3	CHAIRMAN MEITES: Let me call the meeting to
4	order. The operations and regulations committee
5	adjourned yesterday in too much haste, and graciously,
6	Lillian has agreed to let us resume our meeting quite
7	briefly.
8	There are two items, one of which we did
9	not obtain the views of management on the presentation
10	which the Inspector General's office gave on
11	independent public accountants yesterday, and so I
12	welcome Karen for her views.
13	MS. SARJEANT: Thank you, and good morning. I
14	do want to thank you for the opportunity to comment on
15	the very briefly on the report of the Inspector
16	General on the work of the IPAs.
17	We certainly agree in principle with what
18	Dutch shared with us yesterday. We think that the
19	IPAs are an important part of the overall wheel of
20	oversight that LSC provides.
21	We do have some concerns that the system is

not yet working the way it should, so we very much

- support what Dutch reported in terms of the training
 of the IPAs and a more robust review of the IPA
 reports because we think, since the IPAs are in the
 programs once every year, that what they do they need
 to do very thoroughly and very well.
- And our work has shown that they are missing
 some things. And we have shared that with the IG, and
 I believe that that has in some ways helped that they
 have taken that information and are using that to do a
 more robust review.

And then I did want to share with you very briefly what LSC has done because we also -- Dutch talked about where the responsibility for internal controls and oversight resides. And so one of the things that we have done is to take a much more proactive education role.

And in addition to the March advisory, there was a December compliance advisory that was shared with grantees. And along with the Inspector General, our director of Office of Compliance and Enforcement and I participated, and Helaine participated, and I believe Sarah was there. Sarah Singleton was there

- 1 also.
- We had a pre-conference session at NLADA in
- 3 which it was focused on LSC compliance. And it was an
- 4 opportunity for us to share with our grantees our
- 5 expectations on their compliance and their oversight
- 6 of internal controls.
- 7 Additionally, we are in the process and
- 8 invitations are out to -- we're putting together a
- 9 financial advisory group that is populated in part by
- some of the programs, representatives of some of the
- 11 programs, that had GAO visits, and GAO did not make
- any findings on them. And then we've added some other
- people to that advisory group.
- 14 And that group will be working with LSC to
- 15 determine what additional guidance and information we
- ought to be providing to programs to help them put in
- 17 place better internal controls, better financial
- 18 systems, and do more proactive oversight locally.
- 19 Finally, we're following up on the issues that
- are referred to us from the Inspector General's
- 21 office. And I think that working with them, we
- 22 continue to try to improve the financial oversight of

- 1 our programs.
- 2 So again, even though we do have some concerns
- with how the IPA process is working, we think that
- 4 everybody within the Corporation is working towards
- 5 making as many improvements as we can without
- 6 significantly increasing the cost to programs. Thank
- 7 you.
- 8 CHAIRMAN MEITES: Thank you, Karen. Any
- 9 questions or comments?
- 10 (No response.)
- 11 CHAIRMAN MEITES: Good. Well, thank you for
- 12 that presentation.
- One other brief item. As we saw yesterday, we
- had a panel discussion by five board chairs from a
- 15 representative group of our grantees. This panel
- 16 discussion for the first time was available via
- 17 webcast for all our executive directors.
- 18 And we apologize to the executive directors
- 19 that we failed to acknowledge their participation in
- 20 the webcast. But we wanted to assure our programs
- that management will follow up and address their input
- on the issues that we discussed. And I will give a

1	full report when I report to the board later this
2	afternoon.
3	Thank you. That is all I have. We are
4	adjourned.
5	We were adjourned, but if I could have a
6	motion to adjourn? Bernice?
