Definition of Aviation Event

FAA Order 8900.1, Volume 3, Chapter 6, Section 1

"Aviation events include *air shows, closed course air races, parachute demonstration jumps, balloon meets, and fly-ins* conducted before an invited assembly of persons, for which the FAA issues a Certificate of Waiver or Authorization"





FAA outreach to Aviation Event Industry

- 5-year strategic plan
 - Addresses the general aviation accident rate through
 - Risk identification and mitigation
 - Training
 - Outreach and engagement
 - Safety promotion.
- FAA meeting with ICAS on September 29, outcome:
 - Enhance communication and partnership
 - Collaborate on review of Aerobatic Competency Examiner (ACE) Manual
 - Meet at least quarterly
- AFS-800
 - Enhancing air race policy
 - Updating FAA policy (e.g. UAS at Aviation Events)
 - Conducting Bi-Weekly teleconference with Regional Specialist to ensure consistency and standardization
 - Updating Special Provisions



- Pilot Documentation Showing Qualifications
 - Performers not have proper credentials (e.g. SAC cards)
- Air show briefings
 - Marketing/promotional versus performer safety
 - Safety items not being covered
 - Emergency response/recovery plans
 - Special aircraft safety procedures (ejection seats/canopy releases)
 - Severe weather plans
 - Emergency equipment locations and capability
- Non-Essential Personnel
 - "Official photographers"
 - > Non-participating aircraft taxiing under aerobatic box during act
 - Sterile area and Aerobatic box
- Cloud Clearances
 - Smoke and cloud penetration during performance



- Crowd Control
 - Aircraft starting and taxiing in close proximity to spectators
 - Mainly occurs after event in conjunction with Fly-ins
- Qualification of air boss
 - No aviation experience
 - Seems to occur at air shows that do not have a sanctioned military performance
- Repositioning turns past end of runway over densely populated areas
 - Roll back toward the show line not being done at minimum altitude
- Some IICs working outside FAA policy
- Incidents not being reported to AFS-800 or Region
 For example loss of separation during performance
- Scope of the waiver
 - List only time needed, not blanket times (i.e. entire weekend)



- Timeliness of waiver and authorization requests
 - Include FSDO as early as possible (90/30 Rule)
 - We are aware of 45 days listed on 7711-2 and are currently working to correct
- Airport Aerial Event Feasibility Surveys
 - FSDO should not be expected to rubber stamp
 - Google map not sufficient enough
 - Currency of map within 90 days
 - Obstructions
- TFR requirements? FAA does not impose this on event organizers



- Industry knowledge of Military and Civilian Demo Team's maneuver packages
- FAA acceptance of civilian parachute team program
- Safety and Emergency plans at Aviation Events
 - Incident response plan template located on ICAS website
 - Airport good resource
- Responsible person
 - Who should it be?
 - Be knowledgeable of waiver
 - Accessibility during entire event
- Invited assembly of people on "practice day"
 - Chalets



Policy Revisions

- ACE manual change for review and acceptance– ICAS initiated
- FAA Order 8900.1, Volume 6, Chapter 11, Section 10, Surveillance of an Aviation Event
 - Consolidates information into one source from Volume 3, Chapter 6, Section 1
- FAA Order 8900.1, Volume 3, Chapter 6, Section 2
 - Updated policy with a new section regarding Air Race Program Accreditation
- FAA Order 8900.1, Volume 3, Chapter 6, Section 1
 - Update due to new information and restructuring
- Special Provisions
