***In the Matter of Preserving the Open Internet; Broadband Industry Practices and
Framework for Broadband Internet Service***

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Thursday, August 5, 2010, the undersigned (on behalf of EDUCAUSE and the American Library Association) held a brief conversation with Zach Katz to discuss the proposed classification of broadband Internet access services and “net neutrality.” I informed Mr. Katz that the first priority for libraries and higher education is to preserve the openness of the Internet for distance learning, e-government services, job training, research, and access to other educational and information services. The organizations support reclassification of broadband access to the Internet, or legislation, as two ways to ensure the enforceability of measures to limit discrimination and paid prioritization over the Internet. In contrast, the issues surrounding the treatment of specialized or managed services are less significant than the need to protect the openness of the Internet. On behalf of EDUCAUSE and ALA, I expressed the desire to work with the Commission to obtain an agreement on an enforceable set of measures to protect the openness of the Internet.
