Please join Dallas Mayor Mike Rawlings; Senator Royce West; Dallas Police Chief David Brown; a panel of experts from Texas organizations that focus on preventing teen sexual assault and violence prevention including the Texas Association Against Sexual Assault (TAASA) and the National Teen Dating Abuse Hotline; students; government officials; educators; and other community leaders for a Town Hall discussion on how we can work together to get young men engaged in stopping violence against women.

This Regional Town Hall is one of ten being held across the country the last week in October as a part of Vice President Biden's initiative to raise awareness about dating violence and sexual assault, with a focus on involving and educating high school and college men on the issue.

The Vice President's Regional Town Hall will include a panel discussion, open forum and time for networking among participants after the formal program. The Town Hall is free and open to all interested parties, and refreshments will be served. We encourage students to come and participate.
