

Questions and Answers

FY 2012 National Crime Statistics Exchange (NCS-X) Project: Phase I

- 1. Q. The statement of work includes the objective: "engagement of the stakeholder communities, including a plan for incorporating specific benefits (quid pro quos) to serve stakeholder information needs." Will DOJ/BJJ provide points of contact and/or assistance (leads) with this objective or will this be solely the responsibility of the grantee?**

A. BJS will provide points of contact.

- 2. Q. The announcement mentions "current NIBRS participants." Will DOJ/BJJ provide the grantee with a comprehensive list of current participants? Are there data also available from current participants?**

A. BJS will provide this information.

- 3. Q. With regard to meetings, conferences, and seminars, will these events be coordinated mutually between DOJ/BJJ and the grantee, including: timing, scope, invitees, agenda, etc?**

A. Yes, BJS will coordinate with the grantee concerning the timing, scope, invitees, and the agenda for such events.

- 4. Q. Does a current website or web portal exist for this information/data transmission?**

A. A website or portal does not currently exist for the NCS-X Project.

- 5. Q. The solicitation states that, "A key input in this work is BJS sponsored sampling research currently being undertaken at the University of Michigan." Is there a website, point of contact or other information available to learn about this?**
