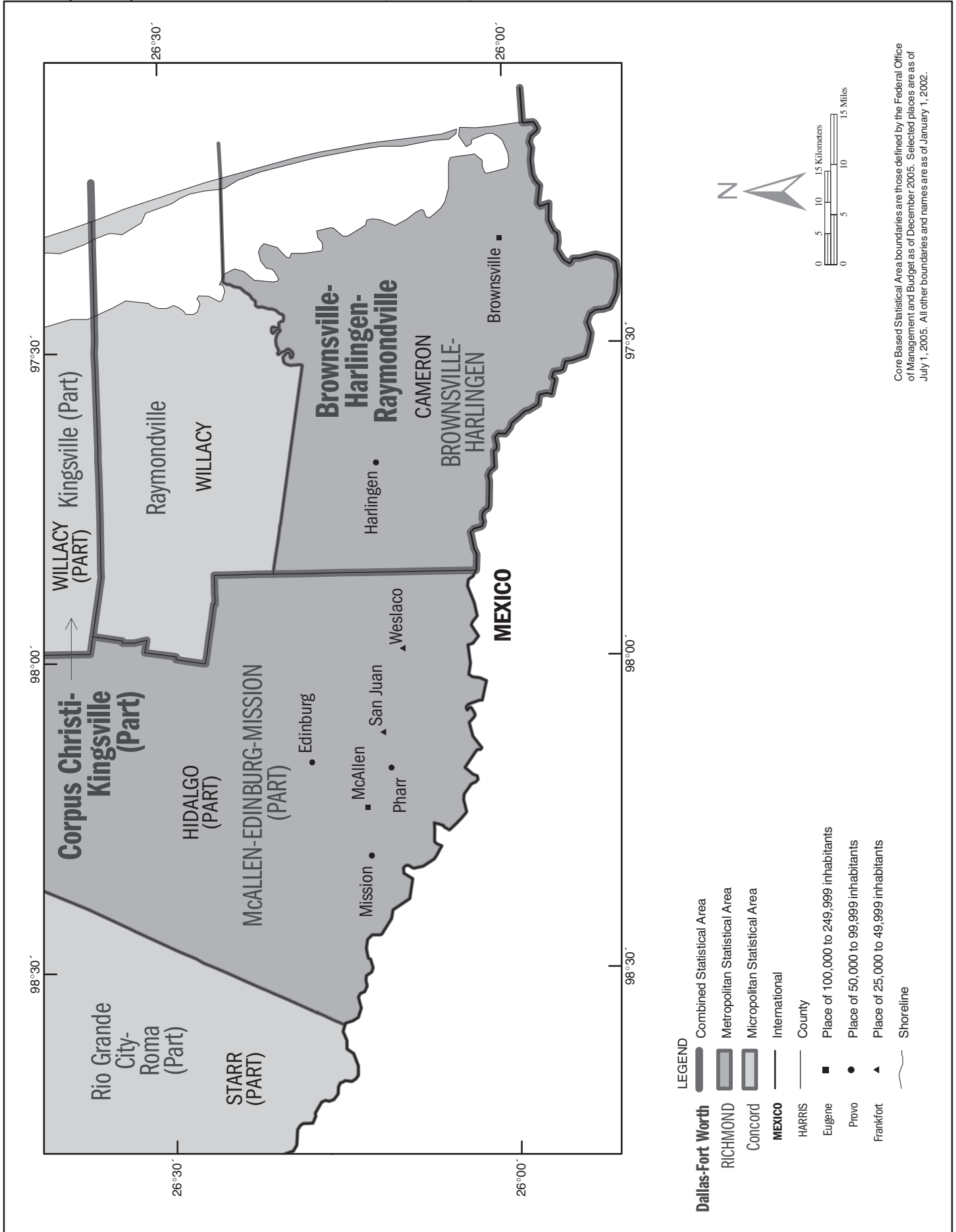

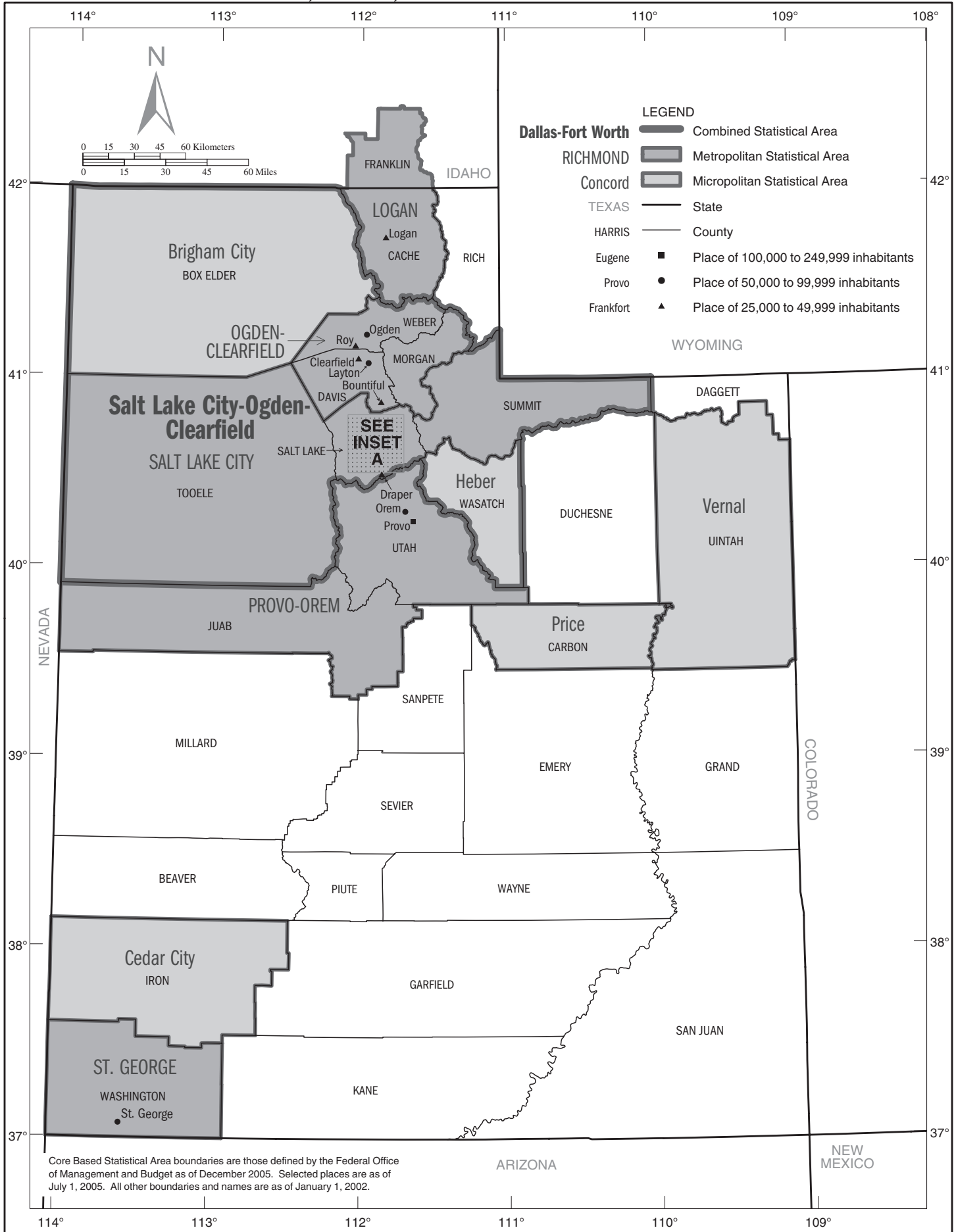

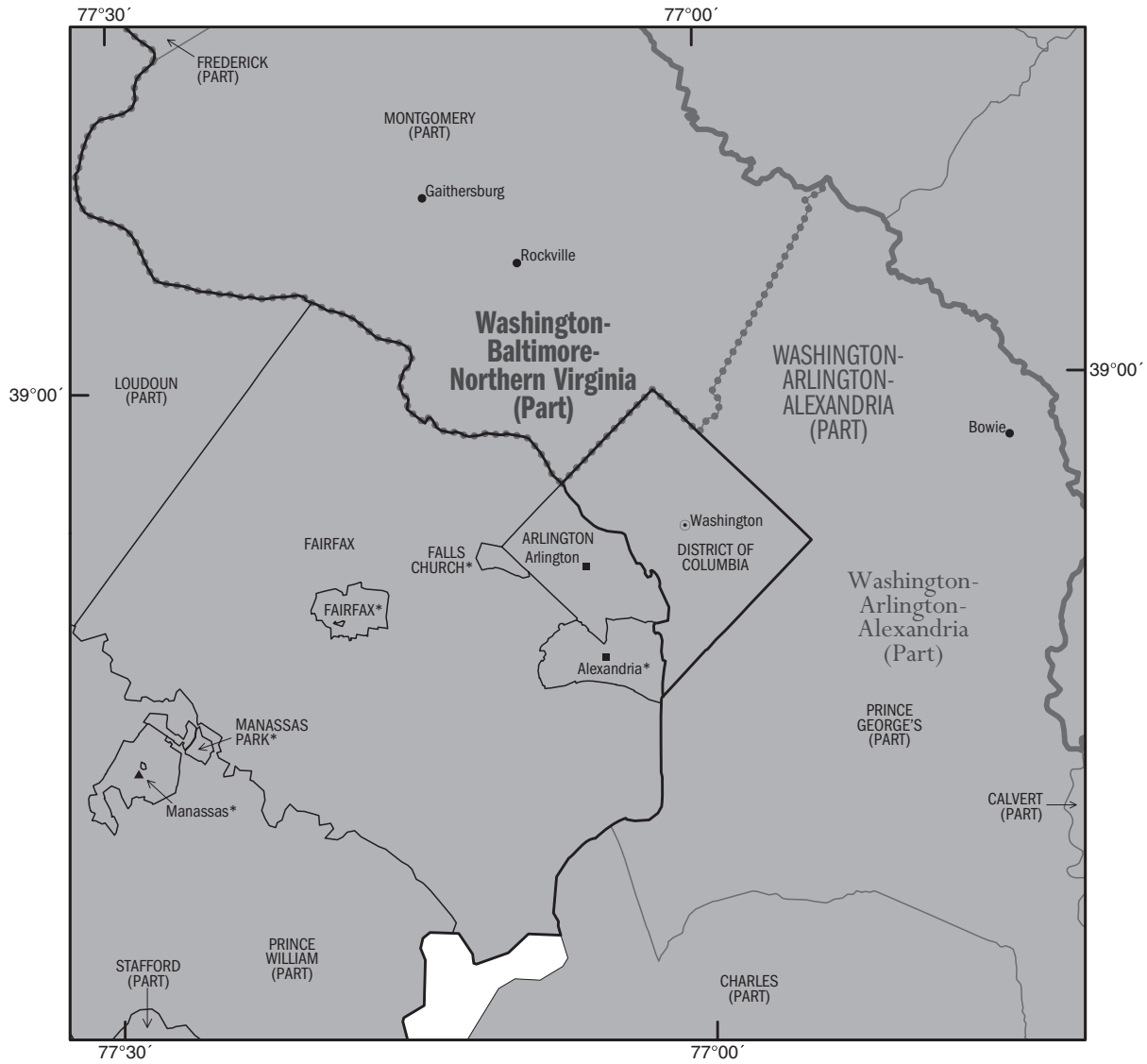

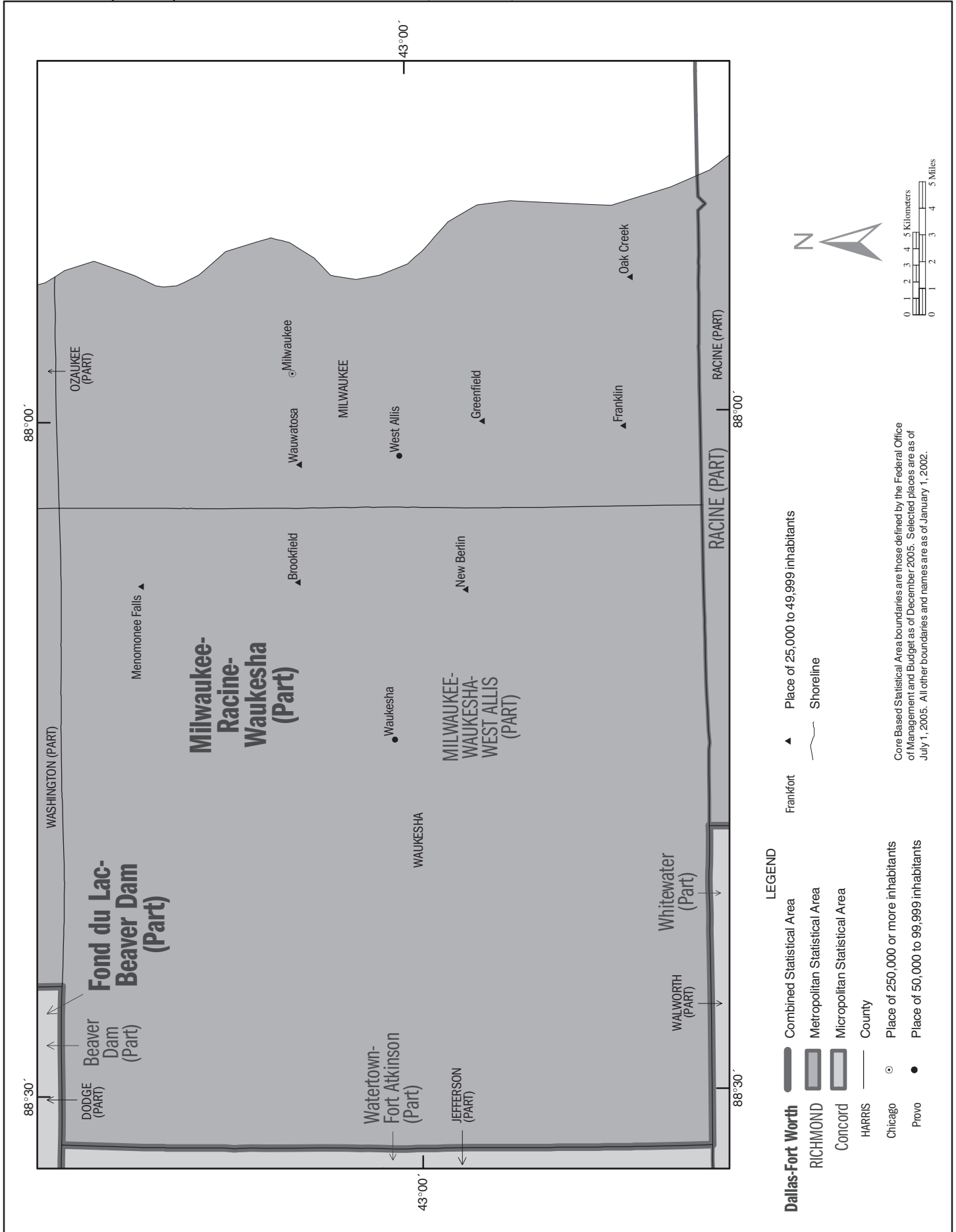




**WISCONSIN (Inset A) - Core Based Statistical Areas, Counties, and Selected Places**

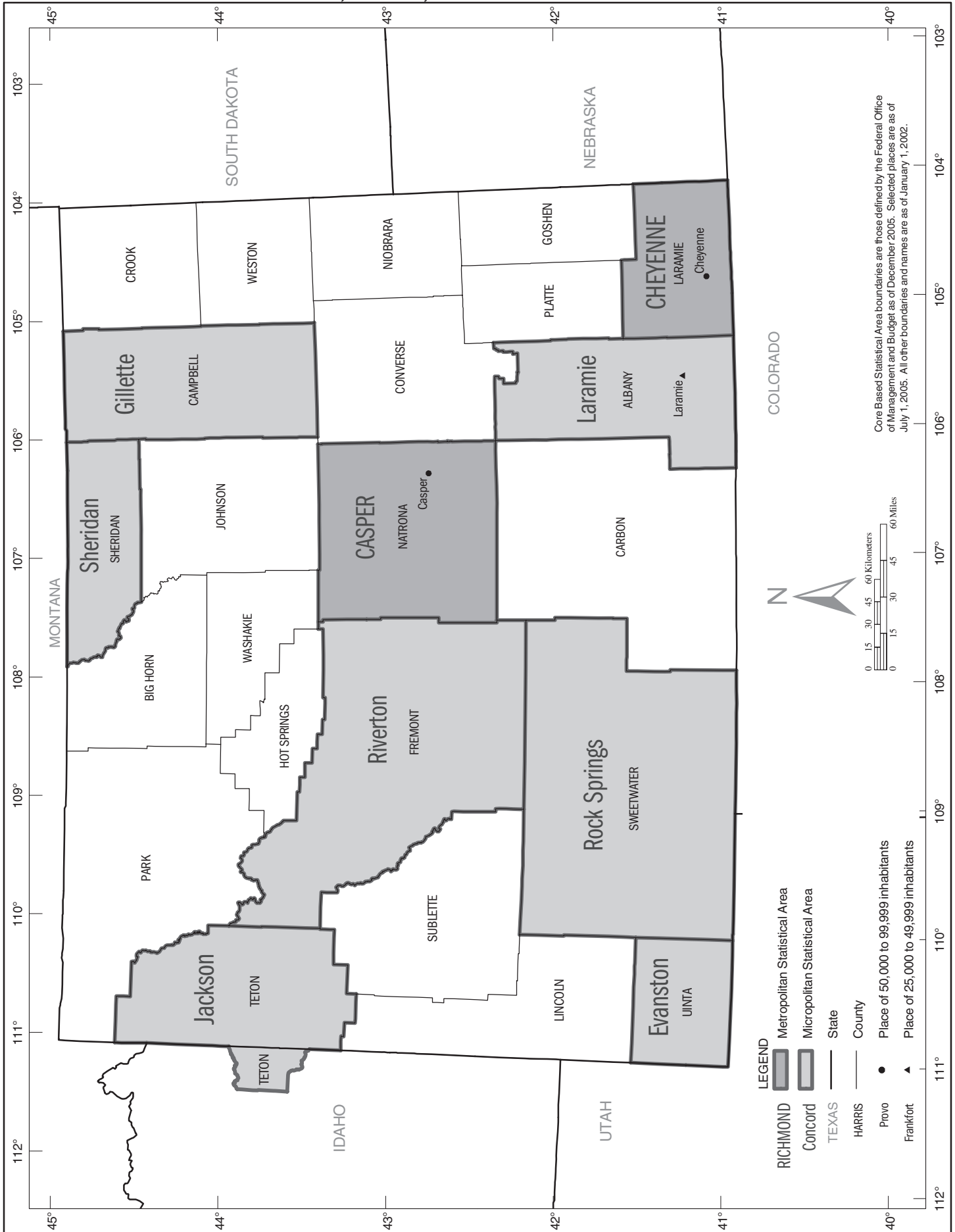
