Note:

The Supreme Court has declared one (1) and two (2) House legislative vetos unconstitutional because they violate the 'presentment' clause of the Constitution (Article I, Section 7) and the separation of powers doctrine. We have continued to note reporting requirements with legislative veto provisions until the Court determines the question of 'severability'.
