
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Nuclear Weapons Complex

Y-12 is Essential to National Security

- Y-12 is unique in U.S. nuclear weapons complex
- Serves as the *only* source of secondaries, cases, and other weapons components and special nuclear material for the U.S. Navy
- Leader in materials science and precision manufacturing
- Main U.S. storage facility for enriched uranium



Y-12's Missions

- Producing, refurbishing and dismantling nuclear weapons components
- Safeguarding special nuclear materials
- Preventing the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction
- Providing the U.S. Navy with safe, militarily effective nuclear propulsion systems

- These buildings could save nearly \$100 million in reduced operating, maintenance and renovation costs
- Other possible projects include emergency command center/fire station, material handling and maintenance, and plant lab and development

Statewide Economic Impact

- With some 4,700 employees in 26 counties, Y-12 employees have a \$4 billion indirect impact on the East Tennessee economy
- Total personal income generated in the state by related activities was \$1.9 billion
- Y-12's employment of more than 7,000 people generates an additional 27,890 jobs in the state
- Y-12 payroll and non-payroll spending resulted in a \$1.6 billion increase in the state's gross domestic product
- More than \$1.5 million has been contributed in the last two years by Y-12 to local charities and education


