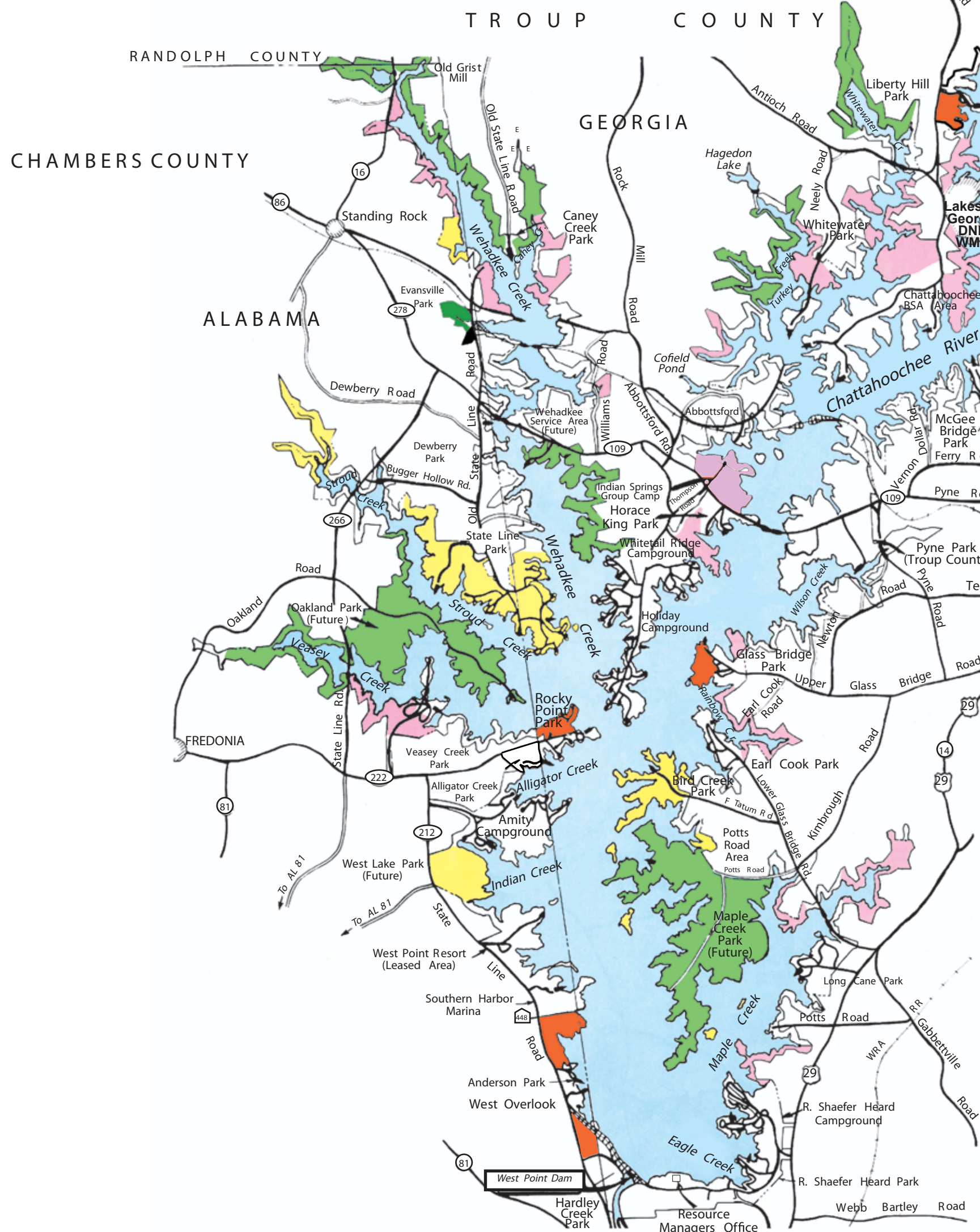
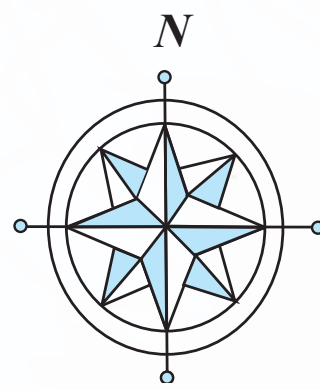

# WEST POINT PROJECT HUNTING MAP

Revised 2012



## LEGEND

- Shotgun, primitive weapons and rimfire rifles
- Bows, primitive weapons and shotguns with size 4 lead shot or smaller. (Steel shot for waterfowl hunting size T shot or smaller).
- Bows only-shotguns permitted after the deer season with size 4 lead shot or smaller. (Steel shot for waterfowl hunting size T shot or smaller).
- Bows only-no firearms allowed.

## REGULATIONS

1. Federal and State regulations and seasons apply in addition to regulations stated herein.
2. A hunting permit must be obtained from the Project Management Office for hunting on land or waters of West Point Project. **Cost of the permit is \$20.00.**
3. Hunting is allowed only in those areas specified on the West Point Lake Hunting Map. No hunting is allowed in developed recreation areas, unless otherwise noted on the hunting map.
4. Centerfire rifles and pistols are not allowed for hunting in any areas of West Point Lake. Rimfire weapons may be used for small game hunting above the 635' MSL contour (treeline along the shore) only in the areas indicated on the West Point Lake hunting map.
5. Permission to cross private property to reach public land can only be granted by the property owner. The U.S. Government property line is marked with red paint on trees.
6. No vehicles are allowed off authorized roadways or behind closed gates/barricades. Use of all terrain vehicles is prohibited.
7. Discharging a firearm within 50 yards of a roadway that is open to vehicle traffic is prohibited.
8. Use of centerfire rifles and buckshot for deer hunting is prohibited.
9. Dog hunting for small game is authorized. Federal and State regulations apply.
10. Permanent stands may not be built, and temporary stands must be removed when not in use.
11. Waterfowl hunting is permitted, except in areas adjacent to open recreation areas and West Point Dam. **NO** shooting permitted within 1000 feet of any other recreation activity, any buildings, boat docks, roads, bridges, or open recreation areas.
12. Temporary blinds for waterfowl hunting may be used but must be removed when not occupied by the hunter.
13. Please report any game killed on West Point Project to the Project Management Office by calling 706/645-2937 or by sending a completed copy of the West Point Project hunting data sheet to the **West Point Project Office, 500 Resource Management Drive, West Point, Georgia, 31833-9517.**
14. Hunting violations can be reported in Georgia by calling 1-800-241-4113 and in Alabama by calling 1-800-272-4263.

**Forfeiture of Hunting Privileges.** Any hunting or game violations will result in forfeiture of permit and privileges for a period of one year. Violators will also be subject to fines and/or imprisonment.
