## **Highlights:**

- In the State of Louisiana, as of approximately 7:00 AM EDT September 11, there are 81,523 customers reported without power. This represents a decrease of 54.374 customers without power from Situation Report #14 when 135,897 customer outages were reported.
- On September 10, the Waterford nuclear plant has returned to service and was reconnected to the Entergy electric system. The River Bend nuclear plant is still shut down but according to Entergy once the damaged exterior siding is repaired, River Bend will be given the go-ahead to begin the regulatory checks and inspections needed for a gradual startup.
- As of 3:00 PM September 10, the U.S. Coast Guard reports a safety zone is in effect throughout
  the Houston-Galveston Captain of the Port zone which includes the ports of Houston,
  Galveston, Freeport and Texas City. Vessel operations in those areas may be directed by Coast
  Guard representatives in order to keep the port safe and secure. The Coast Guard expects that
  suspension of all inbound traffic for all Texas ports will occur by early this afternoon in
  preparation for Hurricane Ike.

- As of 12:30 PM EDT, September 10, the Minerals Management Service (MMS) reports 5,405 million cubic feet per day (MMcf/d) of the Gulf's natural gas production remains shut-in, equivalent to 73.0 percent of the Gulf production. This is an increase of 610 MMcf/d from what was reported September 9. MMS reports 1,246,595 barrels/day of the Gulf's crude production remains shut-in, equivalent to 95.9 percent of the Gulf's crude production. This is an increase of 239,206 barrels/day from what was reported September 9. A total of 452 production platforms, or 63.0 percent of the Gulf's 717 manned platforms, have been evacuated. Personnel from 81 rigs, representing 66.9 percent of those operating in the region, have been removed.
- According to press reports, as of 12:00 PM EDT September 11, there are eight refineries, with a total combined capacity of 2.452 million barrels/day, which are shutting down in anticipation of Hurricane Ike. There remains one refinery shut down as a result of Hurricane Gustav, the ConocoPhillips refinery in Belle Chasse, LA.
- As of 11:00 AM EDT September 11, the Strategic Petroleum Reserve (SPR) sites at Bryan Mound, TX, Big Hill, TX, and West Hackberry, LA have been shut down. The Bayou Choctaw SPR site is operational.
- The LOOP announced that it has suspended marine operations for incoming vessels as of yesterday afternoon.
- As of 9:00 AM EDT September 11, there are multiple offshore natural gas pipelines that continue to experience gas flow reductions or complete shut-in of their systems due to Gustav. As Hurricane Ike approaches the Gulf of Mexico, many natural gas producers, pipeline and processing plant operators are taking advanced precaution to shut-in and shut down operations.
- As of 11:15 AM EDT September 11, seven processing plants have shut down in advance of Hurricane Ike. These seven processing plants have a total operating capacity of 2.290 billion



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cubic feet per day. Six of the plants are located in Cameron, LA and one is located in Matagorda, TX. There are no processing plant status changes from yesterday's report as a result of Gustav

### **Restoration Updates:**

• As of 6:00 AM EDT September 11, Entergy has restored power to more than 890,000 customers in Louisiana, Mississippi, and Arkansas who lost power due to Hurricane Gustav. See table below on restoration progress in Louisiana.

Postaration Progress in Louisiana as of Santambar 10, 2008 7:00 AM FDT\*

- Entergy reports as of 6:30 AM EDT September 11, remaining damage to the transmission system includes 27 lines and 15 substations, down from a peak of 241 transmission lines and 352 substations immediately following the storm.
- Entergy has restored power to Jefferson (except for Grand Isle), St. Helena, St. Landry and St. Tammany Parishes.
- Entergy is monitoring the track of Hurricane Ike and the potential impact Ike could have on its system which is not fully recovered from Gustav.
