# **HIGHLIGHTS**

- This is the last Hurricane Katrina report. Information on outages and damages from Katrina will be included in the Gulf Coast Hurricane Situation Report starting on 9/24/05.
- Currently, 246,884 customers remain without electric power in Louisiana and Mississippi due to Hurricane Katrina. This is down by more than 2.4 million from a peak of 2.7 million customers that were without power after Hurricane Katrina struck the region.
- DOE staff have been at the National Response Coordination Center (NRCC) at FEMA HQ, the Interagency Incident Management Team at HQ and the State Emergency Operation Center (EOC) in Louisiana for several weeks. Three staff are in Austin, TX, in preparation for Hurricane Rita. Another is at NORTHCOM, per its request.

# PETROLEUM AND GAS INFORMATION

MMS reports today that as a result of damage from Hurricane Katrina and precautionary actions in advance of Hurricane Rita, shut-in oil production in the Gulf is currently at 1,486,877 barrels of oil per day. The shut-in oil production is equivalent to 99.13 percent of the normal daily oil production in the Gulf, which is currently approximately 1.5 million barrels of oil per day. Shut-in gas production is at 7.204 billion cubic feet per day. This shut-in gas production is equivalent to 72.04 percent of the normal daily gas production in the Gulf, which is currently approximately 10 billion cubic feet per day. These evacuations are equivalent to 77.41% of 819 manned platforms and 67.16 % of 134 rigs currently operating in the Gulf.

### • Gulf of Mexico (GOM) Shut-in Oil and Gas 8/30/05 – 9/22/05

On 9/21 Entergy reported progress of gas restoration by area: Algiers (100%), French Quarter (10%), CBD (98%), Central City (50%), Uptown (50%), Downtown (15%), Broadmoor (20%), Carrollton (3%), Mid City (15%), Gentilly (45%), Lakeshore (100%), Lake Vista (40%), Lakeview (50%), New Orleans East (0%), and 9<sup>th</sup> Ward (0%). A total of 53,646 gas customers (37%) have been restored.

• Four refineries (three in LA and one in MS) remain shut down as a result of damage from Hurricane Katrina.
