Metro Rail Instructions

Rail and Walking

The nearest Metro stations to the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM), 1900 E Street, NW, are the Farragut West and North stations

From Farragut West (Orange and Blue Line trains):

1. Exit the station from the 18th Street exit,
2. Walk one block on I Street to 19th Street,
3. Turns left, and walk approximately 5 blocks down 19th Street to 1900 E Street, NW.

From Farragut North (Red Line trains):

1. Exit the station from the K Street exit,
2. Walk approximately 7 blocks on 17th Street to E Street,
3. Turn right, and walk approximately 2 blocks down E Street to 1900 E Street, NW.

Rail and Bus

If you prefer to take a Metro Bus from the metro

From Farragut West (Orange and Blue Line trains):

1. Exit the station from the 18th Street exit,
2. Walk one block west on I Street to the Metro Bus stop on 19th Street, and
3. Take either the southbound 80 (Kennedy Center) or S1 (Potomac Park) bus to the corner of 19th and E Street, NW.

From Farragut North (Red Line trains):

1. Exit the station from the K Street exit,
2. Walk to Metro Bus stop on K Street and Connecticut Ave, and
3. Take either the southbound 80 (Kennedy Center) or S1 (Potomac Park) bus to the corner of 19th and E Street, NW.

By Vehicle

Driving is an option, however parking is limited. There is a paid parking garage located just north of the building on 19th Street GW Visitor Public Parking Lot Ellicott School 1957 E Street, NW Washington, DC 20415; (beside the 7-Eleven) the cost is approximately \$19.00 per day.

By Bicycle

Free bike racks are available at the rear of the building on the Virginia Avenue side. You will still need to enter at the front of the building on E Street.
