 - (1) Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and briefly describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

The Asset Visibility (AV) Program provides users with timely and accurate information on the location, movement, status, and identity of units, personnel, equipment and supplies. It facilitates the capability to act upon that information to improve the overall performance of DOD's logistics practices. Once access is granted to the individual user through Global Combat Support System (GCSS) portal. The users full name and whether individual is a United States citizen are transferred to the AV system for the purpose of access control.

The PII is being collected via the GCSS Portal and sent to the AV system when an individuals access is granted. The AV system collects the individual's name and citizenship when access is granted.

(2) Briefly describe the privacy risks associated with the PII collected and how these risks are addressed to safeguard privacy.

Users, including individuals responsible for system maintenance, receive initial and periodic refresher Privacy Act and Information Assurance training. Users are trained to lock their workstations when leaving them unattended, to shut down computers when leaving at the end of the duty shift and to be alert to third parties entering the workspace.

AV servers are kept in a secure, limited access, or monitored work areas accessible only to authorized personnel. Data is backed up daily for reconstruction of the records should the system fail. Access to the servers is Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) control.

Computers are Common Access/Smart Card (CAC) enabled requiring a valid certificate and a Personal Identification Number (PIN). Computer screens automatically lock after a preset period of inactivity. Systems manually locked by the user can only be unlocked by inserting the Common Access/Smart Card (CAC) and entering the Personal Identification Number (PIN).
