# CMS COW Project Update to CLIAC

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- Follow Up on Feb. '04 CLIAC Report
- BACKGROUND:
  - CMS implemented a database developed with CDC to receive & compile COW results.
  - CMS presented to CLIAC preliminary data from COW visits during '02 & '03.
    - CLIAC responded enthusiastically and made several recommendations.
    - Concerns were expressed about the severity and number of problems identified.





What happened following CLIAC?

- CMS validated 2002 data.

CMS evaluating 2003 data now.





What does the data look like now?

- ALL data are correct.
- Some results are different than initially reported.
- Most are very similar.





- What caused the differences in the data?
  - Initially reported data was raw & unverified.
  - Data system was new to users.
    - Requires manual data entry.
    - Had no edits.
  - CMS had no process to identify/verify questionable information timely.





- What caused the differences in the data? Cont'd.
  - Surveyors made data entry errors and/or entered unconfirmed data that wasn't subsequently updated.
  - Some surveyors may have considered testing beyond the certificate scope an immediate jeopardy situation, but didn't notify CMS.





- What Has CMS Done to Correct the Problems?
  - Training provided to surveyors on data base use and COW survey procedures.
  - Edits placed in the system to prevent entering certain information without confirmation.
  - CMS regional offices will regularly review their States' data.





- What has CMS Done to Correct the Problems? Cont'd.
  - The data base will be locked at the conclusion of each FY to prevent interlopers from changing data.
  - Definition of immediate jeopardy clarified.
  - All immediate jeopardy situations must be reported & confirmed to the CMS regional and central offices prior to entry in the data base.

#### Where are we now?

- Completing validation of '03 COW data.
- Completing '04 surveys by 9/30.
- Data system edits have been instituted and tested.
- Proposal to continue COW surveys indefinitely has been submitted to CMS management.
